Resolution authorizing Fire Department to donate a retired fire engine to the City College of San Francisco Fire Academy Program.

[Donation of Retired Fire Engine to City College of San Francisco]

WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco (CCSF) is a leading educational institution for its Fire Academy Program and teaches those who wish to be future firefighters; and

WHEREAS, A large part of firefighting training focuses on manipulative skills and simulated drills with the aid of genuine equipment; and

WHEREAS, Firefighting equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain; and WHEREAS, The Fire Department has recently taken receipt of ten new fire engines, allowing the Department to replace a number of old units that were no longer of operational use to the Department; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department wishes to donate a retired vehicle for educational training purposes; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle 145-585, a 1988 Mack Pumper, has been retired from service even as a relief piece; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle 145-585 would serve as a valuable training tool for pump training and hose evolutions, and the City College Fire Academy would benefit greatly from this vehicle as a training aid; and

WHEREAS, On March 26, 2015, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution No. 2015-03, recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the donation of a retired engine to City College of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 150937, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Code, Chapter 21, allows for commodities that have been declared as surplus to be disposed of in a manner that will best serve the interests of the City and will maximize the City's economic return on the surplus commodities by donating to public entities, non-profit organizations and schools; and

WHEREAS, Among the first criteria on the priority list for donation of surplus commodities are schools that are physically located in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco is an institution of learning (school) and is physically located in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Fire Department is authorized to donate vehicle 145-585 to the City College of San Francisco's Fire Academy Program.
