- 1. Sales of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m., Sunday thru Wednesday and 8:00am thru Midnight, Thursday thru Saturday with exception of New Year's Eve, Christmas Eve, Thanksgiving Eve, The Fourth of July and the Sunday before Labor Day and Memorial Day the hours being 8:00am until 2:00am.
- 2. The sale of alcoholic beverages for off-sale consumption is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Loitering (loitering as defined a {"to stand idly about; linger aimlessly without lawful business"} is prohibited on any sidewalks or property adjacent to the licensed premises under the control of the license.
- 4. The petitioner(s) shall be responsible for maintaining free of litter the area adjacent to the premises over which they have control.
- 5. The exterior of the premises shall be equipped with lighting of sufficient power to illuminate and make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons on or about the premises. Additionally, the position of such lighting shall not disturb the normal privacy and use of any neighboring residences.
- 6. No noise shall be audible beyond the area under the control of the licensee as defined on the ABC-257




