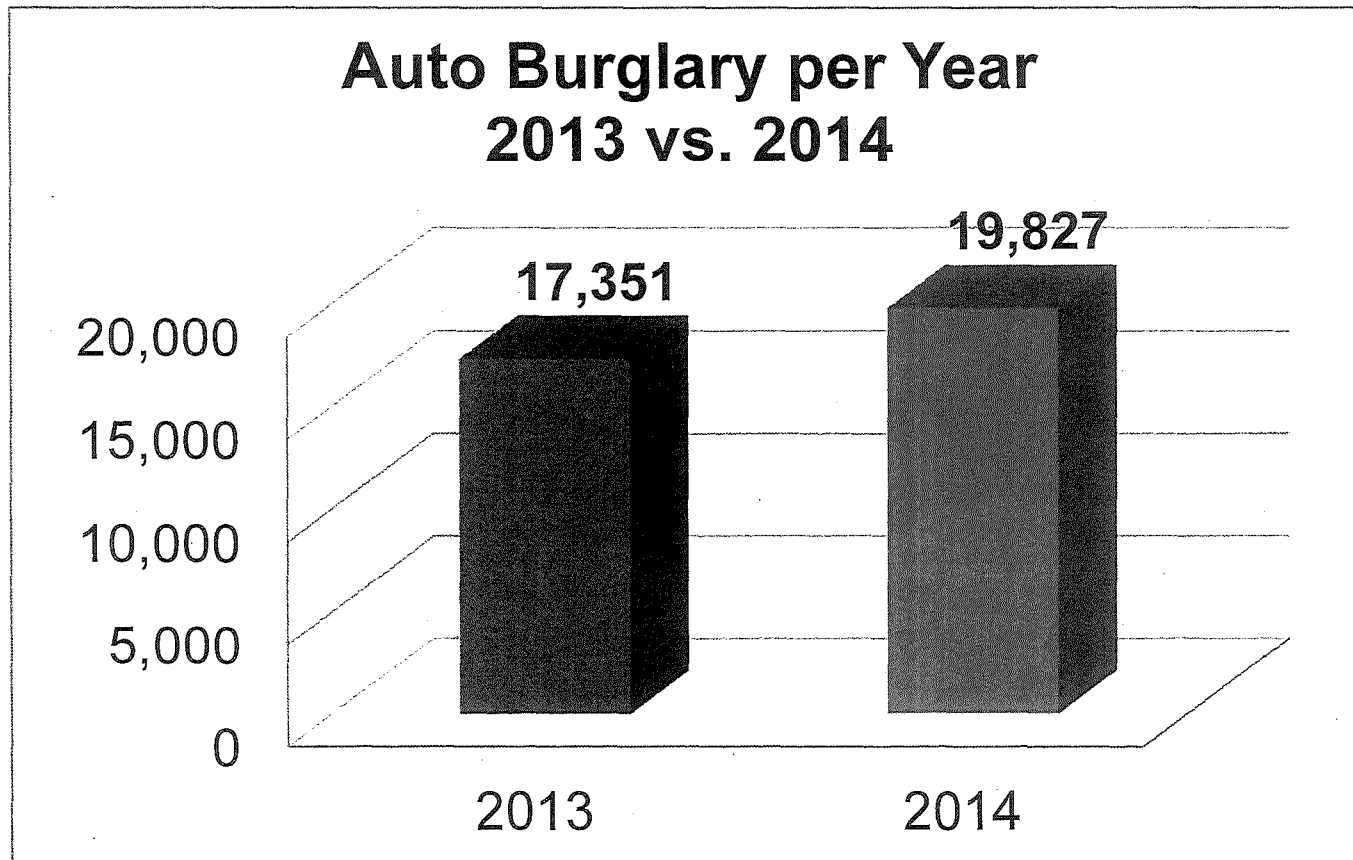

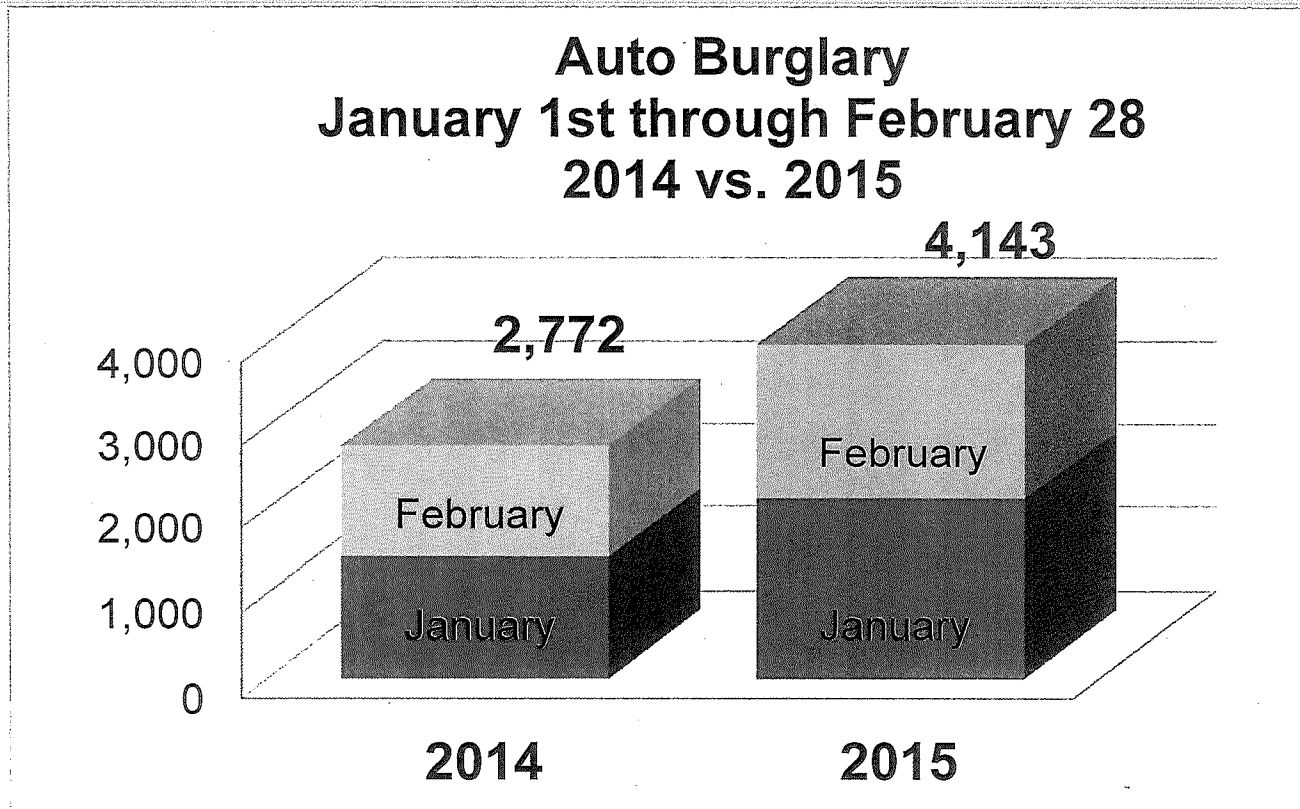

Auto Burglary



- **There was a 14% increase in Auto Burglary from 2013 to 2014.**

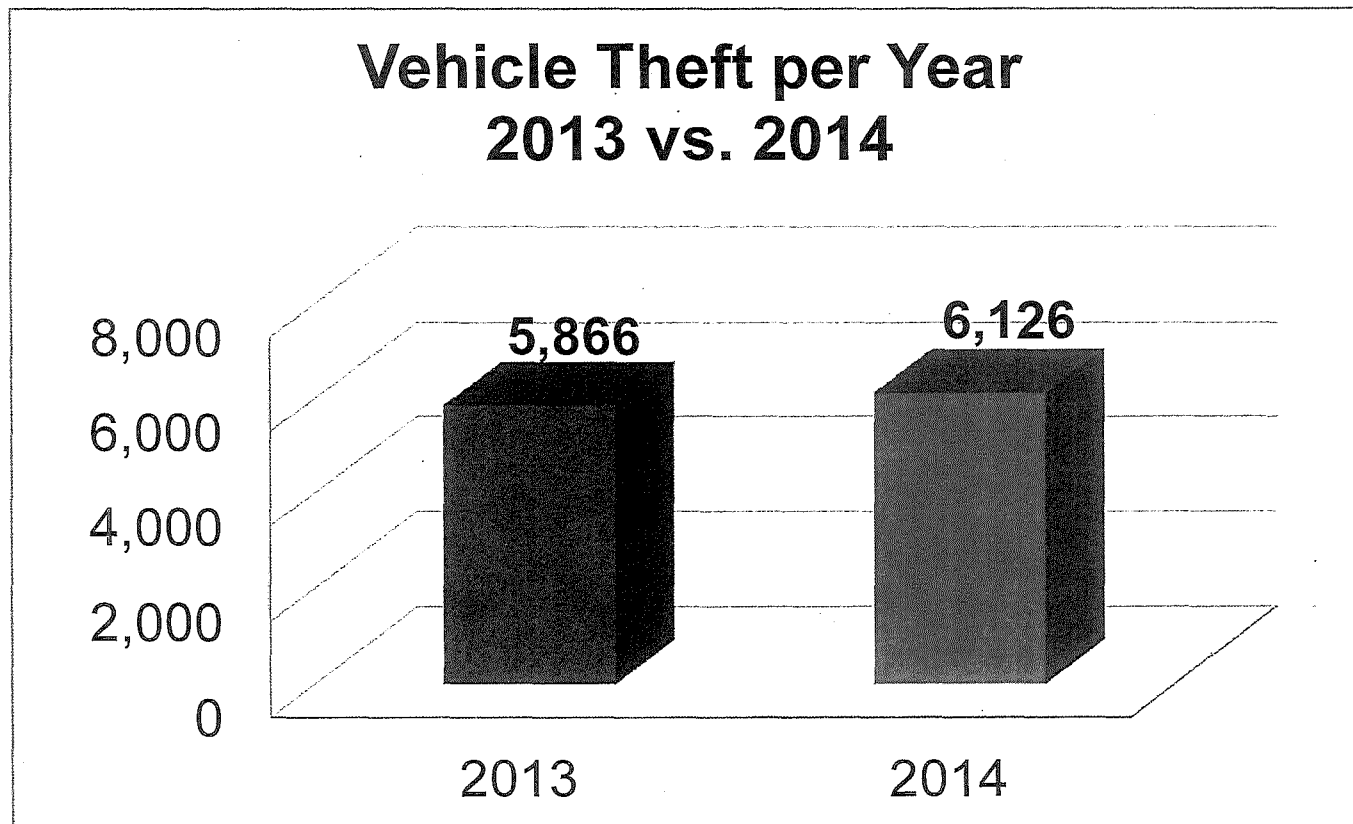
Auto Burglary



- There was a 49% increase in Auto Burglary