
Resolution Authorizing the Sheriff's Department to Apply for SB 844 Funding

from the

California Board of State and Community
Corrections

For Partial Renovation of
425 7th Street
County Jail #1 and County Jail #2





425 7th Street

- Opened in 1994
- Contains two jail facilities:
 - County Jail #1 Intake and release facility on first floor
 - County Jail #2 Detention facility on floors two through six
 - Current inmate capacity:

392 beds

Post-Renovation inmate capacity:

392 beds

- Originally designed and constructed as minimum security work furlough facility.
- Operated as a medium to high security detention facility.
- Deferred maintenance has resulted in deterioration of roof and HVAC system, and failure of critical security systems.
- Requires significant improvement and upgrades in all areas

Total project cost to repair and upgrade all sections without adding beds estimated at \$220M



Board of State and Community Corrections Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Grant (SB844)

- \$70 million available in Large Counties category
- San Francisco is in competition with Contra Costa, San Joaquin and San Mateo
- Award requires a 10% match; \$12 million has been identified in the General Fund Certificates of Participation program through the City's Capital Planning Program.
- Eligibility Requirements:
 - Project must be for acquisition, design, renovation or construction of an adult local correctional facility under the jurisdiction of the Sheriff
 - o Project must include space to provide onsite, in-person visitation
 - Proposal must include a description of efforts to address sexual abuse in the facility to be renovated or constructed
 - Open only to counties who have not recently received an award
- Acceptable projects may include:
 - Improved housing with an emphasis on expanding programmatic and treatment space
 - Custodial housing, reentry program, mental health, or treatment space



Project Budget Estimate

Contingencies \$20.3M

Soft Costs\$16.7M

Project Scope for Partial Upgrade & Improvement

Included within available budget of \$82,000,000:

Phase 1

- Upgrade housing pods A & D to safer standards to house and provide programs to high security inmates
 - Install 12 two-person rooms in upper mezzanine, replacing
 12 double bunks in open dormitory area
 - o Install safety and sound barriers on mezzanine level
 - Install flexible classification dividers
 - Add two two-person ADA cells in each upper mezzanine



Project Scope for Partial Upgrade & Improvement

Included within available budget of \$82,000,000:

Phase 1 - continued

- Infill one atrium to provide additional inmate program and visiting areas
- Renovate non-operational kitchen to serve CJ#1,
 CJ#2 and the Hall of Justice facilities
- Replace dilapidated and failing HVAC system and repair associated roof areas
- Perform targeted seismic structural strengthening



Not included in Phase 1 – Possible enhancements dependent on final cost of Phase 1

- Replace entire roof membrane = \$3.2M
- Bring entire facility up to ADA compliance = \$3M
- Install safety/sound barriers on mezzanine level of remaining pods B,D,E and F = \$3.7M
- Retrofit safety cells at County Jail 1 to meet current standards = \$0.63M
- Redesign and improve sightlines for mental health observation rooms and medical isolation rooms in C Pod = \$0.2M









Infrastructure Repair and Upgrades

- Replace dilapidated and failing HVAC system
- Perform targeted seismic structural strengthening
- Achieve partial code compliance for ADA and Fire/Life Safety
- Repair and replace portions of the roof due to serious water intrusion







BSCC renovation funding will result in:

- Enhanced safe and secure housing
- More flexibility for housing some higher risk inmates outside of CJ#4 – Hall of Justice
- Additional program availability
- Increased opportunities for family visits
- Essential repairs to the roof and HVAC systems
- Renovation to the kitchen that will initiate the beginning of divestment of critical services from the Hall of Justice



Considerations

- When this project begins in 2019, CJ #2 will need to be vacated for 18 to 24 months. Based on our current census, approximately 200 inmates will need to be moved to alternative housing. Possibilities include:
 - Prepare now-vacant CJ #3 at the Hall of Justice for repopulation at an estimated cost of \$3M and move the prisoners to that jail.
 - Rent space outside of San Francisco at an estimated cost of \$125 per prisoner per day, for a total of \$13.5 M for 18 months, not including transportation.



What This Project Does Not Do

- Due to a limited budget, this project does not address many of the remaining deficiencies at County Jail #2, including but not limited to:
 - A complete repair of the facility roof
 - Replacement of failing showers throughout the facility
 - Replacement of bunks to current standards
 - Replacement of room doors with access slots
 - Movement of master control room to interior of facility
 - Installation of security sally port doors



What This Project Does Not Do:

- This project does not fully divest 425 7th Street from dependence on critical infrastructure and systems provided by the Hall of Justice.
 - Data Lines
 - Steam lines
 - Natural Gas Lines
 - Emergency Generator
 - Loading Dock
 - Storage Freezer
 - Loading Dock
 - Supply Storage
 - Inmate Court Transport Holding



What This Project Does Not Do:

It does not permanently close County Jail 3 and 4


