








Homeless & Safety Net Services

20% Homeless Set-Aside

- Currently there are 2,102 housing units in MOHCD's portfolio set-aside for formerly homeless individuals or families.
- 599 additional units for homeless families are in MOHCD's pipeline
- · 20% of all housing units in family developments funded by MOHCD are reserved for homeless families referred by **HSA's Access Points**
