12 13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
14	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 10.100-
15	100, to read as follows:
16	SEC. 10.100-100. THE SAN FRANCISCO DISASTER AND EMERGENCY
17	<u>RESPONSE AND</u> RECOVERY FUND.
18	(a) Establishment of Fund. The San Francisco Disaster and Emergency Response and
19	Recovery Fund is established as a <u>response and recovery measure to ensure San Francisco's</u>
20	ability to quickly respond to and recover from disaster and emergency events that impact the City and
21	County of San Francisco, its residents, and its businesses. The San Francisco Disaster and Emergence
22	Response and Recovery Fund is a category four eight fund, authorized to receive all private
23	donations, grants, gifts, and bequests of money and property which may be offered to the Cit
24	and County of San Francisco to assist in funding the City's response and recovery efforts during
25	and after an a disaster or emergency.

1	(b) Use of Fund. Donors may designate the following categories of use for their funds:
2	(1) Public Infrastructure Repair and Replacement: The fund is to be used for projects
3	to replace, repair, and rebuild $\underline{\it public}$ buildings, infrastructure, and other assets owned by the
4	City and County that were damaged in an or rendered unusable as a result of a disaster or
5	emergency.
6	(2) Disaster/Emergency Housing and/or Relief: to provide shelter, food and other
7	assistance to individuals and families in San Francisco who are impacted by a disaster or emergency
8	event that affected San Francisco.
9	(3) Disaster/Emergency Animal Care Relief: to provide shelter, food and other
10	assistance to animals and pets in San Francisco that are displaced or otherwise impacted by a disaster
11	or emergency event that affected San Francisco.
12	(4) If the donor has not specified an intended category of use for the donation, the
13	money or assets may be used for any of the purposes identified above at the discretion of the City
14	Administrator, in consultation with the Controller and the Department of Emergency Management.
15	No costs which may be incurred by any City and County department in administering
16	this fund or disbursements from this fund shall be recovered therefrom, except for electronic
17	transactional or processing fees.
18	(c) The City Administrator's Office will be the administering department for this fund. is
19	responsible for determining the allocation of this fund to the appropriate City agency or agencies in
20	consultation with the Controller, the Department of Emergency Management, and the Office of the
21	Mayor, provided that such allocation is consistent with the designated category of use as provided
22	under subsection (b) above.
23	(d) By July 15 of each year, the City Administrator's Office and the Controller's Office shall
24	complete an annual report regarding Disaster and Emergency Response and Recovery Fund sources
25	and uses. The annual report shall be a public record.

1	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
2	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
3	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
4	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
5	
6	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
7	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
8	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
9	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
10	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
11	the official title of the ordinance.
