[Jerry Garcia Commemorative Plaques - Mission Street at Harrington and Amazon Streets]

Ordinance commemorating the Mission Street sidewalk in two locations near Harrington Street and near Amazon Street under Public Works Code Sections 789 et seq., the Commemorative Street Plaque Ordinance, in honor of the childhood homes of Jerry Garcia, waiving permit and inspection fees for plaque installation, and directing official acts in furtherance of this Ordinance.

Existing Law

The San Francisco Public Works Code allows commemorative plaques to be placed on public streets after public hearings by the Public Works Department and the Board of Supervisors, as well as consultation with the Art Commission. There are certain permit and inspection fees associated with the application and approval of these plaques.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed legislation indicates the Board of Supervisors' intent to approval street plaques on Mission Street, near Harrington Street and Amazon Street, following approval by the Public Works Department and the Art Commission. The legislation also waives all permit and inspection fees associated with these proposed plaques. The proposed legislation does not amend the Municipal Code.