during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- The average number of incidents per month in 2013 was 1,446; the average in 2014 was 1,652.
- The average for the first two months of 2015 is 2,072.

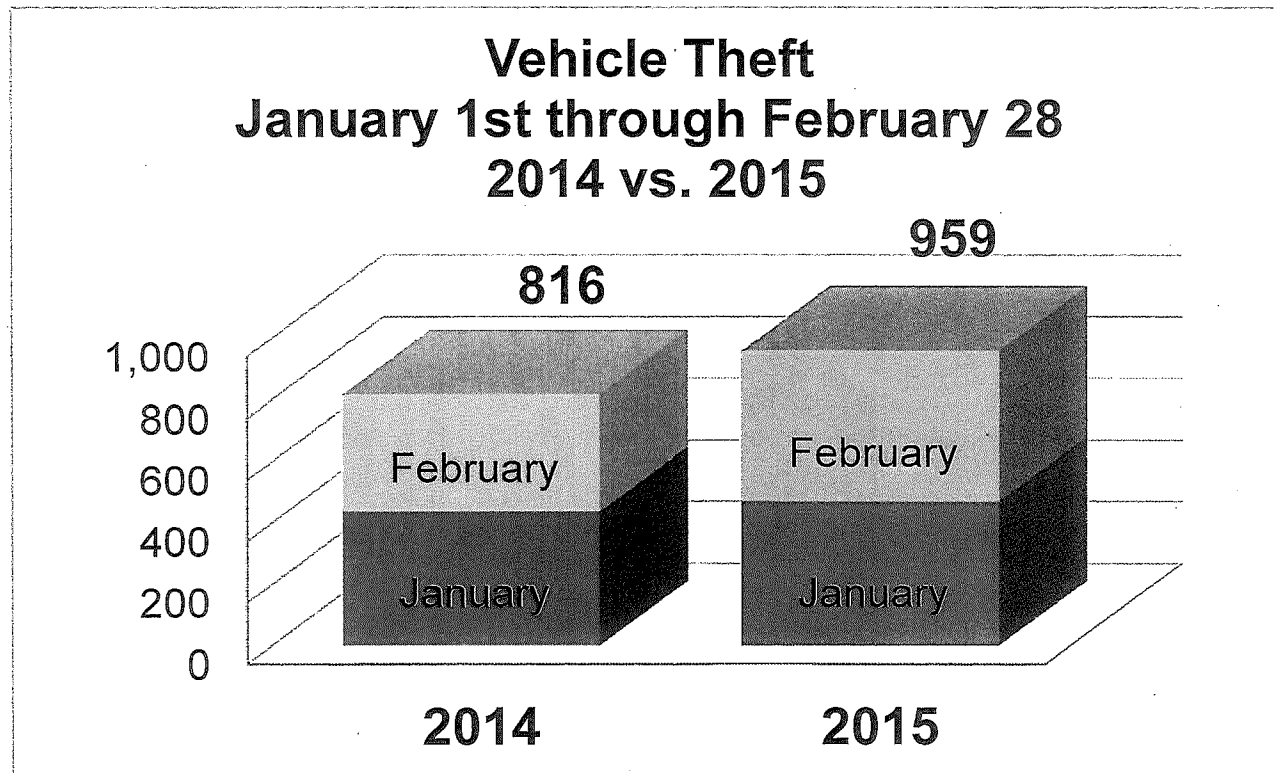

- The number of Vehicle Thefts increased by 4% from 2013 to 2014.

