



Dear Supervisors Cohen, Kim and Wiener:

The San Francisco Chamber of Commerce, representing over 1,500 local businesses, has weighed in via letter and public testimony, on the proposed Transportation Sustainability Fee (TSF) legislation (File #150790) asking you to support the original language drafted by the SFMTA that went to the Planning Commission last month. We are writing again to urge you to support the legislation with most of the proposed amendments introduced at the Land Use Committee on September 28, 2015. However, we do not support removing non-profit hospitals from the charitable exemption and urge you to reconsider that amendment when the legislation comes before Land Use again on October 19, 2015.

Transportation Impact Development Fees do not apply to non-profit hospitals, nor should the TSF. As you know hospitals are undergoing costly state-mandated seismic retrofitting that has led to a cost of construction of between two and four million dollars *per bed*. Retrofitting often adds square footage to the footprint of hospitals without adding new patient or employee capacity. In addition, hospitals negotiate transportation impact fees directly with the City through individual Development Agreements. Adding the TSF to construction costs will impose financial burdens that may prevent hospitals from providing a full range of care while raising negligible revenue for transportation upgrades.

The details of the TSF legislation were crafted with the support of a broad coalition of transportation advocates that has worked for many years in partnership with city agencies to develop a number of transportation funding mechanisms, including the transportation bond, VLF legislation, self-help county sales tax, and other local and state programs. The unexpected proposed elimination of non-profit hospitals from the charitable exemption in the TSF is a divisive and polarizing breach of trust that puts this coalition and its steadfast support of transportation funding programs at risk.

The Chamber urges you to pass the TSF legislation out of Committee as amended, and to preserve the hospitals' charitable exemption.

In February of this year the Recreation and Parks Department Natural Areas Program (NAP) installed about 52 signs in the park lands they control. The signs say, "Stay On Designated Trails No Bicycles" making it illegal to ride bicycles in, or even walk them into, large areas of our parks. As I have examined the NAP policies more closely, I can see their intent is to curtail public access to large areas of our parks. It is not just about cyclists.

I also discovered many of the NAP's activities since 2002 have been undertaken in violation of Board of Supervisors Resolution 653-02 and Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code (CEQA).

Please see the attached documents. "BOS 653-02 violation" shows how the Natural Areas Program has been violating the resolution. "NAP Bike Ban" is specifically about the Natural Areas Program anti-cycling initiative.

Subject: The San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department is actively implementing elements of its Significant Natural Resource Areas Management Plan in violation of Board of Supervisors Resolution 653-02. Further, those activities are in violation of Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code for SF Planning case number 2005-0912E.

Around the year 2000, SFRPD began to draft its Significant Natural Resource Area Management Plan(SNRAMP). The prospect of SNRAMP implementation created a contentious public debate. The Natural Areas Program (NAP) stated objective is to protect remnant native plant and animal populations, expand them where they exist and reintroduce them in areas where they once existed. This is to take place in undeveloped areas of our parks. Public resistance to the plan stems from NAP's intention to remove a large number of trees to re-create scrub / grasslands, the ongoing use of pesticides to kill non-native plants, restrictions on access that would take parkland out of recreational use, the initial costs to remove the trees and existing ground cover and the perpetual costs of preventing the non-native plants from returning.

The SNRAMP debate was important enough to be taken on by the Board of Supervisors. In BOS Resolution 653-02 dated 9/24/2002, page 4 lines 3 to 11, the board ordered that:

FURTHER RESOLVED, That until the Natural Areas Management Plan is completed and approved by the Board of Supervisors, the Natural Areas Program may continue to preserve and maintain genuine remnants of San Francisco's native flora and fauna so long as those activities do not include:

Removal of healthy trees that pose no safety hazards Trail closures, or restrictions on access and recreation Trapping and removal of wild or feral animals currently inhabiting parks and lakes Expansion of activities into areas that no longer support predominantly native flora and fauna

The resolution also established a Natural Areas Program Citizens Advisory Committee, NAPCAC, to negotiate the SNRAMP issues. The committee was authorized for one year. It was not able to resolve the issues.

The "Final Draft" of the SNRAMP was completed in 2006. Because of the environmental impacts of the proposed management activities, an Environmental Impact Report was required. The draft of that document was released for public comment in 2011. The final version is still in process and may be released this year to the SF Planning Commission for review and certification. Presumably, SFRPD would then modify the SNRAMP in response to the EIR and present the final SNRAMP to the BOS for approval and ultimate release.

Despite the fact the EIR is not complete and the SNRAMP has not been approved by the BOS,

SFRPD has enabled its Natural Areas Program to go forward with the prohibited activities. The NAP has been closing trails, erecting fences and posting signs to restrict public access and limit recreation, expanding activities into areas that no longer support predominantly native flora and fauna and cutting healthy trees. A sample list of violations of the BOS resolution is presented at the end of this document. The point is not whether a particular prohibited action is good or bad. What is important is that all of these actions flout the Supervisor's resolution. What other project would the City allow to move forward before its EIR is even certified?

