

My name is Zachary Townsend and thank you for considering my application to San Francisco's Public Utilities Revenue Bond Oversight Committee.

Just last Thursday I reached out to Derek Evans about the open positions on the PUC-RBOC, having just seen the openig on the Rules Committee's website. He informed me I needed to get the application in that day because of the scheduled hearing for a week later. I did get my application in but it turns out I am unable to attend the hearing. Derek suggested I send you this written letter as testimony to be entered in to the record.

I am sorry that I will not be to attend but I hope you would still consider my application to the PUC-RBOC.

Earlier this year, Governor Brown appointed me the inaugural Chief Data Officer of the State of California, where I am creating a more effective and transparent state government. I have a meeting on Thursday morning in Sacramento regarding our open data initiatives and specifically the implementation of AB1755, The Open and Transparent Water Data Act, which requires more data transparency from various state departments in California that have jurisdiction over water. Despite my best efforts to move this meeting, I am unable to do so.

For a little background on me, I'm a resident of the Castro neighborhood. I have lived there in the same apartment for nearly four years. Although I'm relatively new to San Francisco, it has become my home. I met my future partner here and we're getting married near City Hall next May. I hope to raise my children here in the City and live here the rest of my life.

I've become active in the life of the city over my time living here. I am a member of the board of the Eureka Valley Neighborhood Association, where I participate in the life of my local community. I am also a a board member at Alternative

Family Services, which is a foster, children's mental health, and adoption care agency that provides services in San Francisco and other Bay Area counties. I have found a lot of joy in my service to these organizations.

Allow me to give you a brief version of my professional background. Before serving as the state's CDO, I built a financial technology company that was focused on building low-cost financial infrastructure for the unbanked and underbanked. I also studied financial management and public finance when I was an MPA student at New York University's Wagner School of Public Service. I attended that program part-time while working for Newark, NJ Cory Booker as Senior Technology Policy Adviser. I'm knowledgeable in economics and financial management, have a background in project management, and have personal interest in built infrastructure.

I'm passionate about the Public Utilities Revenue Bond Oversight Committee and would love to serve San Francisco and its citizen's on the board. To me the committee isn't merely dollars and cents, it's good government: making sure that money is effectively stewarded toward the designated projects. If I were appointed, I have several goals:

- 1. first and most importantly, to provide oversight to the monies being spent on Water System Improvement Program (WSIP) and Sewer System Improvement Program (SSIP) –including the over 15 revenue bonds for those purposes;
- 2. to focus on getting more quantitative (data) measures around the historic and current accuracy of budgeting and scheduling forecasts;

Board Qualifications:

The Public Utilities Revenue Bond Oversight Committee is comprised of seven members, two appointed by the Board of Supervisors; two by the Mayor; one member by the Controller; and one member by the governing body of the Bay Area Water Users Association. The seventh member shall be the Budget Analyst for the Board or his/her representative.

At a minimum, the members appointed by the Mayor and the Board shall, individually or collectively, have expertise, skills and experience in economics, the environment, construction and project management. The member appointed by the Controller shall have background and experience in auditing, accounting and project finance.

Except as authorized herein, no current officer or employee of the City shall be appointed to the Committee. All members of the Committee shall be subject to applicable conflict of interest provisions of local and state law. No vendor, contractor or consultant of the City that performs work funded by bonds issued by the City shall be appointed to the Committee.

Each committee member will serve for no more than two consecutive terms. Upon their initial appointment, three members of the Committee shall be assigned by lot an initial term of two years and the remaining four members shall have an initial term of four years. Thereafter each committee member shall serve a four-year term.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Committee shall report to the Board, Mayor and PUC regarding the expenditure of revenue bond proceeds on the repair, replacement, upgrading and expansion of the City's water collection, power generation, water distribution and wastewater treatment facilities.

Reports: The Committee shall issue a report at least once a year.

Compensation: \$100.00 per month to each member with the exception of City employees appointed to serve as part of their official City duties and the Budget Analyst or employees of the Budget analyst.

Sunset Clause: January 1, 2019.
