Dear Mr. Evans:

Thank you for informing me of the forthcoming meeting of the Rules Committee, Board of Supervisors, on May 26, 2016, on behalf of Mark Farrell, Supervisor, District 2.

Unfortunately, as I told you, I will be on a long planned vacation to visit family on the East Coast from May 20-June 4. You've suggested I prepare a statement on why I would like to continue as Mark Farrell's representative on the Advisory Council to the Commission on Aging, and I've done so below. You also wanted me to include a bit on my background.

I spent most of my career as Adjunct Professor of Social and Behavioral Sciences at University of California, San Francisco (UCSF.) There I did research, published, and presented at professional meetings in the areas of community based services for the elderly, and mental health and aging. I also worked in evaluation research at the first two On Lok demonstration projects and at other community programs. When I retired, almost 20 years ago, I became more active on the boards of community organizations and was President twice of the Community Living Campaign. I served on the DAAS Transitions Committee (transitions from hospital to home were also an academic interest of mine.)

Since my original appointment to the Advisory Council to the Commission on Aging, I've written reports on characteristics of seniors in District 2; on churches in several zip codes, some of which provide informal meal services to seniors; and made visits to nutrition programs for seniors, part of an Advisory Council member's duties. Working for the Advisory Council itself, I headed the By-Laws update and revision committee. I attend regularly and actively participate in our discussions and decision-making. I'm currently Vice-President of the Advisory Council, working with President Leon Schmidt.

I'd like to work in the future as an Advisory Council liaison and member of the Oversight and Advisory Committee for the Dignity Fund, should this pass as a Charter Amendment next November. I feel strongly about the rightness of this amendment, which will not require tax increases; and will provide for seniors and people with disabilities above the Medi-Cal income limit. I continue to be interested in mental health and aging issues, and am delighted that DAAS and UCSF will work together in this area. I would continue to participate actively in Advisory Council meetings if reappointed. Advising the Commission on Aging in its oversight of DAAS, which provides so many outstanding programs for seniors and people with disabilities, is not easy; there is a lot of information Council members have to master and keep current. I (and we) work hard at this.

I was born April 8, 1935 in New York, New York. I have lived about 54 years in San Francisco with my husband Lawrence Lurie M.D., a psychiatrist also interested in issues of aging and active in community organizations. We have lived in our Richmond District-north of Lake Street home over 42 years. We have two adult children. No grandchildren to enjoy or distract us.

Please feel free to contact me if you want more information. I'm available by phone and email during my vacation.

My apologies again for being away during the Rules Committee meeting, but we made our reservations for the family wedding and get-togethers some months ago.

Thanks again for considering my appointment as Supervisor Farrell's representative on the Advisory Council to the Commission on Aging.

Board Qualifications:

The Advisory Council is not to exceed 22 members (voting members), 11 of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 11 members appointed by the Commission on the Aging. More than 50% of each group of 11 members shall be persons who are 60 years of age or older. The Council shall be representative of the geographic and ethnic populations of the City and County of San Francisco by districts determined by the Commission. The Council shall include service providers, older persons with the greatest socio and economic need, consumers, and others specified by federal regulation.

The Advisory Council members shall be appointed to serve two-year terms. When vacancies occur due to resignation or other causes, they shall be filled by the appointment of a person to fill the unexpired portion of the term by the Commission or corresponding Supervisor.

The Advisory Council shall advise the Commission on the Aging on all matters relating to the development and administration of its area plan and the operations conducted thereunder, including needs assessment, priorities, programs, and budgets, and such other matters relating to the well-being of all senior citizens 60 years of age and older within the scope and spirit of Federal, State and local regulations, laws and ordinances. The Advisory Council member shall be responsible for representing the needs and concerns of all senior citizens in the City and County of San Francisco, duties of which are outlined in the Bylaws.
