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8	WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill 1102 (SB 1102) would give the State the ability
9	to collect Transit Occupancy Taxes (TOT) from online short-term rental platforms, but restrict
10	access to data that could limit the ability of local jurisdictions to enforce zoning, housing,
11	building, and life safety codes; and
12	WHEREAS, SB 1102 could constrain local jurisdictions' ability to collect TOT directly
13	from online short-term rental platforms; and
14	WHEREAS, SB 1102 could restrict local jurisdictions' ability to investigate online short-
15	term rental platforms' compliance with local regulations, including tax regulations; and
16	WHEREAS, According to the Budget and Legislative Analyst's Office, up to 75% of
17	hosts on Airbnb in San Francisco alone are out of compliance, and over 6,000 short-term
18	rentals listed on this one online hosting platform company alone are out of compliance; and
19	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco and other jurisdictions across
20	California must have effective local oversight of the short term rental industry in order to
21	prevent it from exacerbating the State's housing crisis; and
22	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco expects the State of California to
23	assist and not thwart local jurisdictions' efforts to ensure that short term rental corporations
24	comply with the law; now, therefore, be it
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1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the State Legislature to oppose
2	California State Senate Bill 1102.
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
