Free Muni Program Overview

- Programs provide free Muni access to low and moderate income youth
 - Seniors and People with Disabilities added March 1, 2015
- One time pass loaded to existing or registered Clipper card
- Pass does not expire each month renewal not required
- Available to San Francisco residents only
- Income must be below the following limits (100% Bay Area Median Income):

Annual Income	\$71,350	\$ 81,500	\$ 91,700	\$ 101,900	\$ 110,050	\$ 118,200

Application Process

Existing Clipper Card Holders

- Complete application online or by mail
- Active Youth Clipper card number required
- Pass will be remotely activated on card within three weeks
- Customer will be notified via mail when pass is ready for use

Current Cash Fare Customers/Non Clipper Card Holders

- Obtain application online or in-person at SFMTA Customer Service Center (11 South Van Ness Avenue)
- Submit application with copy of proof of age attached by mail or in-person to SFMTA Customer Service Center, Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm
- School administrators assist with applicants who do not have form of ID and contact SFMTA staff directly
- A new Youth Clipper will be sent in the mail with the Free Muni pass activated
 allow up to four weeks for processing



SFMTA provides free transportation to students from low- and moderate-income households


- Over 30,000 students currently enrolled
