My first job as an organizer was at an organization based in Skid Row, Los Angeles. Serving the homeless population was a formative experience for me. The perspective I gained on how to represent and empower marginalized populations has remained with me and continues to guide my work. Now a bicycle advocate, my focus on equity has only grown stronger. Professionally much of my work is focused on San Francisco's Communities of Concern. Mobility and street safety issues disproportionately affect San Francisco's lower income residents and I strive to shrink that gap. On a personal level, riding with my younger LGBTQ sister has opened my eyes to the challenges that exist for different street users. That perspective has been extremely valuable to me and would guide my work on the BAC.

Business and/or professional experience:

My professional experience in bicycle and transportation policy extends back to my time as a student at Occidental College. With limited transportation options on campus, I saw the need for and created a full service bike share program. Over my four years, I grew the program to a fully funded operation, managing ten student employees and a fleet of 35 bicycles. After school, I continued my work with bicycle programs at the SF Department of Environment. As an intern, I worked with the SFMTA and Real Estate Division to develop a reworking of the City's internal bike share program, CityCycle. Now at the SF Bicycle Coalition, I work directly with city agencies and our constituency to organize around infrastructure projects and push them to completion. I also manage a contract with the SFMTA to site sidewalk bicycle parking city wide. My work has given me an accurate sense of how bicycle projects come to fruition in SF as well as how to mobilize SF residents to ensure that these projects meet their needs.

Civic Activities:

As an experienced bicycle mechanic, I volunteer at community bike builds around the City. At these builds we repair and donate bicycles to residents of the community. Most recently, I have volunteered at the Central City SRO in the Tenderloin, and George Washington Carver Elementary School in the Bayview.

I am politically engaged in SF, donating my time and money to local campaigns. I have phone-banked and door knocked for candidates both here in SF and as a student in LA. My interest in local politics leads me to various political events such as candidate forums and rallies. I also try my best attend my neighborhood HOA meetings for updates on local housing developments and police reports.

Board Qualifications:

The Bicycle Advisory Committee shall consist of a total of 17 members, 11 of whom are voting members. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one (1) member for appointment by the full Board of Supervisors.

In addition to the 11 voting members, the following City departments will each provide a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings: 1) Police Department, 2) Department of Public Works, 3) Municipal Transportation Agency, and 4) Department of City Planning. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the 1) San Francisco Unified School District and the 2) Golden Gate National Recreation Area each be asked to send a non-voting representative to the Advisory Committee.

This Advisory Committee will be composed of concerned and informed residents and will provide the best single source of expertise and perspective for transportation planners.

The term of each member of the Advisory Committee shall be two years or for the tenure of the supervisor who nominated the member, whichever is shorter in duration.

The Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to: a) set up subcommittees as necessary; b) develop a plan for bicycle-related improvements, including but not limited to bicycle routes, secure parking, and transit interface, and make recommendations to the

Municipal Transportation Agency, the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, and the Board of Supervisors on related funding from local, State and Federal agencies, including, but not limited to Transportation Development Act funds and San Francisco County Transportation Authority funds; c) review the policies and programs related to bicycling in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco, and make recommendations on the goals and their implementation to the Planning Commission of the City and County of San Francisco; and d) develop a plan for outreach to, and education of, the public to promote the safe sharing of public roadways, and submit the plan to the Municipal Transportation Agency and the San Francisco County Transportation Authority.
