Seats 2 and 3 shall be held by Two representatives from senior or disability (#2) organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

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(e<u>3</u>) <u>Seat 4 shall be held by a One representatives from a bicycle or other non-</u> motorized wheeled personal transport organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors;

Seat 5 shall be held by a One representatives from a transit or environmental (d4)organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.;

One representatives from child advocate or school support organizations:

Seats 6 through 16 shall be Eleven persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors, with each Each member of the Board shall appointing one member

Seat 17 shall be held by a parent of a student in the San Francisco Unified School District, appointed by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District. Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent. If at any time the Superintendent declines to appoint an individual to Seat 17 for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a new member with the same or different qualifications to fill the

The Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint a member of the San Francisco Unified School District's Student Advisory Council to serve as a non-voting member of the Advisory Committee. The individual appointed to this seat may participate in Advisory Committee discussions to the same extent as other members of the Advisory Committee but may not

In addition to the (23) voting members, tThe following City departments shall select and send designate a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings at the

<u>request of the Advisory Committee</u>: the Department of Public Health, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Department of Public Works, the Planning Department, the Police Department, the Recreation and Parks Department, District Attorney's Office, <u>and</u> the Mayor's Office on Disability., <u>and aA</u>ny other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians <u>shall</u> <u>also designate a non-voting representative to Advisory Committee meetings upon request of the</u> <u>Advisory Committee</u>. <u>Every year by July 1</u>, <u>each department required to designate a non-voting</u> <u>representative shall inform the Advisory Committee in writing of the name, work phone number, and</u> <u>work email address of its representative.</u>

(e) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the Advisory Committee in conducting its business. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, San Francisco Unified School District, the <u>Successor Agency to the San Francisco</u> Redevelopment Agency, and the <u>Golden Gate</u> National Park Service assist in the work of the Advisory Committee.

(4) Advisory Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation of law upon the issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee: Any Advisory Committee member who misses three regular meetings of the Advisory Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Advisory Committee at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Advisory Committee 10 days after the third unapproved absence. The Advisory Committee shall inform the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of each such resignation, and the appointing authority shall appoint a successor to that seat.

(eg) The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years. ; provided,
however, that the member initially appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that half of the

members will serve a one year term and half will serve a two year term. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term of office vacated. The seats formerly numbered 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 23 shall terminate on the effective date of the ordinance in Board File No. 160964 amending this Article IV. The terms for all other seats on the Advisory Committee shall continue following the effective date of that ordinance, and the members holding those seats may continue to hold the renumbered seats until the expiration of the term as provided in this subsection (g) unless removed by the appointing authority. The terms for seats 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, and 17 shall expire on March 31, 2018, and every two years thereafter. The terms for seats 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 shall expire on March 31, 2019, and every two years thereafter.

 (\underline{fh}) At the initial meeting of the Advisory Committee, and annually thereafter, the members of the Advisory Committee shall select a Chair, and any other officers as deemed necessary by the Advisory Committee.

(<u>gi</u>) The Advisory Committee shall establish rules for its own organization and procedures and shall meet when necessary as determined by the Advisory Committee. All meetings shall, except as provided by law, be open to the public.

(*hi*) The Board of Supervisors urges the Municipal Transportation Agency to support
the Advisory Committee with funding and staff resources and to present a monthly
interdepartmental report to the Advisory Committee.

SEC. 5.215.4-2. DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.

(a) The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to:

(1) *Create subcommittees as necessary;*

---------Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City departments, commissions, boards and agencies in order to improve pedestrian safety and ambiance;

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(23) Develop concepts and review policies and planning efforts regarding pedestrian improvements including, but not limited to, issues of safety, traffic calming, education, and sidewalk and crosswalk treatments;

(<u>3</u>4) Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities to the Board of Supervisors, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Citizens Advisory Committee of the <u>County</u> Transportation Authority, and other <u>City</u> departments, commissions, boards, and agencies;

(<u>4</u>5) Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the *Master* <u>General</u> Plan of the City and County of San Francisco, and make recommendations on the goals and their implementation to the Planning Commission;

(<u>56</u>) Report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrian injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding, and enforcement, and other pertinent issues; <u>and</u>

(<u>6</u>?) Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan, in conjunction with City agencies and community input, which will offer a comprehensive review of the policies, procedures, practices, and physical infrastructure of the City that affect pedestrians, and will also provide recommendations to make walking safer and more convenient through sidewalk improvements, new City policies, educational programs, promotional efforts, and transit access.

SEC. 5.4-3. SUNSET.

<u>Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Advisory Committee, this</u> <u>Article IV shall expire by operation of law, and the Advisory Committee shall terminate, on October 1,</u>

2019. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the Administrative Code.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to change the membership requirements for the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee and to establish a sunset date for the Advisory Committee.

Existing Law

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee provides advice to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and other City agencies regarding issues related to pedestrian safety. The Committee currently has 23 voting members.

The Committee has no sunset date on which it will terminate.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would change the composition of the Committee by removing six of the 23 seats—one that currently must be held by a representative from a pedestrian safety organization; one that currently must be held by a representative from child advocate or school support organizations; one that currently must be held by a representative from child advocate or public health organization; two current at-large seats; and one seat currently appointed by the Superintendent of Schools. The Committee would have 17 remaining seats. Committee members would serve staggered two-year terms. Nine of the terms would expire in 2018 and every two years thereafter, and the other eight would expire in 2019 and every two years thereafter.

Consistent with the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order and standard practice for advisory bodies, the Committee would sunset on October 1, 2019 unless the Board of Supervisors enacts a subsequent ordinance extending the Committee.
