11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
12	
13	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by renumbering Sections 5.20
14	and 5.21 as Sections 5.4-1 and 5.4-2, respectively, revising those sections, and adding
15	Section 5.4-3, to read as follows:
16	SEC. $5.205.4-1$. FINDINGS; ESTABLISHMENT AND ORGANIZATION.
17	* * * *
18	(b) There shall be established a Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee. This
19	Advisory Committee, composed of concerned and informed residents, will provide a source of
20	expertise on issues concerning pedestrian safety, convenience, ambiance, and planning. The
21	Advisory Committee shall consist of 23 17 voting members appointed as set forth below.
22	(1) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint 21 members from the following
23	categories:
24	(a1) <u>Seat 1 shall be held by a Two</u> representatives from <u>a pedestrian safety</u>
25	organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.;

1	(b2) <u>Seats 2 and 3 shall be held by Two</u> representatives from senior or disability
2	organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.;
3	(e3) Seat 4 shall be held by a One representatives from a bicycle or other non-
4	motorized wheeled personal transport organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors;
5	$(\frac{d4}{2})$ <u>Seat 5 shall be held by a One</u> representatives from <u>a</u> transit or environmenta
6	organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.;
7	(e) One representatives from child advocate or school support organizations;

10	(h5) <u>Seats 6 through 16 shall be</u> <u>Eleven persons</u> appointed by individual members
11	of the Board of Supervisors., with each Each member of the Board shall appointing one member
12	of the Advisory Committee. a representative who resides in his or her district.
13	(26) Seat 17 shall be held by a parent of a student in the San Francisco Unified
14	School District, appointed by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District.
15	Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent.
16	If at any time the Superintendent declines to appoint an individual to Seat 17 for 60 days or longer, the
17	Board of Supervisors may appoint a new member with the same or different qualifications to fill the
18	seat for the remainder of the term.
19	(c) The Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint a member
20	of the San Francisco Unified School District's Student Advisory Council to serve as a non-voting
21	member of the Advisory Committee. The individual appointed to this seat may participate in Advisory
22	Committee discussions to the same extent as other members of the Advisory Committee but may not
23	vote on any matter and shall not be counted toward a quorum.
24	(\underline{ed}) In addition to the (23) voting members, $\underline{t}\underline{T}$ he following City departments shall \underline{select}
25	and send designate a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings at the

1	request of the Advisory Committee: the Department of Public Health, the Municipal
2	Transportation Agency, the Department of Public Works, the Planning Department, the Police
3	Department, the Recreation and Parks Department, District Attorney's Office, and the Mayor's
4	Office on Disability, and aAny other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians shall
5	also designate a non-voting representative to Advisory Committee meetings upon request of the
6	Advisory Committee. Every year by July 1, each department required to designate a non-voting
7	representative shall inform the Advisory Committee in writing of the name, work phone number, and
8	work email address of its representative.

- (e) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the Advisory Committee in conducting its business. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, San Francisco Unified School District, the <u>Successor Agency to the San Francisco</u> Redevelopment Agency, and the <u>Golden Gate</u> National Park Service assist in the work of the Advisory Committee.
- authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation of law upon the issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee. Any Advisory Committee member who misses three regular meetings of the Advisory Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Advisory Committee at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Advisory Committee 10 days after the third unapproved absence. The Advisory Committee shall inform the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of each such resignation, and the appointing authority shall appoint a successor to that seat.
- (eg) The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years._; provided, however, that the member initially appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that half of the

1	members will serve a one year term and half will serve a two year term. In the event a vacancy occurs
2	during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term
3	of office vacated. The seats formerly numbered 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 23 shall terminate on the effective
4	date of the ordinance in Board File No. 160964 amending this Article IV. The terms for all other seats
5	on the Advisory Committee shall continue following the effective date of that ordinance, and the
6	members holding those seats may continue to hold the renumbered seats until the expiration of the term
7	as provided in this subsection (g) unless removed by the appointing authority. The terms for seats 1, 3,
8	5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, and 17 shall expire on March 31, 2018, and every two years thereafter. The terms
9	for seats 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 shall expire on March 31, 2019, and every two years thereafter.
10	(fh) At the initial meeting of the Advisory Committee, and annually thereafter, the
11	members of the Advisory Committee shall select a Chair, and any other officers as deemed
12	necessary by the Advisory Committee.
13	$(\underline{g_i})$ The Advisory Committee shall establish rules for its own organization and
14	procedures and shall meet when necessary as determined by the Advisory Committee. All
15	meetings shall, except as provided by law, be open to the public.
16	(hj) The Board of Supervisors urges the Municipal Transportation Agency to support
17	the Advisory Committee with funding and staff resources and to present a monthly
18	interdepartmental report to the Advisory Committee.

20	SEC. 5.215.4-2. DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.
21	(a) The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to:
22	(1) Create subcommittees as necessary;
23	—————Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City
24	departments, commissions, boards and agencies in order to improve pedestrian safety and
25	ambiance;

1	(\underline{z}) Develop concepts and review policies and planning ellons regarding
2	pedestrian improvements including, but not limited to, issues of safety, traffic calming,
3	education, and sidewalk and crosswalk treatments;
4	$(\underline{34})$ Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities to the
5	Board of Supervisors, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Citizens Advisory Committee
6	of the <u>County</u> Transportation Authority, and other <u>City</u> departments, commissions, boards, and
7	agencies;
8	$(\underline{45})$ Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to
9	pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the Master General Plan of the City and County of
10	San Francisco, and make recommendations on the goals and their implementation to the
11	Planning Commission;
12	$(\underline{56})$ Report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly
13	appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrian injury
14	and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for
15	changes in policies, funding, and enforcement, and other pertinent issues; and
16	$(\underline{67})$ Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan, in conjunction with
17	City agencies and community input, which will offer a comprehensive review of the policies,
18	procedures, practices, and physical infrastructure of the City that affect pedestrians, and will
19	also provide recommendations to make walking safer and more convenient through sidewalk
20	improvements, new City policies, educational programs, promotional efforts, and transit
21	access.

23	<u>SEC. 5.4-3. SUNSET.</u>
24	Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Advisory Committee, this

Article IV shall expire by operation of law, and the Advisory Committee shall terminate, on October 1,

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1	2019. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the Administrative
2	<u>Code.</u>
3	
4	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
5	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
6	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
7	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
8	
9	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
10	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
11	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
12	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
13	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
14	the official title of the ordinance.
