

SCOTT D. JOINER APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE VETERANS' AFFAIRS COMMISSION

I. Qualifications

I am a native San Franciscan and attorney who left private practice in 2004 to serve on active duty in the United States Marine Corps. Throughout my service in the Marine Corps, I spent a considerable amount of time advising individual service members on a wide variety of civil and criminal legal matters. After successfully completing Officer Candidates School ("OCS") and six months of infantry platoon commander's training at the Marine Corps Basic School, I was assigned to a litigation billet as a judge advocate in Twentynine Palms, California. Between 2005 and the spring of 2007, I handled a wide variety of criminal cases including narcotics (both use and distribution) and sexual misconduct offenses.

I also gained valuable experience working in non-traditional legal roles in the high-pressure and often ambiguous environment of combat operations. In 2007 I was assigned to an infantry battalion and deployed to Ramadi, Iraq. In Ramadi, the criminal courts had previously ground to a halt amid widespread lawlessness and violence against police officers and judges. In support of the battalion's counterinsurgency operations, I worked with Iraqi Police investigators and judges to build their cases and help reestablish a functioning criminal justice system in the city. At the same time, I prepared cases with our own intelligence assets for eventual prosecution at the Central Criminal Court of Iraq ("CCCI") in Baghdad. By the time our battalion returned home, the first criminal trials in Ramadi were just beginning again, and we left behind a strong reputation for successfully prosecuting members of Al Qaeda and related groups at CCCI. After returning from deployment, I was honorably discharged in February 2008 and returned to private practice with Cooley LLP in March 2008.

I believe this experience, combined with my professional background and long-standing ties to San Francisco, have provided me with the qualifications necessary to be of service to the Veterans' Affairs Commission.



Dr. Koppel has given a presentation today to a group of homeless and marginally housed veterans who come for treatment at the San Francisco V.A's 13th and Mission Clinic which serves a large number of homeless and addicted as well as dual diagnosis veterans. His presentation was part of the "Food for Your Brain" lecture series which is designed to present veterans in all stages of recovery from drug abuse and mental disorders with information and tools that will serve them in life and help them to be more informed and better their lives. Topics covered include medical information on drug abuse and infectious disease, legal and financial topics, alternative medicine, stress reduction and spiritual/inspirational topics.

I invited Mr Koppel to be a speaker as he came highly recommended by a clinician who's opinion I trust. He was a very effective speaker and kept the attention of a large room of veterans. "I have only been doing, these nine years, that which I enjoy most," said Sanchelli. Status Report on Service-Learning and Academic Classes

The following material is submitted for consideration for your study on the Broader Community within USF. Over the last four semesters my BA304 (Management and Organizational Dynamics) has been involved in service-learning projects. There have been over 18 teams in the first three semesters and there will be eight teams this semester who have all been in contact with community service organizations. The student's work has been to provide service to the community based upon the educational goals of my specific course, their interest and capabilities, and the needs and wants for service by the community partner. A listing of the community service organizations that were assisted last semester, the Fall of 1996 are as follows:

The number active in this involvement has been over 200 students during these four semesters and this indicates an involvement with the faculty and the students in conjunction with the broader community for USF. This activity seems to relate to point two of the Building A Bold Tomorrow, the vision for the Committee 2005 that relates to sponsor formal association between the University and organizations addressing the need for the community.

The students are involved in providing work and service to these community agencies related to their Management course. Further, work that the students do is an analysis of the organization's

ability to lead, to communicate, to motivate, to plan and control. Thus, the work with the service organization relates directly to the course objectives. The response from the community service partners has been overwhelming. They feel that the students have an opportunity to apply principles and theory learned in the classroom to actually helping the common good within the community and to meeting the human condition needs of these organizations. The benefits for the students is that they are able to apply theory and models of information from the textbook to realistic situations. They also have a surprising and pleasing response to becoming involved in the community and in learning a greater experience about the human condition.

We have just discussed where we are in the present situation of a classroom involving itself in the broader community. Next we want to look at where we want to be. We, as the instructor and students of the class, would very much like to continue in this effort. For additional support the best effort that the University can do is to continue to supply resources through the community service-learning coordinator on the campus. There has recently been a personnel change in that position and I look forward to continued support from that office. Further, additional support could be provided by providing support to attend conferences such as the California Campus Compact. Last July, Dr. Susan Prion and the University of San Francisco hosted this particular conference. Resources, information, materials, booklets related to service-learning, as well as attendance at future conferences for the University faculty and administration would strongly be encouraged. This support would allow us to enhance the beginning of work and effort within this very significant area. The coordinator for service-learning supplies very valuable services such as making initial contact with community organizations and determining a contact person and facilitates the students being able to work with these organizations. Thus, I am recommending to your committee that continued support for service-learning within USF be continued and additional support for faculty development travel as well as educational material be furnished. This will allow faculty members to continue in this very dynamic educational process, that in fact serves the broader community for the University of San Francisco. Any further questions or comments that you may have would be most welcome. I look forward to continuing to be involved in the broader community and to developing a very effective ethical educational pedagogy with this particular practice. Your support of this would be greatly appreciated.



Administrative Code, Section 5.100 et seq. (Added by Ord. 449-82, amended by Ordinance Nos. 33-94, 224-94, 97-97, and 245-09).

Board Qualifications:

The Veterans Affairs Commission consists of a total of seventeen (17) members, twelve (12) of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and five (5) of whom are appointed by the Mayor as follows:

- At least three (3) must be women veterans (at least two (2) members shall be appointed by the Board);
- Two (2) members who served in the Armed Forces of the United States and who have a physical disability arising from that service (the Mayor and Board of Supervisors shall each appoint at least one (1) member), in accordance with the definitions applied in such cases by the Veterans' Administration; and
- All members shall reside in the City and County of San Francisco. The Board of Supervisors may only waive this requirement by Ordinance.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be four (4) years; provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that three (3) members shall serve a one-year term, four (4) members shall serve a two-year term, four (4) members shall serve a three-year term and four (4) members shall serve a four-year term. On the expiration of these and all successive terms, their successors shall be appointed for a four-year term in a manner similar to that described for the initial members. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired portion of the term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that described for the initial members.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Commission shall directly advise the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors on all matters affecting veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States of America, on the problems, interests and needs of veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco and on the coordination of economic development, health care, and social services programs as they relate to veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco.

The Commission shall have the power and duty to:

- Hold hearings and submit recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor regarding the problems, interests, and needs of veterans; and
- Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor concerning the coordination of economic development health care and social services programs as they relate to veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco.

Reports: The Commission shall render an annual written report of its activities to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor.