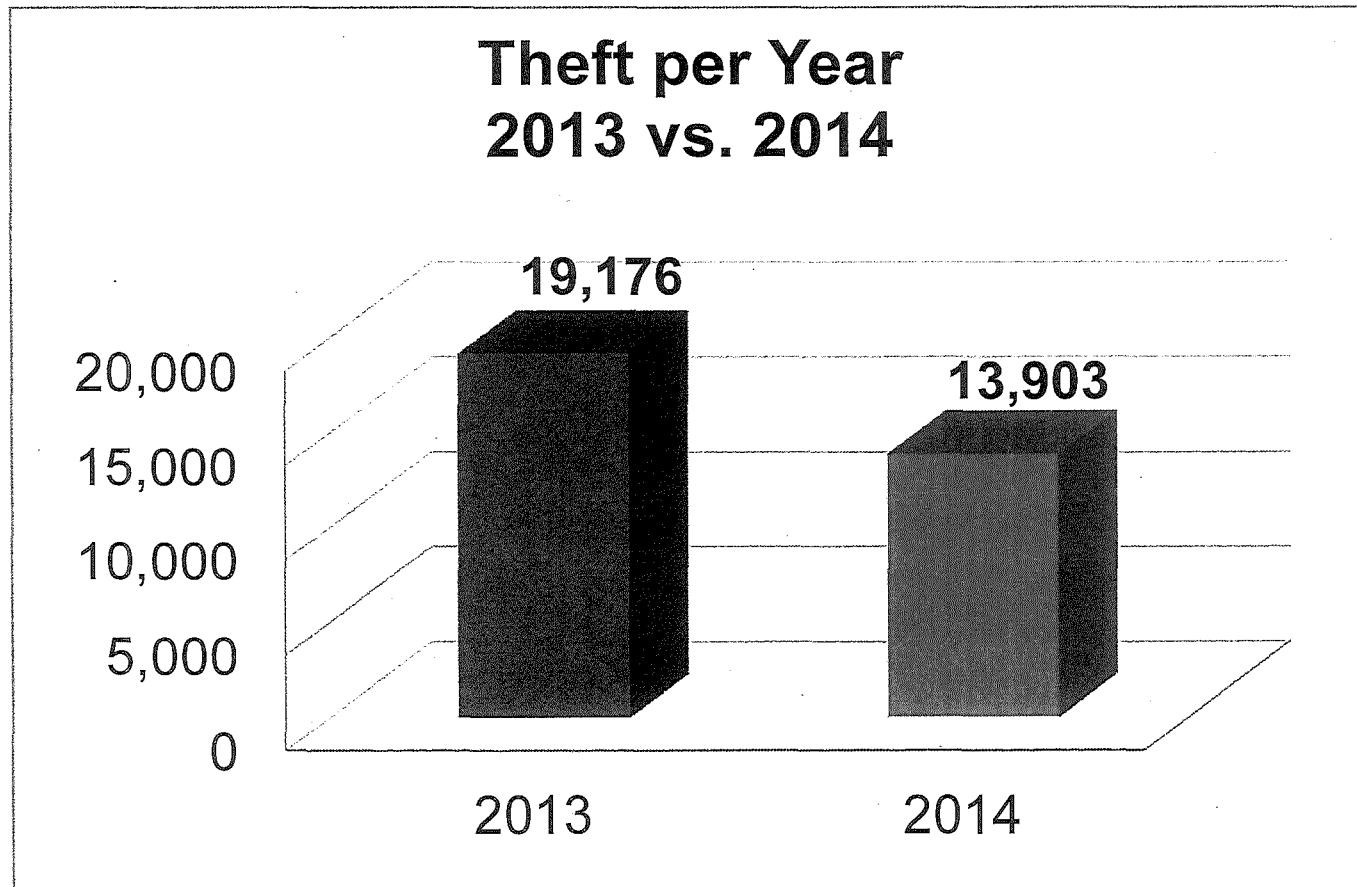
Vehicle Theft



- There was an 18% increase in Vehicle Theft during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- The average number of Vehicle Thefts per month was 574 in 2013, and 408 in 2014.
- The average for the first two months of 2015 is 480.

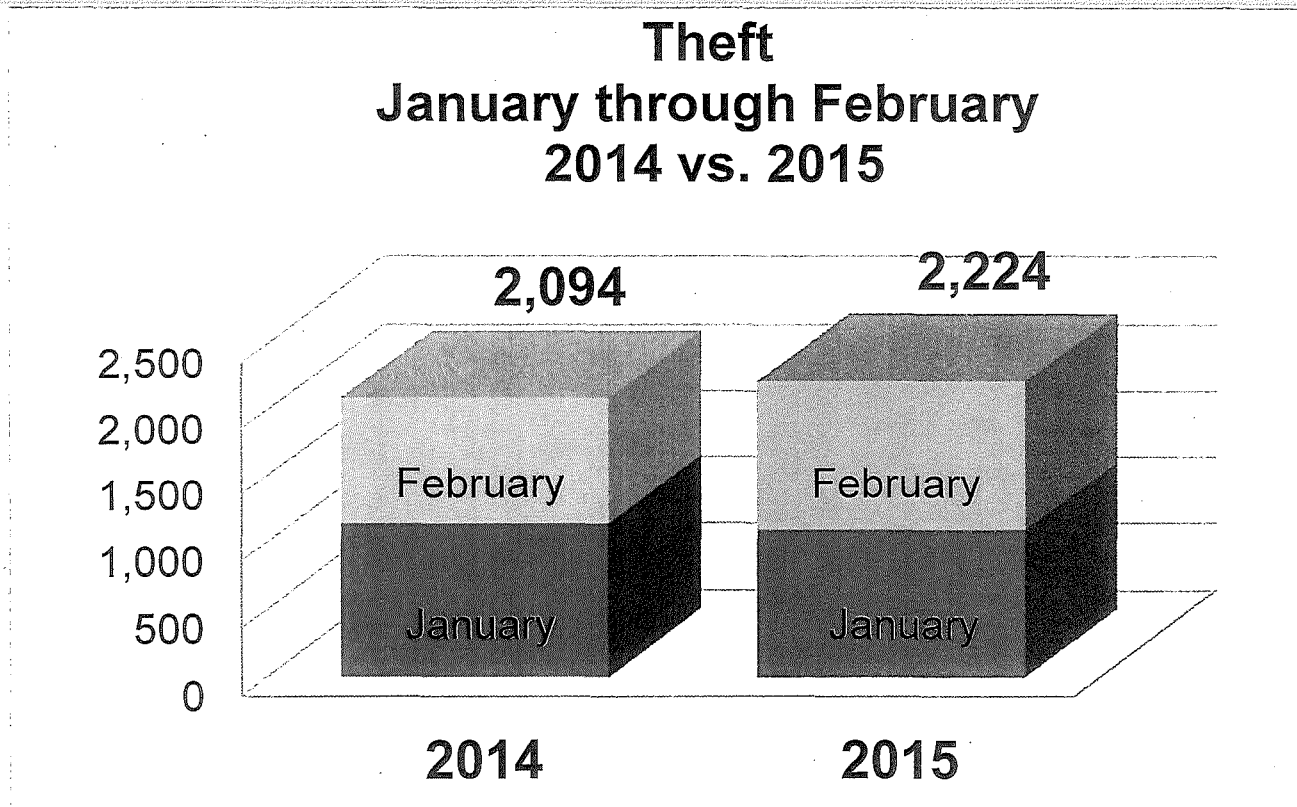
Theft (not including Auto Burglary)

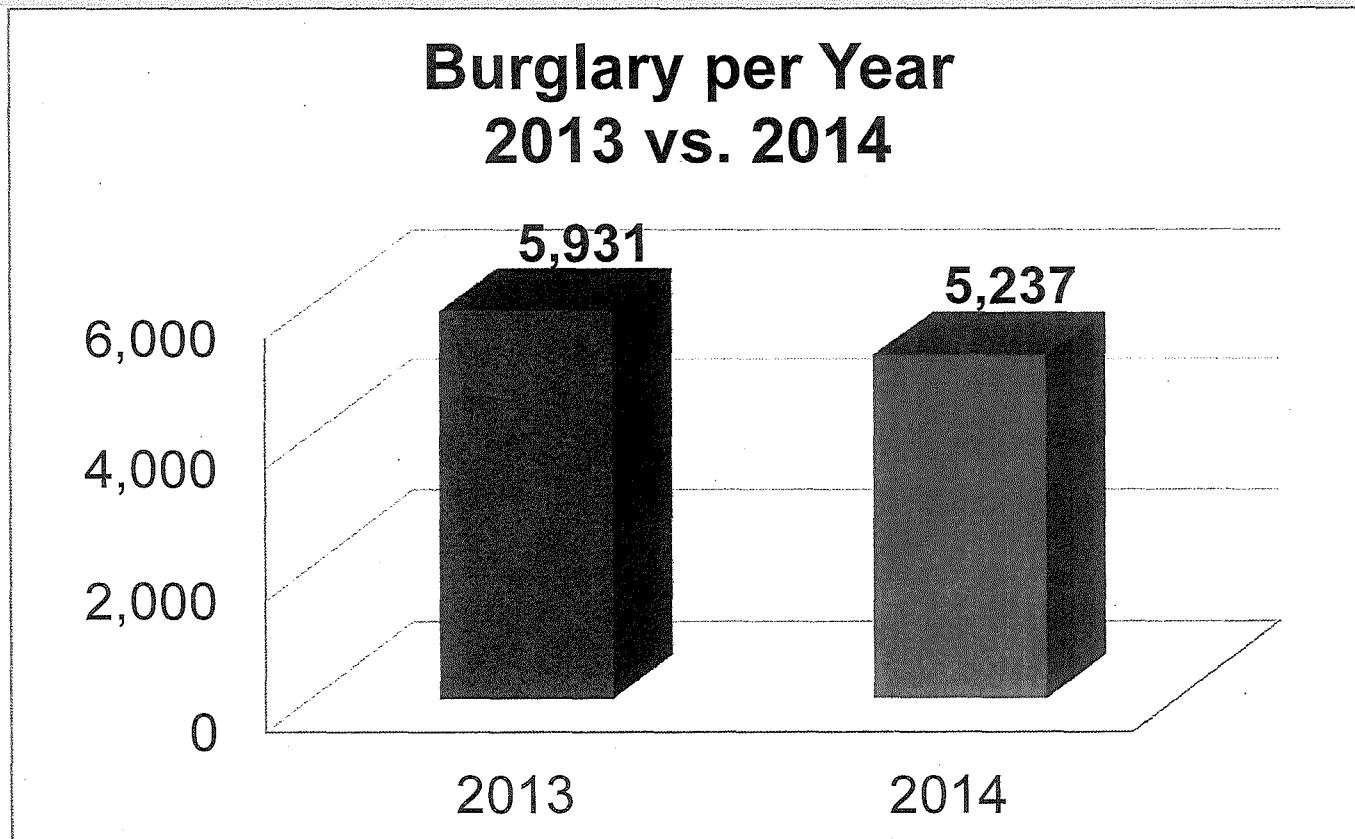
Theft (not including Auto Burglary)



