13	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Article XXII,				
14	consisting of Sections 5.22-1 through 5.22-5, to read as follows:				
15	ARTICLE XXII: EMERGENCY INTERAGENCY FIRE SAFETY TASK FORCE.				
16	SEC. 5.22-1. CREATION OF TASK FORCE.				
17	The Board of Supervisors hereby establishes an Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force				
18	("Task Force") for the City and County of San Francisco ("City").				
19	SEC. 5.22.2. PURPOSE.				
20	Because San Francisco has recently had several fires in multi-unit residential and multi-use				
21	buildings that resulted in death and displacement of tenants, and multiple City agencies have				
22	enforcement authority over the habitability of multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings and the				
23	health and safety of the occupants of these buildings, immediate measures must be taken to improve the				
24	fire safety of these buildings.				
25	The Task Force shall specifically:				

- (a) review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on legislation proposed by the Board to improve fire safety in multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings;
- (b) suggest to the Board of Supervisors amendments to the Municipal Code or other solutions that would improve fire safety in multi-residential and multi-use buildings, including but not limited to fire prevention measures, post-fire investigation, processing and resolution of complaints about Code violations, and interagency coordination and information sharing; and
- (c) make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on the advisability of requiring the installation of fire alarms and sprinklers in existing buildings.

SEC. 5.22-3. MEMBERSHIP.

The Task Force shall consist of the following seven members:

- (a) two representatives from the Department of Building Inspection, one of whom shall be from the Housing Division;
- (b) two representatives from the Fire Department, one of whom shall be the Fire Marshal or Fire Marshal's designee;
 - (c) two representatives from the Department of Public Health; and
 - (d) one representative from the Public Utilities Commission.
- The City Attorney shall assign a representative to attend the meetings and advise the Task Force.
- SEC. 5.22-4. MEETINGS AND OPERATIONS OF TASK FORCE; REPORT TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.
- (a) Members shall be appointed to the Task Force by their respective departments no later than the effective date of this Article XXII and the Task Force shall begin meeting as soon as possible after its formation. The Task Force members shall meet at least once every two weeks for three months. Four members shall constitute a quorum for purposes of meeting. An official action may be taken by the vote of a majority of the members at a meeting.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Establishing Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish an Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force to review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on proposed legislation and suggest other solutions to improve fire safety in multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings.

Existing Law

The Administrative Code establishes a number of task forces and advisory committees.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance establishes a new Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force. The Task Force will have seven voting members: two from the Department of Building Inspection, two from the Fire Department, two from the Department of Public Health, and one from the Public Utilities Commission. The City Attorney will assign a representative to attend the meetings and advise the Task Force. The purpose of the Task Force is to (1) review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on legislation proposed by the Board to improve fire safety in multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings, (2) suggest to the Board of Supervisors amendments to the Municipal Code or other solutions that would improve fire safety in these buildings, and (3) specifically make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on the advisability of requiring the installation of fire alarms and sprinklers in existing buildings.

Background Information

San Francisco has recently had several fires in multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings that resulted in the death and displacement of tenants, and multiple City agencies have enforcement authority over the habitability of these buildings and the health and safety of their occupants. Therefore, immediate measures must be taken to improve the fire safety of these buildings.


Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2.21 establishes certain criteria that must be included in legislation creating, establishing, or reauthorizing new bodies (boards/commissions/task forces/advisory bodies) and requires the Clerk of the Board to advise the Board on certain matters. In order to fulfill these requirements, the following is provided:

File No. 150431 Administrative Code - Establishing Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force

The proposed legislation establishes the Emergency Interagency Fire Safety Task Force (Task Force) to review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on legislation to improve fire safety in multi-unit residential and multi-use buildings, and the advisability of requiring the installation of fire alarms and sprinklers in existing buildings.

- Does a current body address the same or similar subject matter?
 - No, there is no current body that addresses the same subject matter.
- Language requiring the body to meet at least once every four months

Section 5.22-4 states that the "Task Force members shall meet at least once every two weeks for three months."



Language indicating members serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority

The membership of the Task Force consists of various City department staff representatives that are assigned by their respective departments. Since they are City staff they are assumed to serve by virtue of their office.

Language establishing attendance requirements

City department staff members are assigned to represent their respective departments as part of their office duties. There are no public members where attendance requirements should be established to remove them from their seat due to non-attendance.

Number of seats and qualifications

The Task Force shall consist of seven members:

- ✓ Two (2) representatives from the Department of Building Inspection
 - o One (1) of whom shall be from the Housing Division
- ✓ Two (2) representatives from the Fire Department
 - o One (1) of whom shall be the Fire Marshal or his/her designee
- \checkmark Two (2) representatives from the Department of Public Health
- ✓ One (1) representative from the Public Utilities Commission
- Term limits (i.e., commencement date? staggered terms?)

All members are City department staff and area assumed to serve by virtue of their office.

Administering department

The Department of Building Inspection will provide clerical and administrative support and staffing to the Task Force.

Reporting requirements

Three months after the effective date of the Ordinance, the Task Force shall submit a report to the Board of Supervisors on all matters within its purview.

Sunset date

The Task Force shall expire by operation of law, six months after the effective date of the Ordinance.
