[Commemorative Street Plaque - Herbert Kosovitz - Washington Square Park]

Resolution authorizing the placement of a street plaque commemorating Herbert Kosovitz at the sidewalk of Washington Square Park, located at Union Street, in accordance with Public Works Code, Sections 789, et seq., the Commemorative Street Plaque Ordinance, and accepting the named plaque as a gift to the City and County of San Francisco from the Friends of Washington Square Park.

WHEREAS, Mr. Herbert Kosovitz, born April 13, 1928, in Kansas City, Missouri, came to University of California, Berkeley School of Architecture in 1952; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Kosovitz moved to San Francisco in 1956 and practiced residential architecture until his retirement in 2008; and

WHEREAS, In 1971, he settled on Telegraph Hill, and became active with various neighborhood and parks groups; and

WHEREAS, In 1998, he became a founding member of the Friends of Washington Square Park; and

WHEREAS, On July 30, 2014, Mr. Kosovitz passed and was survived by two nieces, two nephews, two grandnieces and two grandnephews; and

WHEREAS, Residents and neighbors, including the Friends of Washington Square
Park, fondly remember Mr. Kosovitz, known as Herb to many, for his leadership rallying
concerned citizens to steward Washington Square Park, the largest open space in the heart of
North Beach neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Kosovitz's tirelessly led the efforts of improving and preserving Washington Square Park and as a result, lighting was installed and other improvements were made to further beautify the Park and improve public safety; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors declares its intent to place a commemorative street plaque on the sidewalk at Washington Square at Union Street in honor of Mr. Herbert Kosovitz; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors accepts a commemorative plaque in honor of Mr. Herbert Kosovitz as a gift to the City and County of San Francisco from the Friends of Washington Square Park; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors, in accordance with Public Works Code, Section 789, et seq., the Commemorative Street Plaque Ordinance, authorizes the placement of plaques on the sidewalk at Washington Square, at Union Street; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby urges Public Works to waive all costs associated with the installation of the commemorative plaque; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs Public Works to take all actions necessary to implement the intent of this Resolution, including approval of the installation of the aforementioned plaque; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs Public Works to add aforementioned plaque at the aforementioned location on the City's official list of commemorative sites effective immediately from the date of passage of this Resolution.