- There was a 6% increase in Theft during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- There was an average of 1,598 Thefts per month in 2013; the average in 2014 was 1,159.
- The average for the first two months of 2015 is 1,112.

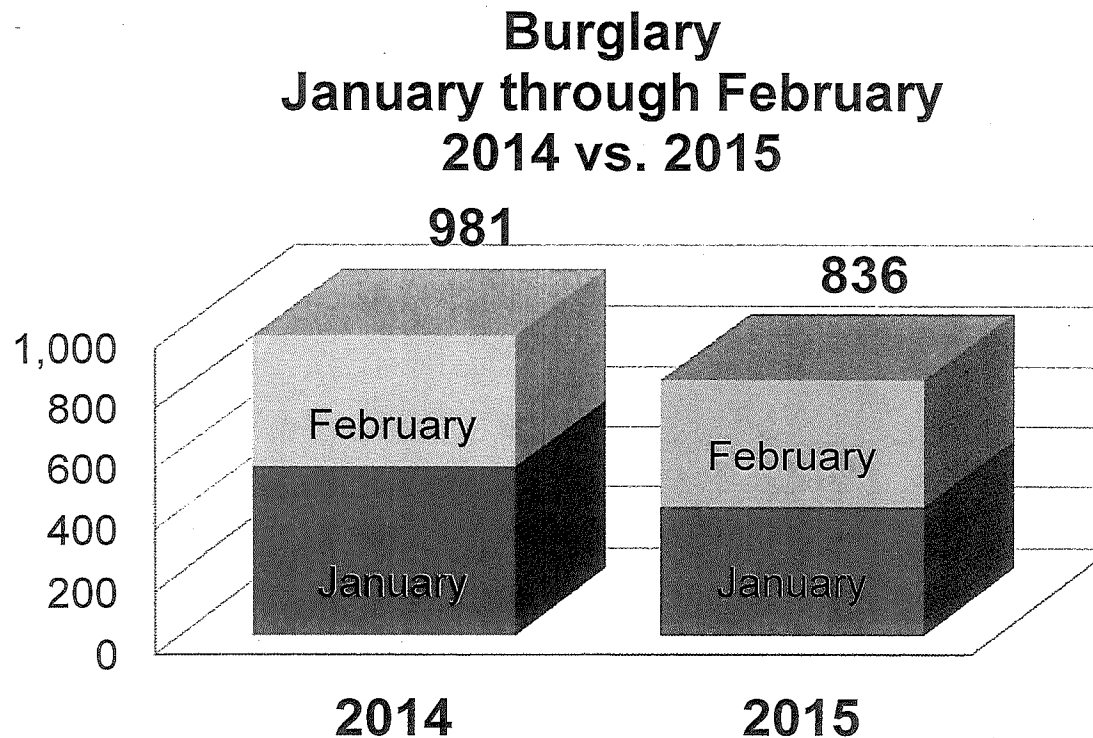
Burglary (Commercial and Residential)



- There was a 12% decrease in Burglary from 2013 to 2014.
- In November 2014, Proposition 47 was enacted. Entering a commercial establishment with intent to commit theft is no longer burglary; it is now 490.5 PC (shoplifting).

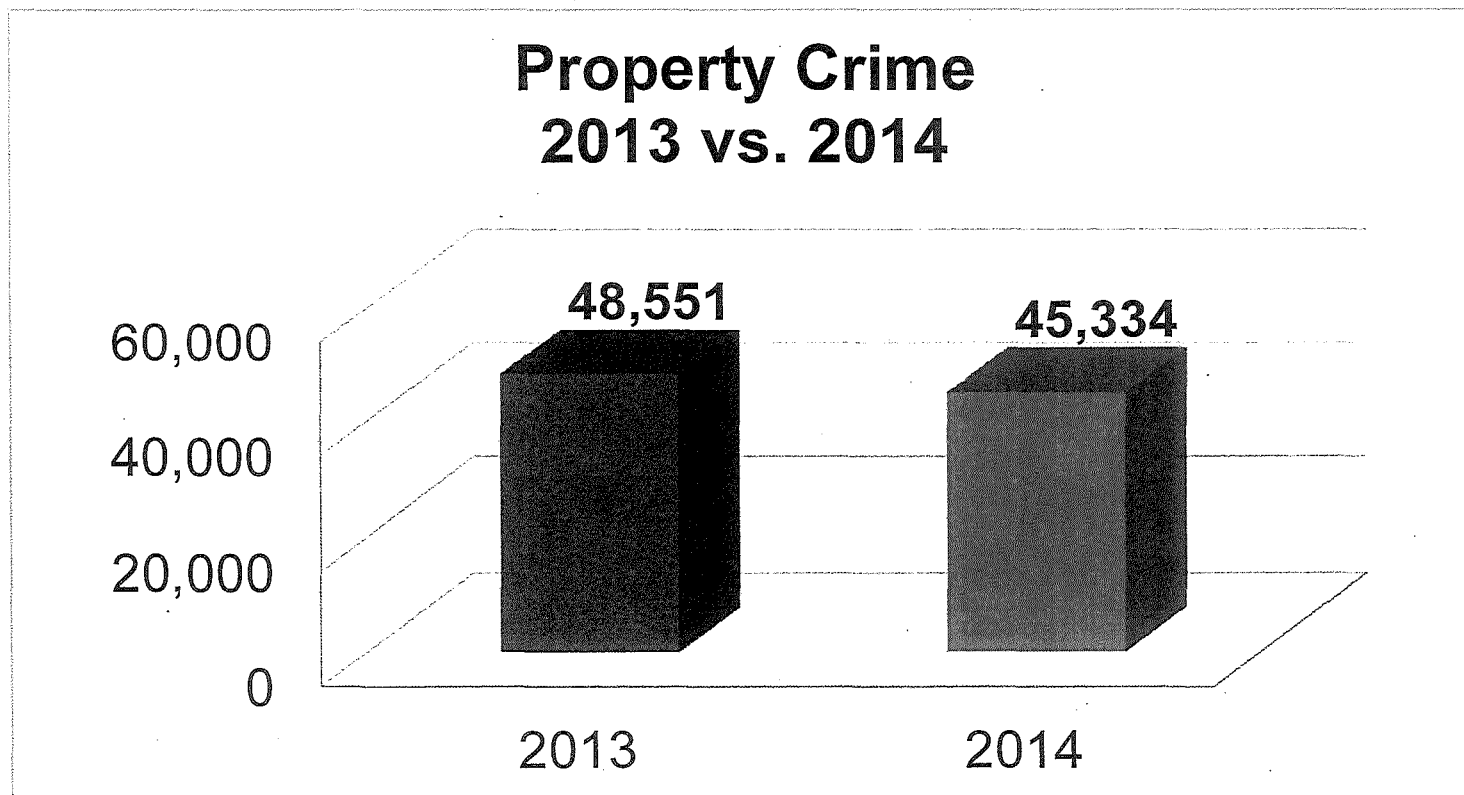

Burglary (Commercial and Residential)



- ❑ There was a 15% decrease in Burglary during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- ❑ There was an average of 494 Burglaries per month in 2013; the average in 2014 was 436 per month.
- ❑ The average for the first two months of 2015 is 418.

