3 **Resolution approving the FY2015-2016 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**  
4 **Program; authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to**  
5 **apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2015-2016 CDBG Program entitlement from the**  
6 **U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$16,489,944 and to**  
7 **expend program income and reprogrammed funds in the amount of \$3,115,947 for a**  
8 **combined total amount of \$19,605,891 over the period beginning July 1, 2015, through the**  
9 **date when all funds are expended.**

10  
11 WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as  
12 amended, and related Federal Regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to  
13 apply for and receive a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and

14 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately  
15 \$16,489,944 in FY2015-2016 CDBG Program funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and  
16 Urban Development (HUD), and has approximately \$2,462,600 in anticipated Program Income  
17 and \$653,347 from previous CDBG grants and program income from prior years, for a combined  
18 total of approximately \$19,605,891; and

19 WHEREAS, The Citizen's Committee on Community Development (CCCD) has prepared  
20 recommendations for FY2015-2016 CDBG funding as set forth in a proposed Expenditure  
21 Schedule, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.  
22 150366; and

23 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance  
24 amendment; and

25 WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs; and

1           WHEREAS, An Environmental Review Record has been prepared by the Mayor's Office  
2 of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and approved by the Certifying Officer for  
3 the proposed projects and activities set forth in the Expenditure Schedule with the National  
4 Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable statutes and authorities, in particular  
5 those cited in 24 CFR Part 58, Sections 5 and 6, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the  
6 Board of Supervisors in File No. 150336; and

7           WHEREAS, The Certifying Officer shall follow the provisions of NEPA to confirm and  
8 ensure that all projects funded under the CDBG Program are in compliance with applicable  
9 federal regulations and requirements; now, therefore, be it

10           RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby  
11 authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's 2014 CDBG Program funds from HUD  
12 and expend an estimated \$2,462,600 in Program Income and Reprogrammed funds, all in  
13 accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding as generally set forth in 2015-2019 Five  
14 Year Consolidated Plan and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

15           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the  
16 purposes and goals for FY2015-2016 CDBG Program funding as set forth in the Expenditure  
17 Schedule for recipient agencies and departments; and, be it

18           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of  
19 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

20           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute  
21 agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and various agencies consistent  
22 with FY2015-2016 CDBG Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

23           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit documentation  
24 and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such additional  
25

1 actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the FY2015-2016 CDBG funds  
2 consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the FY2015-2016 CDBG Program and all  
3 applicable legal requirements; and, be it


