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WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$7,461,390 in 2015 HOPWA Program funds from HUD, and estimates approximately \$100,772 in Program Income from previous HOPWA grants for a combined total of approximately \$7,562,162; and,