Total Property Crime

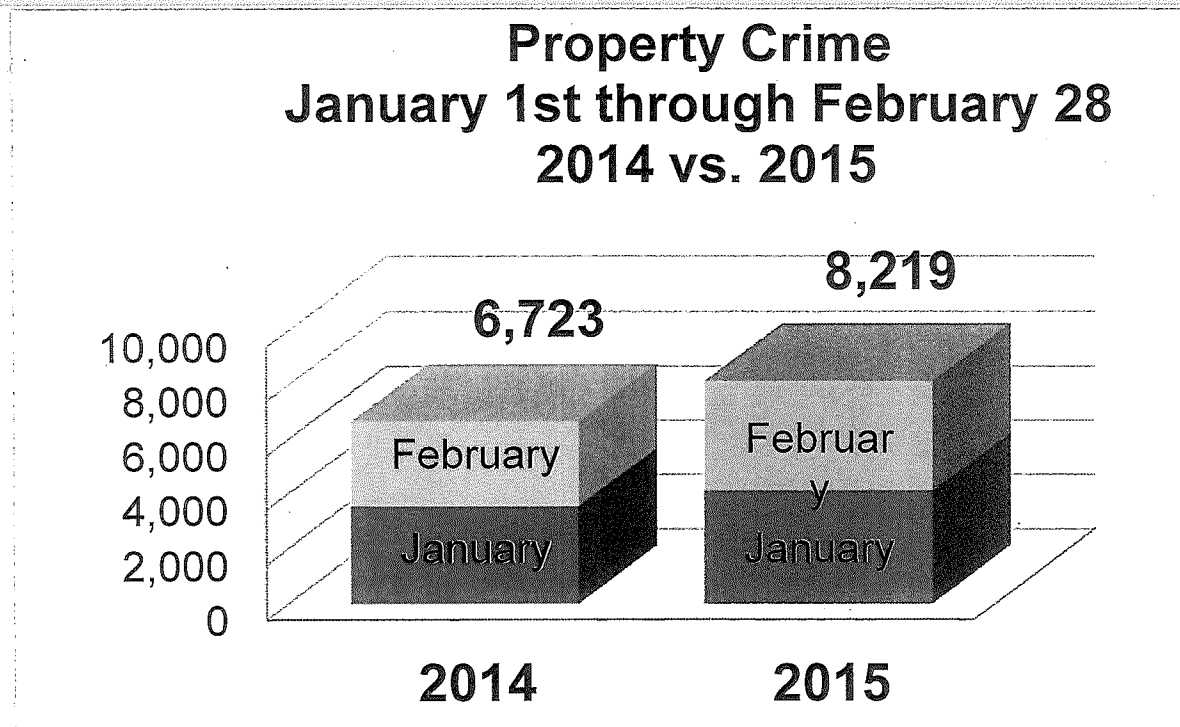


- The combined totals of Auto Burglary, Vehicle Theft, Theft, Burglary, and Arson depict a decrease in property crime by 7% from 2013 to 2014.

- Total Property Crime includes Arson; there were 227 incidents.

Total Property Crime



- There was a 22% increase in Property Crime during the first two months of 2015, compared to the first two months of 2014.
- There was an average of 4,046 incidents per month in 2013; the average per month in 2014 was 3,778.
- In the first two months of 2015, there was an average of 4,110 Property Crime incidents per month.

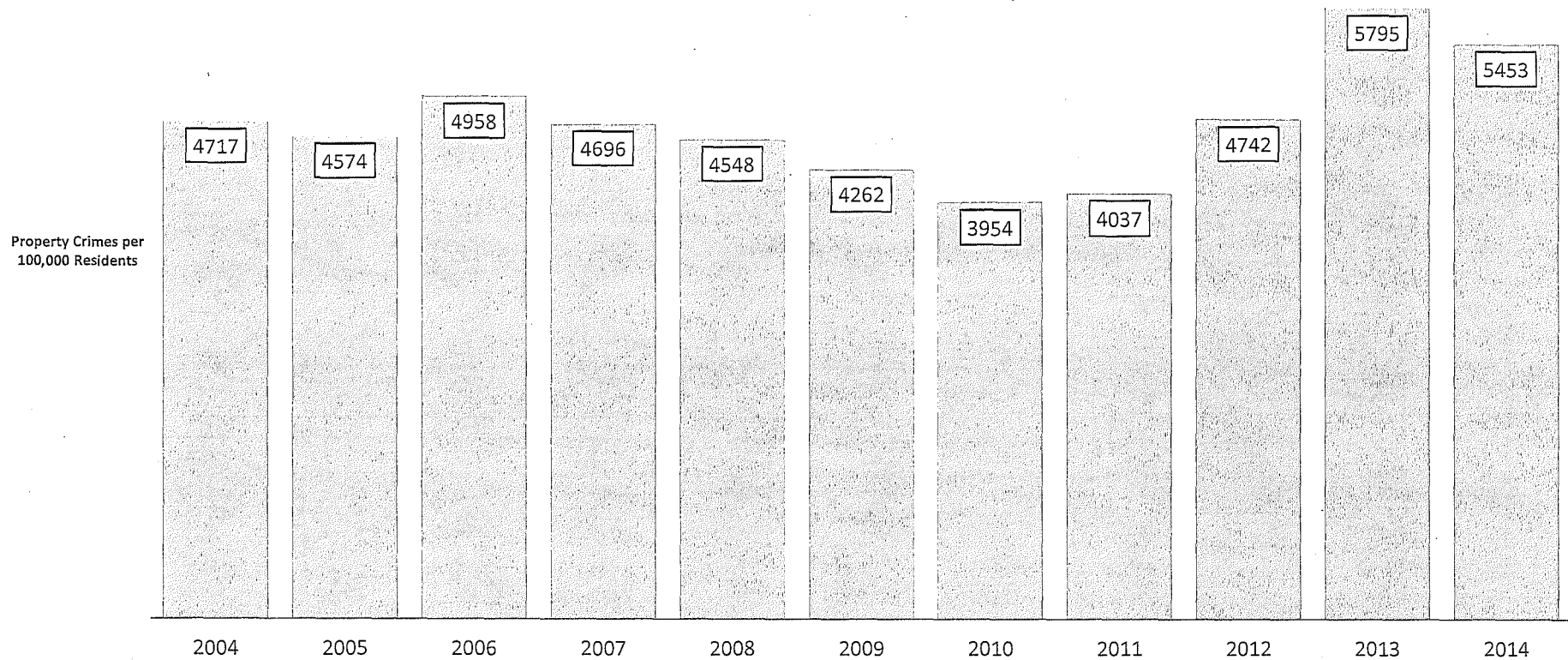

San Francisco's property crime rate actually declined 6 percent between 2013 and 2014.

