Resolution authorizing Fire Department to donate an obsolete ambulance to the San Francisco Unified School District's Health Academy at Galileo High School.

[Donation of Obsolete Ambulance to San Francisco Unified School District]

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Unified School District's (SFUSD's) Health Academy at Galileo High School is a program that assists high school students in not only their high school level health science classes but also enrollment in City College of San Francisco Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) courses; and

WHEREAS, A large part of Emergency Medical Services training is concerned with manipulative skills, and the best way to learn those skills is to practice on genuine equipment; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Services equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department has recently taken receipt of nineteen new ambulances, allowing the Department to replace a number of old ambulances that were no longer of operational use to the Department; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department wishes to donate a retired vehicle for educational training purposes; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle 145-734, a Ford Ambulance, has been retired from service even as a relief piece; and

WHEREAS, Ambulance 145-734 would serve as a teaching tool for patient assessment, loading and treatment and Galileo High School would benefit from an actual ambulance on which to train its students; and

WHEREAS, On March 26, 2015, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution No. 2015-02, Recommending that the Board of Supervisors Approve the Donation of an Obsolete Ambulance to the San Francisco Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Code, Chapter 21, allows for commodities that have been declared as surplus to be disposed of in a manner that will best serve the interests of the City and will maximize the City's economic return on the surplus commodities by donating to public entities, non-profit organizations and schools; and

WHEREAS, Among the first criteria on the priority list for donation of surplus commodities are schools that are physically located in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Galileo High School is an institution of learning (school) and is physically located in San Francisco, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Fire Department is authorized to donate

Ambulance 145-734 to the San Francisco Unified School District's Health Academy at Galileo High School.
