The Reentry Council, Local Homeless Coordinating Board, and Transitional-Aged Youth Executive Directors Network may make recommendation to the Board and Mayor regarding appointments to the Advisory Committee.

Advisory Committee members shall serve for two-year terms. The Advisory Committee shall
