




□ There was a 14% increase in Auto Burglary from 2013 to 2014.

Auto Burglary




- There was a 49% increase in Auto Burglary during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.

Vehicle Theft




 The number of Vehicle Thefts increased by 4% from 2013 to 2014.


- There was an 18% increase in Vehicle Theft during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.


Theft (not including Auto Burglary)





Burglary (Commercial and Residential)




- □ There was a 12% decrease in Burglary from 2013 to 2014.

Burglary (Commercial and Residential)




- There was a 15% decrease in Burglary during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- There was an average of 494 Burglaries per month in 2013; the average in 2014 was 436 per month.

- The combined totals of Auto Burglary, Vehicle Theft, Theft, Burglary, and Arson depict a decrease in property crime by 7% from 2013 to 2014.




San Francisco's property crime rate actually declined 6 percent between 2013 and 2014.

Property Crime Rate - San Francisco 2004-2014





Among the five largest cities in California, San Francisco had the highest property crime rate in 2013.

Property Crime Rates - California's Largest Cities 2004-2013









Felony Filings: Filings, Other Action, Total Action Taken







