


Safe, Reliable Service for the Riding Public

- Our goal: Safe and reliable transit for all visitors San Francisco residents, workers, and
- transit critical component to safe and reliable Reliable & stable operator training is a
- service delivery and quality Training resource constraints in the past have led to high overtime and poor



Safe and Reliable Service

- Reliable and stable operator training depends on three key components:
- 1. Facility
- 2. Staffing
- 3. Vehicles





Cost of Missing Training Targets

- An under-resourced Training Department has huge impacts to service and budget
- Unscheduled Operator Overtime Cost:

– CY 2012: \$4.5 million

– CY 2013: \$4.5 million

– CY 2014: \$6.9 million

- CY 2015: \$920,000

Cost of missing just one operator class in month unscheduled overtime = \$415,000 per



Cost of Missing Training Targets

Insufficient operator staffing means missed scheduled service delivery goal of delivering at least 98.5% of service and missing our Proposition E service

Average Daily Service Missed:

- CY 2012: 4%

- CY 2013: 2%

– CY 2014: 5%– CY 2015: <1% by end of year

on-time performance, & overcrowding Results are persistent gaps in service, poor



Instability Drives Up Costs & Degrades Service

- All 13 scheduled new operator training classes in 2015 had to be rescheduled due to facility availability
- One class canceled in 2015 due to resource constraints
- Classes in 2012, 2013, and 2014 were smaller than needed due to resource constraints that led to the operator shortage

Classes per Year:

2011: 10

2012: 6

2013: 7

2014: 10

2015: 13

2016 (planned): 9



Options are Running Out

- Ad hoc, month to month options disappearing
- Down to two ad hoc training locations:
- Alameda Naval Base Slated for Redevelopment
- Cow Palace Limited availability due to events
- No permanent Training Facility for the Bay Area's largest transit provider
- Solution: Provide a dedicated Training **Facility**



City Controller Recommended

- In 2013, the City Controller's Office Audit of SFMTA Training recommended securing a dedicated Training facility.
- "lacks an appropriate location for a skills Report cites that the Training Department course
- Recommendation from report:
- "Locate and, if necessary, lease a location can be reliably scheduled to meet the needs of suitable for transit operator training programs that the Training unit."



Over 25 Sites Considered

Need a 6-7 acres of open, paved space to teach operators to drive safely and teach safety skills



Port of San Francisco	Not consistently available
Candlestick Park Parking Lots	Now a development site
SF International Airport	Not Available
SFMTA Properties	Limited Size/Capacity and Is Difficult To Coordinate With Daily Throughput In Yards
Cow Palace	Not Consistently Available, Only 1 Week Available Every Few Months
Port of Oakland	Availability Limited to One Week a Month
Alemany Farmers Market	Not Big Enough or Consistently Available
City of Alameda (Former Naval Airstrip Lot)	Portions to be redeveloped
SamTrans Properties	Not Available Consistently; Limited Size/Difficult To Coordinate with Daily Throughput in Yards and Their Own Training
AC Transit Properties	Not Available Consistently; Limited Size/Difficult To Coordinate with Daily Throughput in Yards and Their Own Training
Private Properties	Not Large Enough Or Adequately Improved, Those That Are Large Enough, Are Redevelopment Sites



Benefits of 30 Tanforan Lease

- Consistent year round access to a new, improved training site
- Four outdoor, off-street,
 Transit Operator training
 courses (on 7.3 acres/317,988
 square feet) each course
 140' x 400'
- Competitive cost
- Opportunities to provide more than new operator training
- Onsite bus storage and modular training trailers







Multi-Functional Facility

- Not only for new operator motor coach training
- Site will be used for:
- Operator retraining and annual refresher training
- Supervisor training Safety and collision retraining
- Maintenance training
- Non-revenue vehicle training
- Opportunities for other SFMTA related training



\$206,692 (\$.65 per square foot) monthly, or \$2,480,304 annual, 2% increases

Option to purchase years 7-9 of 9.5 years term

Right of First Refusal throughout Lease term

Extension potential (up to 20 years)

 \sim \$11 million in owner/developer site improvements

Estimated completion and occupancy October 1, 2016

On January 19, 2016, the SFMTA Board of Directors approved Resolution No. 16-011 authorizing the Director of Transportation of the SFMTA to execute the Lease and to forward to the Board of Supervisors for final approval

Cost of missing one class is over \$400,000/month or \$5 million/year in operator overtime



Alternative: Another Site

- Zero sites of 30 Tanforan type and size available in the San Francisco and North Peninsula markets
- More expensive, smaller, and in poorer condition
- San Francisco Total Industrial Market average rent: \$1.55 square foot
- South San Francisco property rents range between ~ \$.75 and \$1.15 per square foot
- Supply decreasing region-wide



Alternative: Status Quo

- Continue Ad Hoc contracting for space
- and contracting with third parties search for month to month training options Continue constant and burdensome
- Jeopardize all service and safety schedule improvements through missing hiring
- Jeopardize future service increases and **Improvements**



Summary

Approval of the Resolution authorizing the San Francisco including: Agreement with Tanforan Industrial Park, LLC for 30 Tanforan Municipal Transportation Agency to execute an Industrial Lease Avenue, South San Francisco will result in significant benefits

- Ensures continued improvements in service quality and safety
- Ensures consistent year round access to a new Transit Operator training site for 9.5 years with ownership potential
- Prepares San Francisco for current and future service demands, growth, and operator attrition
- system up for success by investing in critical SFMTA assets, Setting our Transit Operators and overall transportation its employees and resources
