6	WHEREAS, San Francisco has a long history supporting documented and
7	undocumented immigrants, being one of the first jurisdictions nationwide to declare itself a
8	sanctuary city in 1989; and
9	WHEREAS, According to the Pew Research Center, at least 35,000 undocumented
10	immigrants live in San Francisco and over 500,000 live in the greater Bay Area; and
11	WHEREAS, Many of these undocumented members of our community rely on public
12	transportation, including Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART), to get to work, to school, and to run
13	daily errands; and
14	WHEREAS, A basic premise of San Francisco's Sanctuary City policy is that when
15	local law enforcement focuses on keeping communities safe, rather than becoming entangled
16	in federal immigration efforts, our communities are safer and more robust; and
17	WHEREAS, BART has introduced a call for a Sanctuary in Transit policy to protect
18	everyone, including our undocumented friends, neighbors, and colleagues, from being unduly
19	targeted during their commutes; and
20	WHEREAS, The proposed Sanctuary in Transit policy would limit the information
21	that BART shares directly or indirectly with the federal government, joining countless other
22	cities and counties, including San Francisco, from participating in federal immigration
23	enforcement; and

1	WHEREAS, This first-of-its-kind policy would ensure that our local policing resources
2	are used to promote safety on our public transportation system, rather than for the
3	enforcement of divisive federal laws; now, therefore, be it
4	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors commend Director Josefowitz and Directo
5	Simon for proposing BART's Sanctuary in Transit Policy and strongly urge the Bay Area
6	Rapid Transit Board of Directors to support it.