Of particular concern are new restrictions on public access and recreation imposed by the NAP. In February of this year RPD installed new "Park Hours" signs in all parks. The signs for NAP open spaces contain language that does not appear on the other RPD signs, "Stay on Designated Trails. No Bicycles". The first part is an admonishment intended to "channelize" park users, keep them from exploring off trail and deter them from using the social trail networks. The second part curtails recreation and denies access by an entire user group, cyclists, to large areas of our parks. Not only does the NAP prohibit cycling on their parklands, but they even prohibit bringing bicycles into those areas. That makes it impractical to cycle to parks with large areas controlled by the NAP like McLaren, Mt. Davidson, Glen Canyon and Bayview Hill.

I hope the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and the Recreation and Park Commission will take up this issue and require the RPD Natural Areas Program obey the rules that insure transparency and good governance for the people of San Francisco. The intentions of BOS 653-02 should be enforced until the EIR has been certified and the SNRAMP approved by the Board of Supervisors. In the meantime, SFRPD should host public meetings to identify specific violations and determine which should be cured immediately. As one of the most onerous and easiest to remedy, the "Stay on designated trails. No Bicycles." should be at the top of the list. As required by the resolution, healthy tree cutting, additional trail closures, new fence installation and creation of new native plant areas must be halted until the SNRAMP is approved by the Board.

After all the effort it took to hammer out the process for SNRAMP approval, the RPD Natural Areas Program should not be allowed to continue their end run around our system of governance. We all need to play by the rules.

SFRPD Natural Areas Program violations of BOS 653-02 and SF Admin. Code chapter 31

Citywide

• Signs have been placed in almost all parkland managed by the NAP that say, "Stay on Designated Trails. No Bicycles."

Glen Canyon Park

• Significant Natural Resource Area signs just above recreation center read, "Stay on trails."

• Trail closures including the Miraloma trail from Silver Tree to O'Shaughnessy, which cuts off access for the western neighborhoods.

• Extensive fencing intended to discourage public access at many locations in the park.

• Fenced native plant garden added in SNRAMP zone MA-3b that did not support predominantly native flora. The SNRAMP criteria for MA-3 areas includes the "absence (current or historic) of sensitive plants"

Mt. Davidson

• As part of the Mt. Davidson Seismic Tank upgrade by the SFPUC in 2008, the NAP required that the water pipeline from the Stanford Heights Reservoir to the tank on Mt. Davidson be relocated from its existing location among shrubs and grass to the forested area. This required clear cutting a swath of healthy trees up the face of the mountain.

• In about January 2014 the trail below the lower saddle viewing area on the east side of the park was blocked off with felled trees and limbs. More trees and limbs have been added since.

McLaren Park

• Multiple trails have been closed in the area south of Mansell and west of Visitacion.

• Fencing was installed at the Visitacion overlook parking area to discourage people from walking out onto the knoll above Visitacion Valley.

• The trail that runs along twin water tanks fence line was closed.

• Native plantings were extended into areas that did not support predominantly native flora and fauna under the McLaren Park Connector Trail Project. Fenced gardens were established at the Persia, Campbell and Visitacion entrances. The Persia and Campbell sites are classed MA-3, "absence (current or historic) of sensitive plants". The project plan for the Persia site indicates a large healthy tree at the south end of the project site is to remain. That tree has disappeared. The Visitacion site is classed MA-2, still not an area that "supports predominantly native flora". Ironically, a successful grant application for the project tells the funder that children need better access to the park so they can dig holes, climb trees and explore. The new RPD Park Hours signs say, no tree climbing, no digging and stay on designated trails. • Based on numbered stumps, one hundred trees were cut in the summer of 2014 in conjunction with the Visitacion trail restoration project. The 2012 HortScience McLaren Park Tree Risk Assessment report only identified 26 trees in the project area that should be removed.

Pine Lake

Many trees have been cut. Were they all unsafe or unhealthy?

• Fencing has been erected to limit public access.

Twin Peaks

• The NAP has active plans to close trails on Twin Peaks under the Figure 8 project. These trail closures, in conjunction with the "stay on designated trails" signage, will effectively close the two southern lobes of Twin Peaks to the public.

India Basin Shoreline Park

• The coastline of the SE parcel of the park at the foot of Arelious Walker Street has been made off limits to the public. Permanent fences were erected and signs posted that say "Wildlife Area No Access."

Bernal Hill


• The trail on the NE end of the park just east of Folsom St has been blocked. It is the easiest, most sustainable route up onto the hill along the entire north face.

• The NAP has active plans to close trails on under the Bernal Heights Park Trails Improvement Project.

