11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
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13	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by renumbering Sections
14	5.130, 5.131, and 5.132 as Sections 5.14-1, 5.14-2, and 5.14-3 respectively, revising those
15	sections, and adding Section 5.14-4, to read as follows:
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17	ARTICLE XIV:
18	BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE
19	SEC. 5.1305.14-1. BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED.
20	(a) There shall be established a Bicycle Advisory Committee (hereinafter "Advisory
21	Committee") of the City and County of San Francisco. This Advisory Committee, composed
22	of concerned and informed residents, will provide the best single source of expertise and
23	perspective for transportation planners. Effective planning is the key to reducing reliance on
24	automobiles, and, in turn, the ultimate solution to the broad environmental crisis we presently
25	face.

1	(b) The Advisory Committee shall consist of 11 voting members appointed by the
2	Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one person
3	for appointment to the Advisory Committee, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors.
4	The Advisory Committee shall provide information to the Board of Supervisors on the diversity
5	of the Advisory Committee with regard to the age, ethnicity, gender, disability, and sexual
6	orientation of its members.

(c) In addition to the 11 voting members, tThe following City departments will shall each designate provide a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings at the request of the Advisory Committee: the Police Department, the Department of Public Works, the Municipal Transportation Agency, and the *Department of City* Planning *Department*. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the San Francisco Unified School District and the Golden Gate National Recreation Area each designate a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings upon request of the Advisory Committee be asked to send a non-voting representative to the Advisory Committee.

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SEC. 5.1315.14-2. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

- (a) Each member of the Advisory Committee shall serve for a term that ends two years from the date of appointment, or the last day of the term of the sSupervisor who nominated the member, whichever is sooner, provided:
- (1) The Board of Supervisors may remove any member of the Advisory Committee for cause at any time; and
- (2) The Board of Supervisors may remove any member of the Advisory Committee without cause at any time upon request of the &Supervisor who nominated the member whose removal is sought.

1	(b) At the initial meeting of the Advisory Committee, and yearly thereafter, the
2	Advisory Committee members shall select such officers as deemed necessary by the
3	Advisory Committee.
4	(c) The Advisory Committee shall establish rules and regulations for its own
5	organization and procedures and shall meet at least once every four months when necessary as
6	determined by the Advisory Committee. All meetings shall, except as provided by law, be open to
7	the public.
8	(d) The Board of Supervisors urges the Municipal Transportation Agency to provide
9	administrative support to the Advisory Committee.
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11	SEC. <u>5.132</u> <u>5.14-3</u> . POWERS AND DUTIES.
12	The Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to:
13	(a) Set up subcommittees as necessary;
14	(b) Develop a plan for bicycle-related improvements, including but not limited to
15	bicycle routes, secure parking, and transit interface, and make recommendations to the
16	Municipal Transportation Agency, the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, and the
17	Board of Supervisors on related funding from local, State and Federal agencies, including, but
18	not limited to Transportation Development Act funds and San Francisco County
19	Transportation Authority funds;
20	$(\underline{b}e)$ Review the policies and programs related to bicycling in the Transportation
21	Element of the Master General Plan of the City and County of San Francisco, and make
22	recommendations on the goals and their implementation to the Planning <u>Department and</u>
23	Planning Commission of the City and County of San Francisco; and
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1	(\underline{cd}) Develop a plan for outreach to, and education of, the public to promote the safe
2	sharing of public roadways, and submit the plan to the Municipal Transportation Agency and
3	the San Francisco County Transportation Authority.
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5	<u>SEC. 5.14-4. SUNSET.</u>
6	Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Advisory Committee, this
7	Article XIV shall expire by operation of law, and the Advisory Committee shall terminate, on December
8	31, 2019. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the
9	Administrative Code.
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11	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
12	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
13	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
14	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
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16	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
17	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
18	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
19	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
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1	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
2	the official title of the ordinance.
