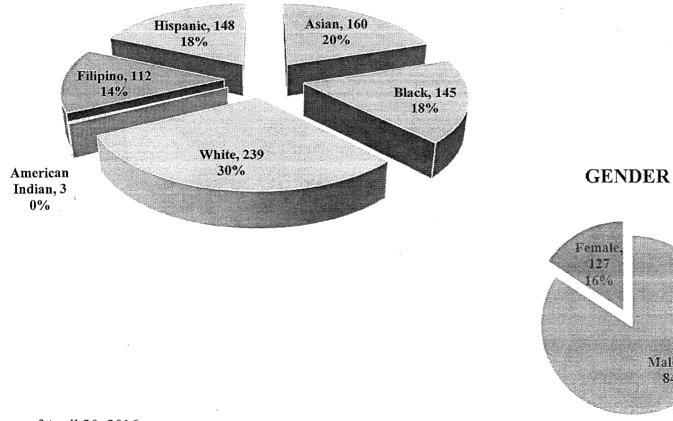
- Department Hiring Plans:

Male, 680 84%

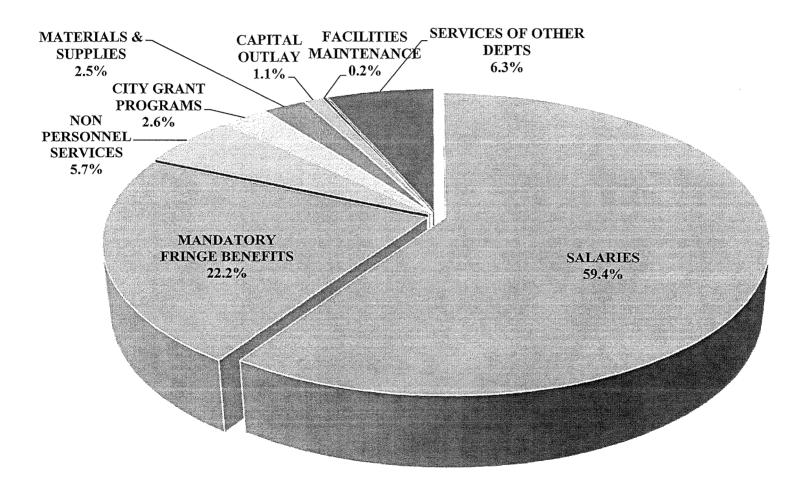
ETHNICITY



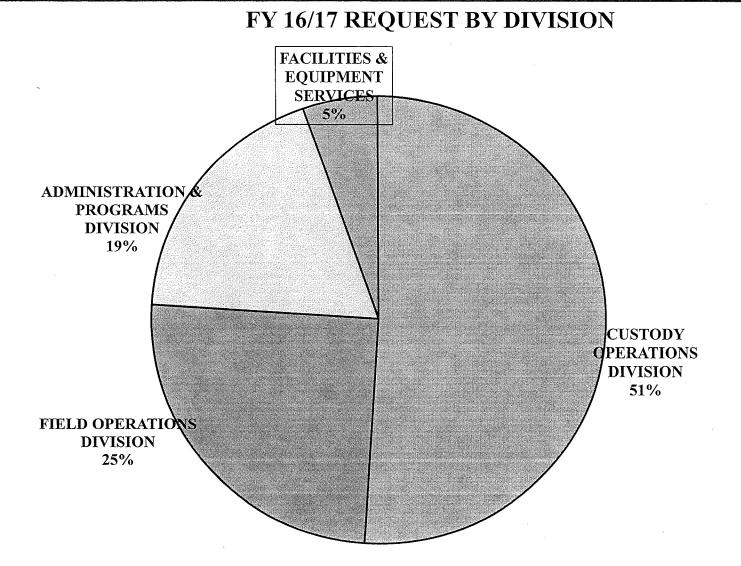

FY 16/17 BUDGET REQUEST - EXPENDITURES







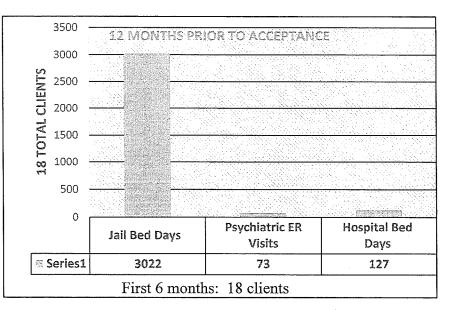

Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction

Provides transitional housing and peer specialist support through a collaboration with communitybased agencies designed to reduce recidivism and to increase public safety.

- Eligibility for participation determined by the Misdemeanor Behavioral Health Court
- Engage offenders with mental illness in treatment with supportive housing and peer support



Byrne Anti-Drug: Therapist responsible for providing treatment and community linkage and trauma assessment prior to release from custody.

Federal Byrne JAG: Care coordinator for in-custody programs, specifically, ROADs and SISTERs.