Natural Areas Program Cycling Prohibition

The Situation

In February 2015 RPD installed new signs in our parks. There are two types, one for regular park areas and one for areas managed by the Natural Areas Program. The NAP signs flatly state, "Stay on Designated Trails. No Bicycles." The NAP signs appear on both paved and earthen trails. The signs for regular park areas make no mention of bicycles. Needless to say, San Franciscans who cycle are extremely unhappy about the signs that now prohibit bike riding on large portions of Twin Peaks, Mount Davidson, Bayview Hill, McLaren Park and even the road on the floor of Glen Canyon.



Letters were sent to RPD and to the Recreation and Park Commission noting cyclists objections and asking for an explanation. A formal response was returned by Phil Ginsberg on March 3, 2015. Critical assertions made in the email are:

- -Cycling is not allowed on NAP controlled lands except for two trails
- -In all other parklands, bikes are not allowed on earthen trails.
- "The signs posted in McLaren Park are correct and are consistent with long-standing regulations."

This is a dramatic change in policy. The only existing cycling prohibitions are on certain trails in Golden Gate Park marked by signs at their street entrances. SFRPD currently runs a children's mountain biking program, apparently in violation of their own "longstanding regulations". Over the past 5 years, NAP invited cyclists to volunteer thousands of hours to build trails in Golden Gate Park Oak Woodlands, Interior Greenbelt and McLaren Park. The NAP staff did not tell the cyclist volunteers it was illegal to ride bicycles on the trails they were building.

The SF Park Code contains no rules forbidding cyclists from riding on dirt trails in any of our parks. SECTION. 3.04. BRIDLE PATHS makes it clear that bicycles are expected to be on these earthen trails.

Sunshine Request 1

An information request submitted to SFRPD under the SF Sunshine Ordinance and a subsequent hearing at the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force Complaints Committee proved that there are no "long standing regulations" and in fact, no records whatsoever that support the assertion that bikes are not allowed on earthen trails. The SOTF file number is 15087. The Sunshine request, produced documents, and email exchanges are posted at:

Sunshine Request 2

A second sunshine request was lodged to find out what sorts of problems trail cyclists were causing, who decided to put "No Bicycles" on the signs and why. RPD was able to produce some emails from gardeners working the west end of Golden Gate Park complaining about rude cyclists riding off trail and a video shot by "outlaw" cyclists from a bike event in 2008 that shows riders skidding alongside a staircase in Glen Canyon. That is all.

RPD was not able to produce any documentation about the decision making process to exclude bicyclists from NAP managed land, other than a document titled "Offroad Mountain Biking on City Parkland Trails" which was written after the signs were installed. This document claims "The language for both signs was vetted through a review process inclusive of staff participation from Operations, Capital and Public Affairs; as well, as review of existing regulatory guiding documents (i.e. Park Code, SNRAMP, etc..)." This document is clearly a fabrication. The documents produced under the Sunshine request show that Operations, Capital and Public Affairs were unaware the NAP was putting the "No Bicycles" text on their signs. Obviously, the Park Code was not reviewed, or the bicycle references would have been discovered. The SNRAMP does not disclose any plan for the wholesale exclusion of bicycle riders. The paper erroneously claims riding bicycles on earthen trails is not considered a "hazardous recreational activity" under California Government Code 831.7.(a) and (b) and therefore a major liability concern for RPD.

The produced documents show the anti-cycling signage was a unilateral NAP initiative. This was undertaken without public input and without public warning. It was not based on a demonstrated need to prohibit cycling in the NAP areas.

Violation of BOS Resolution 653-02 and CEQA

Posting of the signs with language "Stay on Designated Trails. No Bicycles." by the Natural Areas Program violates BOS Resolution 653-02 which prohibits the NAP from imposing, "Trail closures, or restrictions on access and recreation" until the BOS has approved the natural areas management plan(SNRAMP). The BOS has not approved the management plan. The EIR for the SNRAMP has not even been released and certified by the Planning Commission.

Conclusion

The closure of NAP controlled park lands to cycling is illegal and must be reversed immediately.

Please be on notice that Barclays Capital Inc. ("Barclays") has entered into an agreement to sell its Wealth and Investment Management division to Stifel Financial Corporation. In conjunction with that sale, Barclays is permanently closing its Wealth and Investment Management division and anticipates separating employees who work at our San Francisco, California office (including employees who work at our 555 California Street location).

The employee separations at issue are permanent and are scheduled to begin on December 28, 2015 and be completed by the end of the calendar year. Some employees are entitled to a notice period ranging in length from 30 to 90 days, the latest of which is anticipated to be completed by March 10, 2016. For those who are entitled to a notice period, Barclays will pay employees their regular pay and benefits during such notice period regardless of whether they are required to report to work. Following this exercise, Barclays will continue to have some employees to assist in the wind-down of operations.

Attached is an anticipated schedule of these layoffs, broken down by job title and the number of affected employees in each job title. Barclays will retain additional information on site related to this exercise.

We delivered, by hand, written notice to affected employees beginning September 24, 2015. The employees do not have the right to displace or bump any other Barclays employee, and they will not be recalled to work. None of the employees are represented by a union to whom notice would be given.
