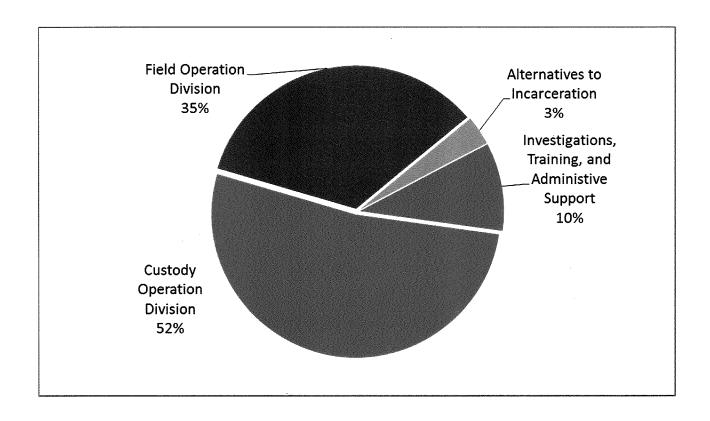

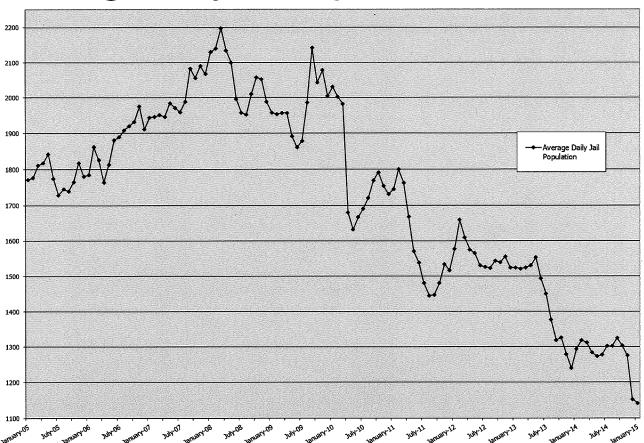
Sheriff's Department Functions Actual Staff







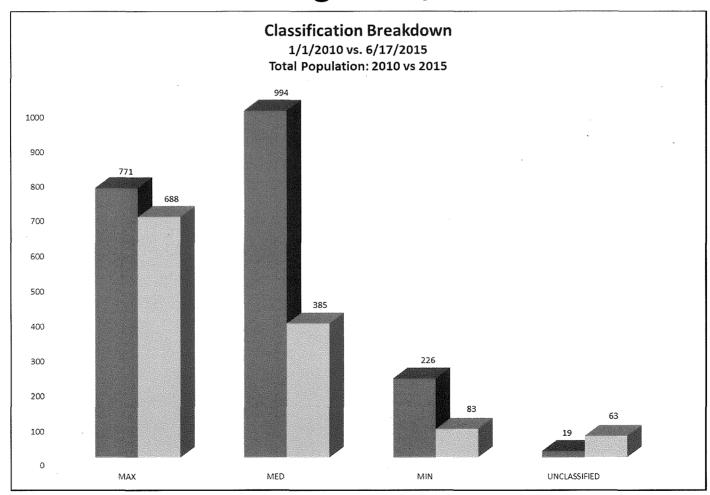
Average Daily Jail Population is Declining







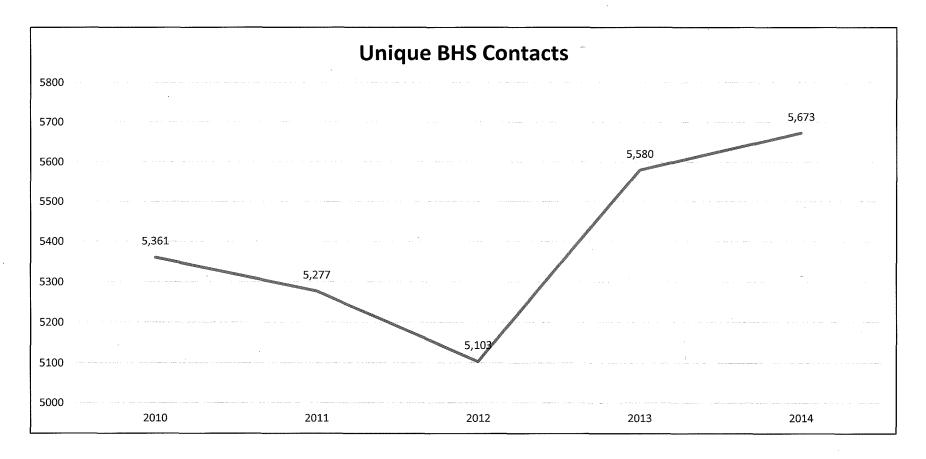
More Inmates are High Risk, Relative to Total







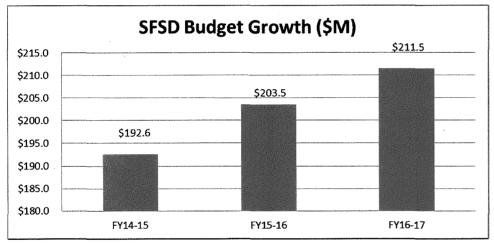
More Inmates have Mental Health Disorders, Relative to Total Population

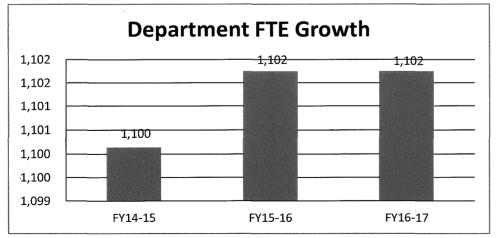

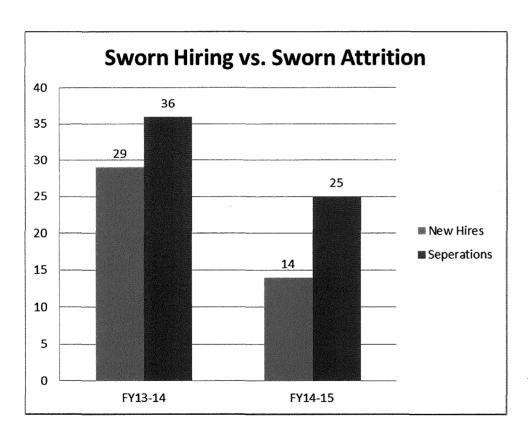

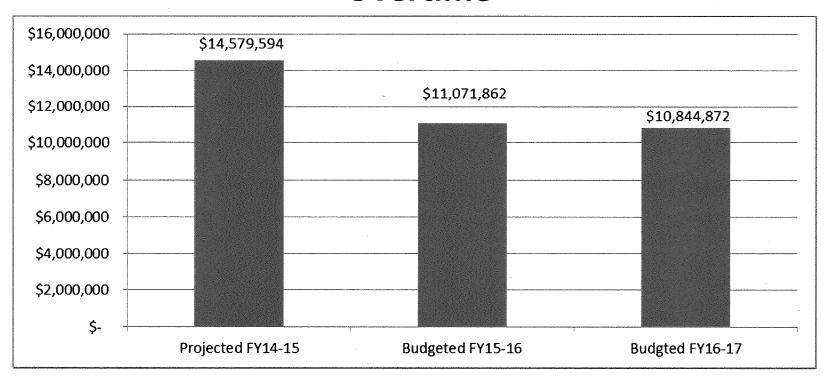