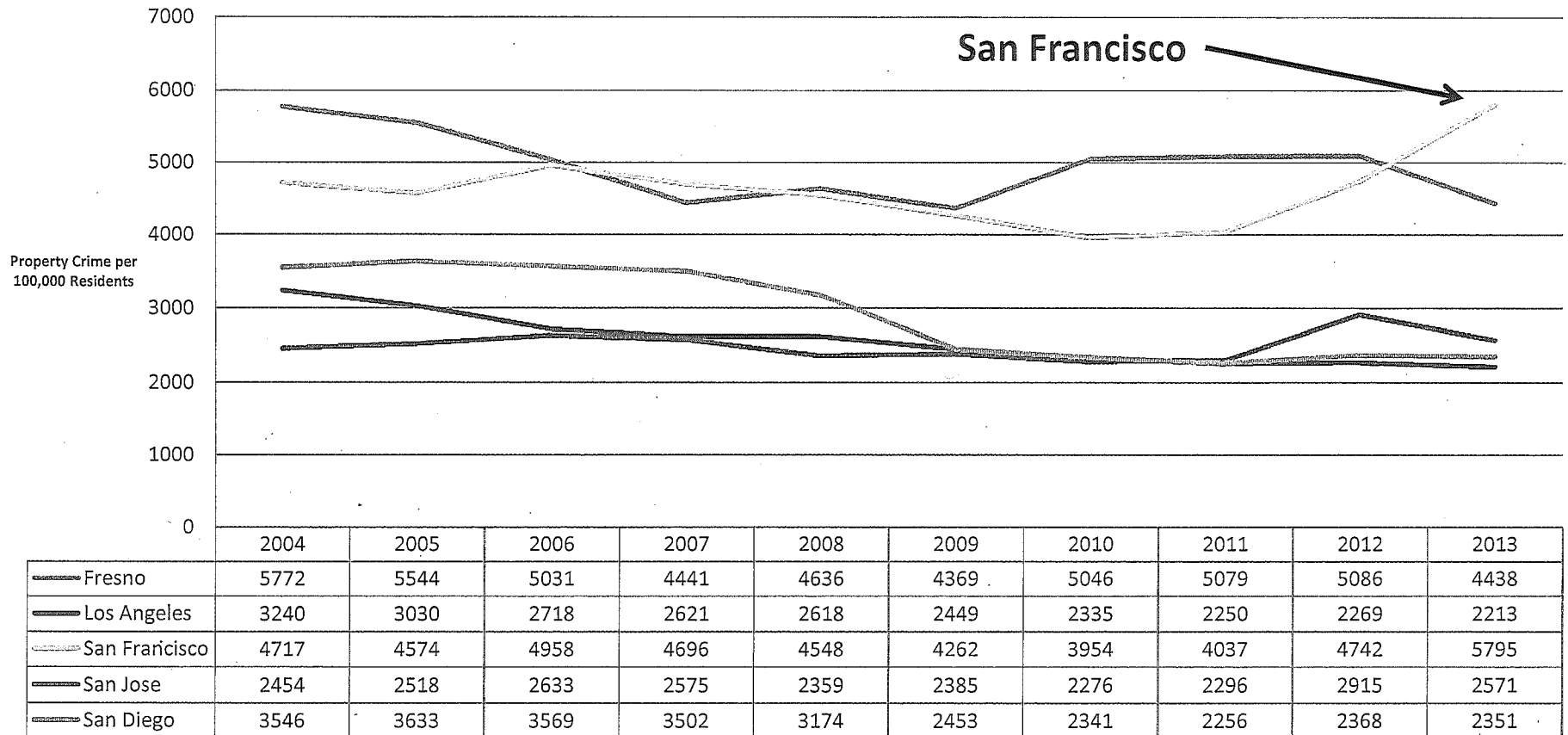
Property Crime Rate - San Francisco

Among the five largest cities in California, San Francisco had the highest property crime rate in 2013.

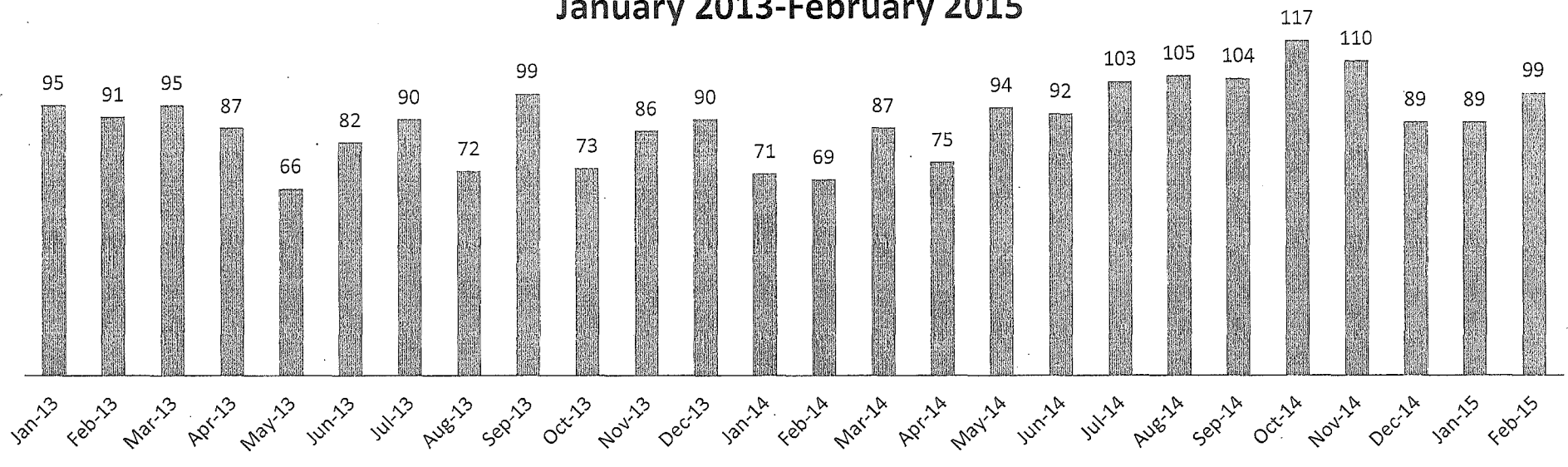

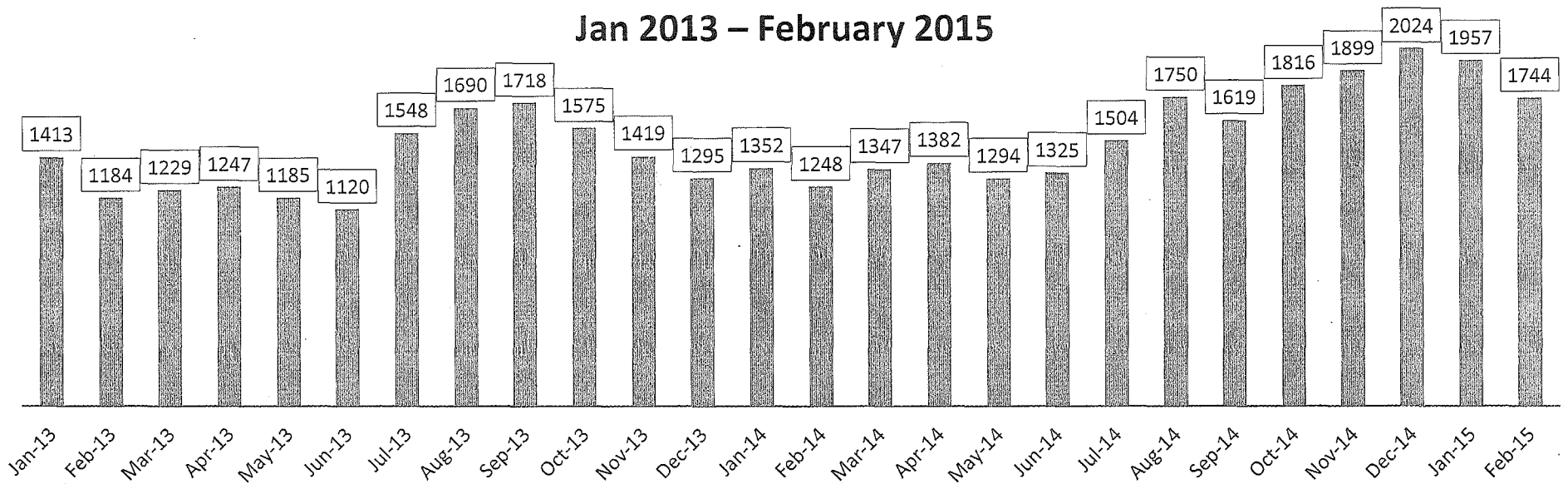


There is an increasing trend for auto burglary, but that increase started in July 2014.

