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10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:	
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12	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 10.100-160,	
13	to read as follows:	
14	SEC. 10.100-160. THE NAVIGATION PARTNERSHIPS FUND.	
15	(a) Establishment of Fund. The Navigation Partnerships Fund (the "Fund") is established to	
16	pay for navigation services provided by the City or contracted community-based organizations.	
17	"Navigation services" provide low barrier-to-entry alternatives to shelter with the goal of moving	
18	homeless individuals off of the streets, providing case management and connection to social service	
19	benefits, with an ultimate goal of stabilizing these individuals in housing placements in San Francisco	
20	or returning them to family and friends through the Homeward Bound program administered by the	
21	Human Services Agency. The Fund is a category eight fund, authorized to receive private donations,	
22	grants, gifts, and bequests of money which may be offered to the City to assist in the provision of	
23	navigation services.	
24	(b) Use of Fund. Money received into the Fund shall be used exclusively for the provision of	
25	navigation services. No costs which may be incurred by any City department in administering the Fund	

1	shall be recovered therefrom. Monies in the Fund may only be drawn and expended when the City has
2	appropriated an equal amount of funds for navigation services in the current fiscal year.
3	Appropriations include, but are not limited to, the budget process set forth in Article IX of the Charter,
4	supplemental appropriations, receipt of state or federal grants mid-year, and re-allocation of
5	departmental budgets mid-year.
6	(c) Administration of Fund. The Mayor's Office shall administer the Fund in consultation with
7	the Human Services Agency and the Department of Public Health.
8	(d) Reporting Requirement. The Mayor's Office shall report at least annually to the Board of
9	Supervisors and the Local Homeless Coordinating Board on private donations, grants, gifts, and
10	bequests of money to and expenditures from the Fund.
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12	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
13	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
14	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
15	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
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17	Section 3. Undertaking for the General Welfare. In enacting and implementing this
18	ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not
19	assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it
20	is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused
21	injury.
