EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Legislative Objectives

The proposed ordinance would (1) de-appropriate \$9,000,000 of 2014 Bond proceeds from San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) Parking Garage projects, and re-appropriate \$9,000,000 to the Radio System Replacement Project, and (2) de-appropriate \$437,587 of 2013 Bond proceeds from SFMTA Transit projects and re-appropriate \$437,587 to SFMTA Pedestrian projects in Fiscal Year 2015-16. All funding would be used for SFMTA capital projects, as shown in Tables 2 and 3 below.

Key Points

- The Board of Supervisors appropriated \$75,000,000 in Series 2013A Revenue Bonds (2013 Bonds) in December 2013, and \$75,000,000 in Series 2014A Revenue Bonds (2014 Bonds) in December 2014 to finance a portion of costs for SFMTA capital projects, including pedestrian safety, transportation safety, street capital, light rail, and facility improvements.
- SFMTA is requesting de-appropriation and re-appropriation of certain funds to account for changes in project budgets and timelines.

Fiscal Impact

• The proposed ordinance would (1) de-appropriate \$9,000,000 of 2014 Bonds proceeds from Parking Garage projects, and re-appropriate \$9,000,000 to the Radio Replacement Project, and (2) de-appropriate \$437,587 of 2013 Bonds proceeds from Transit projects and re-appropriate \$437,587 to Pedestrian projects in FY 2015-16.

Recommendation

Approve the proposed ordinance.

MANDATE STATEMENT

City Charter Section 9.105 states that amendments to the Annual Appropriations Ordinance, after the Controller certifies the availability of funds, are subject to Board of Supervisors approval by ordinance.

BACKGROUND

The Board of Supervisors appropriated \$75,000,000 in Series 2013A Revenue Bonds (2013 Bonds) in December 2013, and \$75,000,000 in Series 2014A Revenue Bonds (2014 Bonds) in December 2014 to finance a portion of costs for SFMTA capital projects, including pedestrian safety, transportation safety, street capital, light rail, and facility improvements, as shown in Table 1 below.

As shown in Table 1 above, total outstanding 2013 and 2014 Bonds are \$120,425,024.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance would (1) de-appropriate \$9,000,000 of 2014 Bond proceeds from SFMTA Parking Garage projects, and re-appropriate \$9,000,000 to the Radio System Replacement Project, and (2) de-appropriate \$437,587 of 2013 Bonds proceeds from SFMTA Transit projects (MUNI Metro Sunset Tunnel Rehabilitation Project) and re-appropriate \$437,587 to SFMTA Pedestrian Improvement projects (Gough Street Pedestrian Improvements Project) in FY 2015-16. The total amount of funding de-appropriated and re-appropriated is \$9,437,587. All funding would be used for SFMTA capital projects, as shown in Tables 2 and 3 below.

	The Radio System Replacement Project is proposing to issue change orders to exercise additional contract options and accommodate SFMTA's current needs, resulting in an \$11.6 million cost increase. Of the total \$11.6 million cost increase, \$9 million is expected to be covered by the proposed 2014 Bond re-appropriation and \$2.6 million is from a Federal grant previously appropriated.

FISCAL IMPACT

Radio System Replacement Project

The Radio System Replacement total project budget will increase by \$11,600,000 from the current budget of \$116,497,421 to the revised budget of \$128,097,421. Of the \$11,600,000 increase, \$9,000,000 will be funded by the requested re-appropriation of 2014 Bonds proceeds and \$2,600,000 will be funded by Federal Transit Administration funds, previously appropriated as part of the SFMTA Fiscal Year 2015-16 Capital Budget. The \$11,600,000 in increased costs are shown below in Table 4.

Pedestrian Improvements

The Pedestrian Improvements total project budget of \$513,900 will remain the same with this re-appropriation. SFMTA previously redirected \$437,587 from the Gough Street Pedestrian Improvements project to the MUNI Metro Sunset Tunnel Rehabilitation Project due to project delays. The funds will now be redirected back to the Gough Street Pedestrian Improvements Project, as originally intended. The MUNI Metro Sunset Tunnel Rehabilitation Project does not need the funds to complete the project.