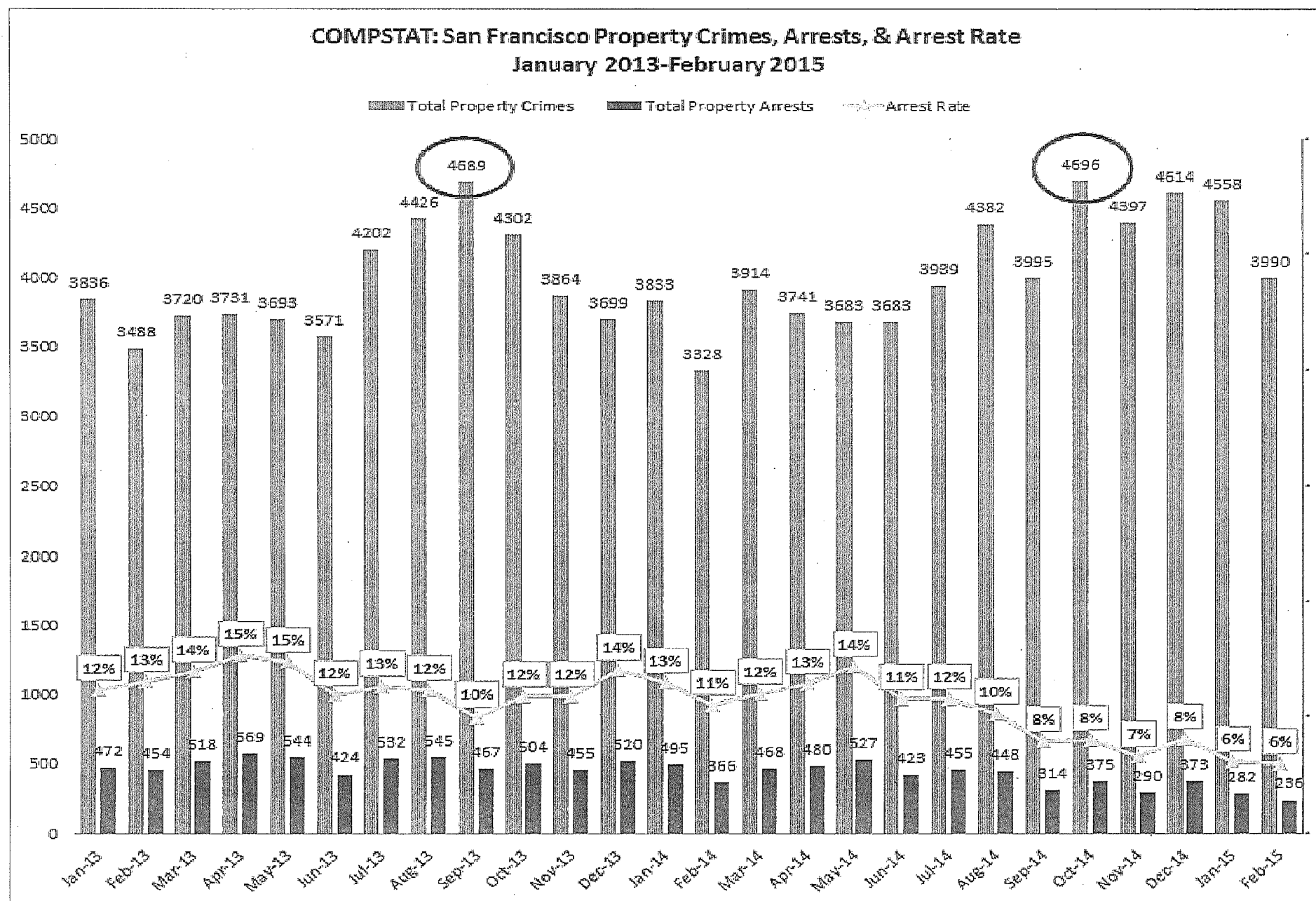
COMPSTAT: Ingleside Auto Burglary Crimes
January 2013-February 2015



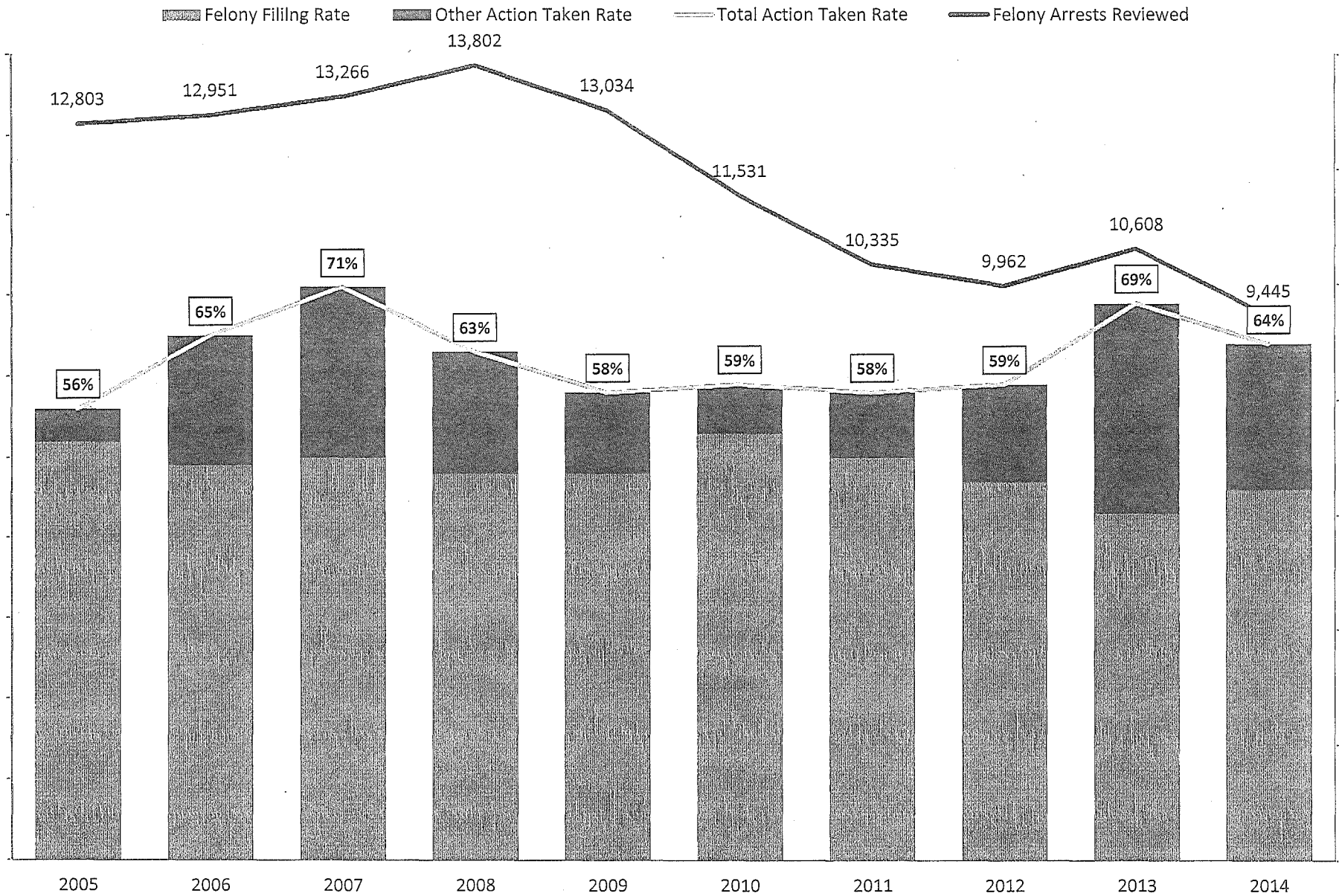
COMPSTAT: Citywide Auto Burglary Crimes
Jan 2013 – February 2015



