This firm represents Solano County Orderly Growth Committee ("SCOGC") in its appeal of the adoption of a Negative Declaration for the Recology Hay Road Landfill Project (the "Project"). We are in receipt of the Planning Department's July 17, 2015 memorandum which states the Department of the Environment ("DOE") is in the process of revising its proposed agreement with Recology so that it purportedly no longer requires approval from the Board of Supervisors. The Department further advised that the approval by DOE of this revised agreement for the Project, which is expected on or about July 22, 2015, would be the Approval Action for purposes of a new appeal and appeal period, and that an appellate hearing will be scheduled in accordance following this future Approval Action and a new appeal.

In reliance on this representation, we will be not be submitting any further documents in support of our current appeal at this time. SCOGC objects to the mooted of the current appeal, and affirms for the record that it stands ready to appear on this appeal at a future date as the clerk may advise. As necessary, SCOGC would file, appear and present evidence on a new appeal.

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Moreover, SCOGC objects to any attempt by the DOE to "revise" the published contract in an attempt to avoid Board of Supervisors and public review. The contract and the flawed negative declaration raises significant issues of public concern and should be subject to full public scrutiny.
