1	[Suspending Budget Stabilization Reserve Requirements - FY2015-2016]
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3	Resolution suspending requirements for the Budget Stabilization Reserve in
4	Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c), for FY2015-2016 for the purpose of using the
5	funds to acquire property for future affordable housing developments.
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7	WHEREAS, Charter, Section 9.120, authorizes the adoption of financial policies that
8	will be binding upon the Mayor and Board of Supervisors in their adoption of City budget; and
9	WHEREAS, Acting pursuant to Charter, Section 9.120, the Board of Supervisors
10	adopted Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c), which created a Budget Stabilization Reserve
11	into which the Controller must make deposits under specified conditions; and
12	WHEREAS, Charter, Section 9.120, requires that all City budgets be consistent with
13	the financial policies adopted pursuant to Charter, Section 9.120, and set forth in
14	Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c); and
15	WHEREAS, The Controller projects that he will be required to make deposits to the
16	Budget Stabilization Reserve for the upcoming budget period that encompasses
17	FYs 2015-2016 and 2016-2017; and
18	WHEREAS, Deposits to the Budget Stabilization Reserve include 75% of "Real
19	Property Transfer Tax proceeds in excess of the average annual actual receipts level for the
20	prior five fiscal years;" and
21	WHEREAS, The Controller's "FY2014-2015 Nine-Month Budget Status Report" states
22	that "a significant driver of property transfer tax is the escalation of value seen in San
23	Francisco real estate;" and
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1	WHEREAS, The dramatic escalation of real estate values has caused an
2	unprecedented housing crisis in the City and County of San Francisco where low-income and
3	moderate-income households are being displaced and struggling to stay in the City; and
4	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c), authorizes the Board of
5	Supervisors, by a resolution approved by a two-thirds' vote, to suspend the provisions of the
6	Budget Stabilization Reserve for the current or upcoming budget year; and
7	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c), further states that "following such a
8	suspension, the City may appropriate funds from the Budget Stabilization Reserve for non-
9	recurring expenditures, for infrastructure expenditures, for development of affordable housing,
10	for prepayment of future debts or liabilities, for annual operating costs, or for any other lawful
11	governmental purpose;" now, therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds the current housing crisis poses a
13	current and immediate threat to the economic and cultural diversity of the City; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That in light of the housing crisis, the Board of Supervisors
15	finds that using funds from the Budget Stabilization Reserve for the one-time purpose of
16	acquiring property for affordable housing is a prudent use of those funds; and, be it
17	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby suspends the
18	requirements for the Budget Stabilization Reserve in Administrative Code, Section 10.60(c),
19	for the upcoming FY2015-2016, for the intended purpose of using the funds to acquire
20	property that shall be dedicated for future affordable housing developments; and, be it
21	FURTHER RESOLVED, That suspension of the requirements for the Budget
22	Stabilization Reserve for FY2015-2016 and for subsequent fiscal years will require approval
23	by a two-thirds' vote of the Board of Supervisors in connection with its approval of the budget
24	for FY2015-2016 and for subsequent fiscal years, and that expenditure of the funds will be

subject to subsequent appropriation.

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