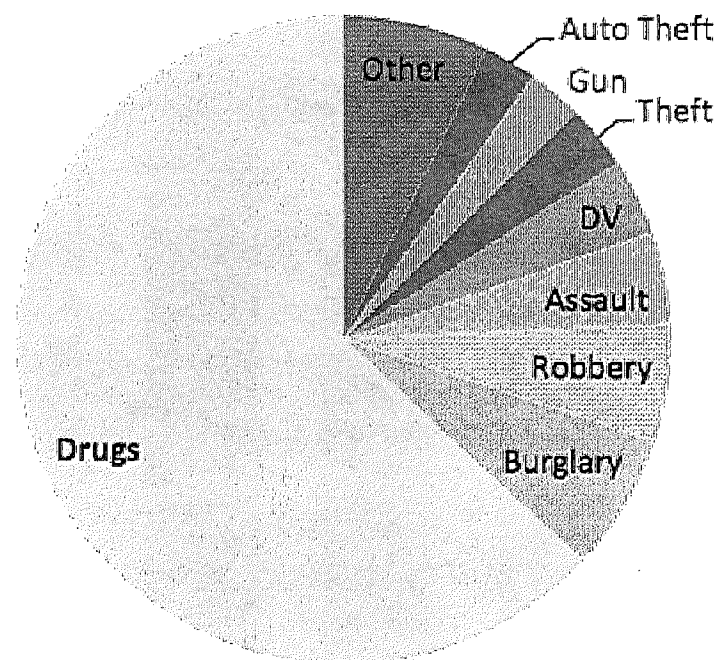

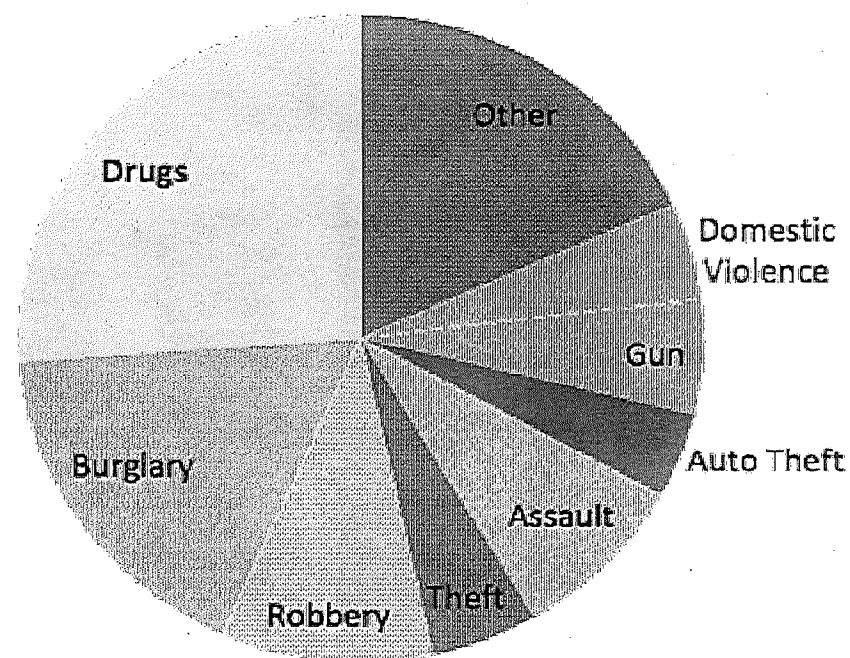
Felony Filings: Filings, Other Action, Total Action Taken



Felony Caseload 2009



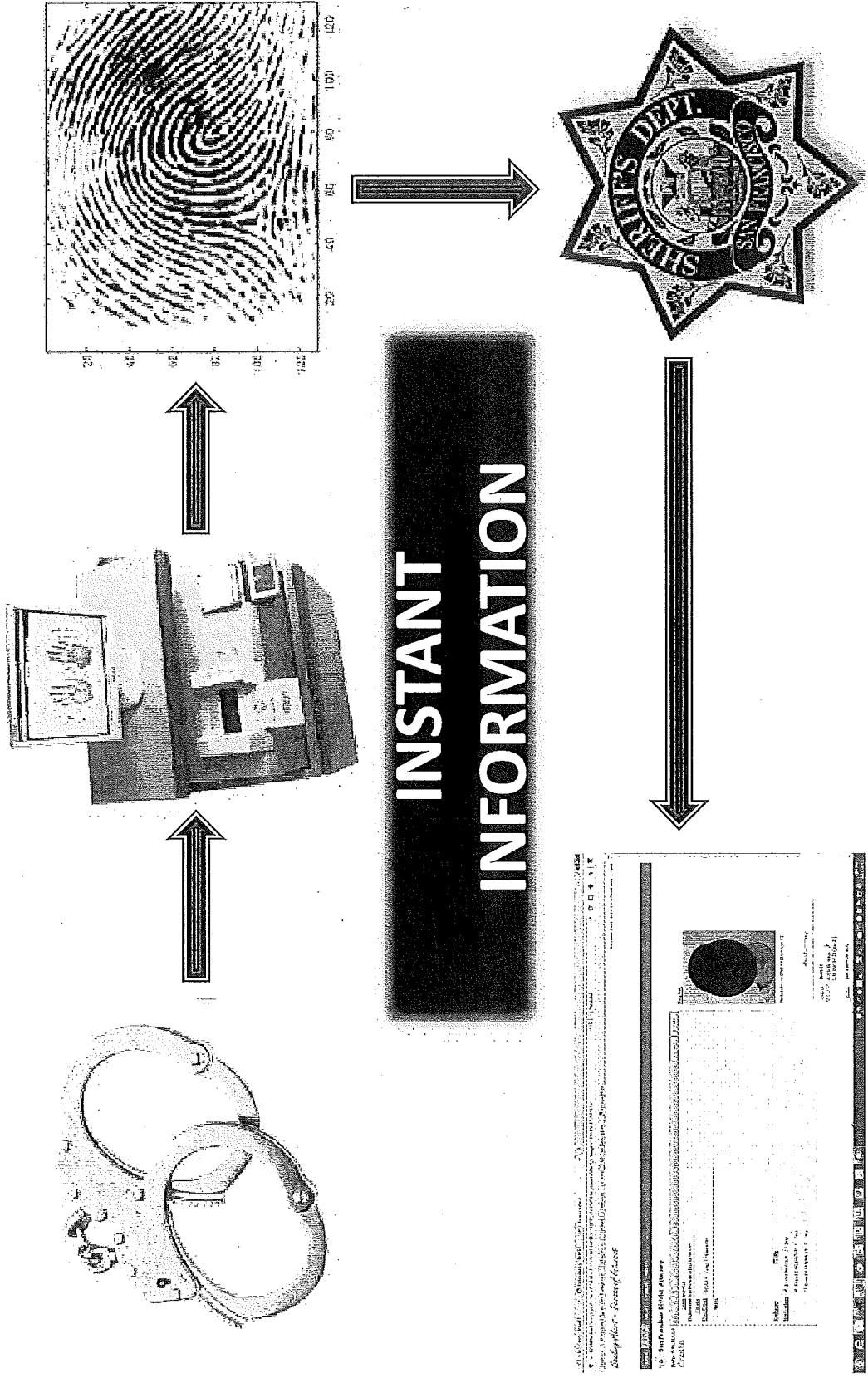


