18	(a) The	California Career Pathways Trust Implementation Grant, administered by			
19	the California Department of Education, supports projects to establish K-14 pathways				
20	programs that provide students with a sequenced pathway of integrated academic and career				
21	based education and training, aligned to current of emerging regional economic needs.				
22	Career pathway programs are designed to lead students to a post-secondary degree or				
23	certification in a high-skill, high-wage, and high-growth field.				
24	(b) The	Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) along with City			
25	College of San Fr	ancisco (CCSF), San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD), and			

- 1 BayBio Institute applied for a California Career Pathways Trust Implementation Grant in
- 2 February 2015. In its application, it requested funding to strengthen pathways in Information
- 3 Communication Technology (ICT) and biotech by addressing specific needs in each area as
- 4 well as addressing systemic needs that support all Career Technical Education (CTE)
- 5 pathways. Specific objectives aligned with the intended program outcomes include: (1)
- 6 increasing the number of students enrolled in ICT and biotech pathways particularly from
- 7 underrepresented populations; (2) creating and sustaining more work-based learning
- 8 experiences for students; and (3) ensuring that high school students have the opportunity to
