Resolution authorizing the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$20,790,000 from the California Public Utilities Commission, through Pacific Gas and Electric Company, to continue an Energy Use and Demand Reduction Through Energy Efficiency Program in the City and County of San Francisco for the term of January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2019.

[Accept and Expend Grant - California Public Utilities Commission - Energy Efficiency

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code, Section 381 requires electrical companies to collect a surcharge on all retail sales, called "the Public Goods Charge," and turn that money over to the California Public Utilities Commission ("the CPUC"); and

WHEREAS, Section 381 authorizes the CPUC to allocate that money to fund programs that enhance system reliability and provide in-state benefits, including cost-effective energy efficiency, renewable energy technologies, and public interest research; and

WHEREAS, The City, through the Department of the Environment, and the Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") have, since 2003, entered into a series of contracts and contract modifications to conduct energy efficiency programs in the City using Public Goods Charge funds allocated for this purpose by the CPUC through PG&E; and

WHEREAS, PG&E has declared its intention to fund program activities for the calendar years 2017 through 2019 in the amount of \$20,790,000; and

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment has negotiated a new revenue contract with PG&E ("the Contract"); and

WHEREAS, In Resolution No. 481-09, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Director of the Department of the Environment pursuant to Charter Section 9.118 to enter into the Contract; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO) amendment and partially reimburses the Department of the Environment for 14.9 existing positions; and

WHEREAS, The term of this grant is from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, The budget includes indirect costs of \$2,926,614; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That pursuant to Administrative Code section 10.170-1, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant in the amount of up to \$20,790,000 from California Public Utilities Commission, through the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, to effectuate the Contract and implement an Energy Use and Demand Reduction Through Energy Efficiency Program in the City and County of San Francisco.



Dear Ms. Rafael,

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) intends to provide the San Francisco Department of the Environment (SF Environment) up to \$20,790,000 in program funding to implement the San Francisco Energy Watch (SFEW) Local Government Partnership in 2017-2019. Such funding provided by PG&E for any energy efficiency programs, including but not limited to SFEW, shall be conditioned upon and subject to any modifications or guidance by the California Public Utilities Commission.

This funding will be used to support the following activities:

- Marketing and implementation of SFEW energy efficiency direct install programs, including incentives for energy efficiency measures targeting businesses and multifamily customers
- Completing existing Strategic Energy Resource initiatives, such as microloan funds, building analysis projects, and maintenance outreach for the food and beverage sector, as well as implementing new Strategic Energy Resource initiatives.

PG&E will work with SF Environment to finalize the scope of work and terms and conditions, and execute the final 2017-2019 SFEW contract before end of this year.

Resolution authorizing the Department of the Environment under Charter Section 9.118 to enter into a contract for up to \$11,540,000 with Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E"), to implement an Energy Use and Demand Reduction Through Energy

[Revenue Contract with PG&E for Energy Conservation Programs.]

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code Section 381 requires electrical companies to collect a surcharge on all retail sales, called "the Public Goods Charge," and turn that money over to the California Public Utilities Commission ("the CPUC"); and

WHEREAS, Section 381 authorizes the CPUC to allocate that money to fund programs that enhance system reliability and provide in-state benefits, including cost-effective energy efficiency, renewable energy technologies, and public interest research; and

WHEREAS, The City, through the Department of the Environment, and the Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") have, since 2003, entered into a series of contracts and contract modifications to conduct energy efficiency programs in the City using Public Goods Charge funds allocated for this purpose by the CPUC through PG&E; and

WHEREAS, The CPUC, at its regular meeting of September 24, 2009 made an initial award of \$12,000,000 of Public Goods Charge revenues to fund the partnership program between PG&E and the City for additional energy efficiency programs; and

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment has negotiated a new revenue contract with PG&E ("the 2010-2012 Contract"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 091369; and

WHEREAS, The proposed Contract provides, in relevant part, that:

1

- PG&E shall fund the design and implementation of local programs to reduce energy use;
- The City shall offer a broad spectrum of energy efficiency programs and services targeting mainly small businesses and multifamily PG&E customers in San Francisco, including free energy assessments and discounted installations of energy efficient lighting, refrigeration, and HVAC means, and, on a case-bycase basis, incentives for calculated non-residential retrofit-demand response projects;
- The term of the contract shall be from 2010 through 2012;
- The contract budget shall be \$11,540,000; and
- The City may terminate the contract if the City becomes a Community Choice Aggregator.

WHEREAS, PG&E may consider adding additional funds to the contract based on program performance and the successful completion of goals; and

WHEREAS, Under the contract, the Director of the Department of the Environment will have the authority for overall implementation of the contract, to enter into subcontracts for the work, and to modify the scope of the work and to add work as agreed by PG&E; and

WHEREAS, The activities to be funded under the 2010-2012 Contract would further the goals established in the City's 2003 Electricity Resource Plan, which goals include: maximizing energy efficiency; reducing air pollution and other adverse environmental impacts; and promoting environmental justice; and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 9.118 provides that the Board of Supervisors must approve contracts, and amendments to contracts, having anticipated revenues to the City of one million dollars or more; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That pursuant to Charter Section 9.118, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of the Department of the Environment to enter into a contract in substantially the form of the 2010-2012 Contract on file in Board File No. 091369, and to take other steps that the Director and the City Attorney deem necessary and advisable to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of the Department of the Environment may, with the approval of the City Attorney, negotiate and agree with PG&E to amend the contract terms as necessary and advisable to allow flexibility in program design and implementation, provided that: (1) there is no additional cost to the City; (2) additional revenues to the City do not exceed \$3,000,000; and (3) the additional term of the agreement does not exceed three years.
