MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby submits the following ordinance to the voters of the City and County of San Francisco, at an election to be held on November 8, 2016.

Ordinance amending the Environment Code to extend the Solar Incentive Program through June 30, 2029, and urging the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to continue to fund the program and to integrate it with CleanPowerSF, San Francisco's Community Choice Aggregation program.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Environment Code is hereby amended by adding Section 18.8., to read as follows:

Supervisor Breed BOARD OF SUPERVISORS The solar incentive program described in Chapter 18, Sections 18.1 to 18.6, shall remain in place through June 30, 2029, and the People of the City and County of San Francisco urge the SFPUC to continue to fund this program and to integrate it with CleanPowerSF. San Francisco's Community Choice Aggregation program.

Section 2. Authority of the Board of Supervisors. In enacting this ordinance, the People of the City and County of San Francisco do not intend to preempt the adoption of other ordinances by the Board of Supervisors that are substantively related. Further, the People of the City and County of San Francisco authorize the Board of Supervisors to amend this ordinance through the normal legislative process.

Existing Law

Environment Code Chapter 18 creates a Solar Incentive Program and provides that the SFPUC intends to fund the program through fiscal year 2018-2019 at a level \$2 million to \$5 million annually.

Amendments to Current Law

The Initiative Ordinance would extend the Solar Incentive Program through June 30, 2029 and urges the SFPUC to continue to fund the program and to integrate it with CleanPowerSF, San Francisco's Community Choice Aggregation program.
