10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

12	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 12B.2,
13	12B.2-3, and 12B.2-6, to read as follows:
14	SECTION 12B.2. NONDISCRIMINATION PROVISIONS.
15	* * * *
16	(f) The contractor or subcontractor shall:
17	* * * *
18	(2) Submit an Equal Pay Report if the contractor or subcontractor has at
19	least 20 employees worldwide and, for a contract or subcontract, the agreement has a value
20	equal to or in excess of the Threshold Amount set forth in Administrative Code Chapter 6 or
21	the Minimum Competitive Amount set forth in Administrative Code Chapter 21, as applicable,
22	or, for a grant, the agreement has a value equal to or in excess of \$50,000.
23	(A) The Equal Pay Report shall provide summary information on
24	compensation paid to employees identified by sex, race, sex and race, and data points the
25	Commission has adopted by regulation.

(B) Each contractor or subcontractor shall file a complete and accurate
 Equal Pay Report with the Commission commencing on a date set by the Commission but no
 later than *January 31, 2016 July 3, 2017*. Thereafter, each contractor or subcontractor shall file a
 Equal Pay Report annually.

(C) The Equal Pay Report requirements of this Subsection (f)(2) shall
apply to all qualifying contracts, subcontracts and grants first advertised for bid, request for
qualification or proposal *is* issued or initiated on a date set by the Commission but no later
than *January 31, 2016 July 3, 2017*.

9 (D) If any information in the Equal Pay Report constitutes proprietary 10 financial data, or confidential trade secret, or is protected by the right of privacy under the U.S. 11 or California Constitution, the City shall not disclose such information unless required by law, 12 including under the California Public Records Act and the San Francisco Sunshine Ordinance. 13 * * * *

SEC. 12B.2-3. POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Advisory Board shall analyze and recommend the best method or methods 15 (a) 16 of data collection that will identify wage gaps between men and women of the same or 17 different races and among members of different races, and that will minimize the burden on 18 City contractors and subcontractors in providing the data. The Advisory Board shall also 19 analyze and recommend data points that may include but are not limited to employees' 20 education, years of work experience, and specialized skills, that would aid in the analysis of 21 wage disparities. The Advisory Board's recommendations shall include recommendations for additional ordinances if legislative change is necessary or desirable to implement the 22 23 recommendations.

(b) The Advisory Board shall make its recommendation to the Board of Supervisors
 and the Human Rights Commission within six months of its inaugural meeting. Thereafter,

1 notwithstanding Rule 2.21 of the Board of Supervisors Rules of Order, which provides that advisory 2 bodies created by the Board shall meet at least once every four months, the Advisory Board shall 3 meet at least once every four months twice per calendar year to evaluate the effectiveness of the 4 data collection methods used and make further recommendations as appropriate. * 5 6 SEC. 12B.2-6. SUNSETTING. 7 The Advisory Board and sections pertaining thereto (Sections 12B.2-1 through (a) 8 12B.2-6) shall expire by operation of law on October 1, 2017 July 2, 2018, unless the Board of 9 Supervisors adopts an ordinance continuing the existence of the Advisory Board. (b) The Advisory Board shall submit a report to the Board of Supervisors by *May 1*, 10 2017 February 1, 2018, recommending whether the Advisory Board should continue to operate, 11 12 and if so, whether the Board of Supervisors should consider legislative changes that would 13 enhance the capacity of the Advisory Board to achieve its goals. 14 (c) Upon expiration of the Advisory Board as specified in subsection (a), the City Attorney shall cause Sections 12B.2-1, 12B.2-2, 12B.2-3, 12B.2-4, 12B.2-5, and 12B.2-6 to be 15 removed from the Municipal Code. 16 17 18 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after 19 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the 20 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board 21 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. 22 23 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, 24 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal 25
