Board Qualifications:

The Workforce Community Advisory Committee ("Advisory Committee") shall consist of eight (8) members, who shall serve in an advisory capacity to Workforce Investment San Francisco ("WISF") and the Committee on City Workforce Alignment ("Alignment Committee") on workforce development system priorities, client needs, and services.

Board of Supervisors shall appoint four (4) members, and the Mayor shall appoint four (4) members to the Advisory Committee. All members must, at the time of their appointment, employed by a nonprofit corporation that provides workforce development services and must be the executive director or chief executive officer, or an employee of the nonprofit corporation designated by such person. All Advisory Committee members shall have demonstrated experience in leadership roles in workforce development, as well as expertise (preferably at federal, state, and local levels) in workforce development policy and systems.

Additional Considerations: In appointing members, special attention shall be given to ensure that representation is aligned with the priority sectors of the local economy and that persons with expertise serving transitional age youth, homeless individuals, and re-entry populations are represented. The Reentry Council, Local Homeless Coordinating Board, and Transitional-Aged Youth Executive Directors Network may make recommendation to the Board and Mayor regarding appointments to the Advisory Committee.

Advisory Committee members shall serve for two-year terms. The Advisory Committee shall
