[Urging that the San Francisco Police Chief Reside in the City and County of San Francisco]

Resolution urging the Police Commission and the Mayor to require the Police Chief reside within the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Department previously implemented a residency requirement until the mid-1980's; and

WHEREAS, This residency requirement was removed due to challenges in recruiting a diverse workforce; and

WHEREAS, As of 2015, only 27% of the San Francisco Police Department's sworn officers resided in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, President Obama's 21st Century Policing Report included a recommendation that law enforcement agencies institute incentive programs to allow public safety officers to reside in the neighborhoods they serve; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco public would require expedient service from the Police Chief and police officers in the event of an emergency; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Commission conducted a national search for a new Police Chief that indicated the preference for a San Francisco resident, but did not include a residency requirement; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Commission and the Mayor will be finalizing the search for the new Police Chief in the coming weeks; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco

Police Commission and the Mayor to require the new Police Chief to reside within the City and

County of San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the City to offer resources to support the Police Chief in residing in the City and County of San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors extend its support in offering more incentives and resources to enable more sworn officers to reside in the City and County of San Francisco.
