



### **Contract to Replace Parking Access and Revenue Control System (PARCS)**

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) proposes to enter into a contract to replace the PARCS (Parking Access and Revenue Control System) equipment at city-owned parking garages managed by the SFMTA. PARCS is a combination of hardware and software that controls the operations of a parking garage. The proposed contract would not commit SFMTA to make physical changes—such as hardware installation—to city-owned parking garages. Through the proposed contract, private vendor(s) would initially provide engineering designs for installation of PARCS hardware as well as for incidental changes to on-site electrical infrastructure. Implementation of the vendor(s) designs that could constitute changes to the physical environment would require subsequent approval by SFMTA and would undergo environmental evaluation as appropriate pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Not a project under CEQA Guidelines Sections 15060(c) because the action would not result in a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.
