1	[Hemophilia Day - April 17, 2017]
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3	Resolution recognizing Hemophilia and other bleeding disorders, and declaring
4	April 17, 2017, as Hemophilia Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

6	WHEREAS, Hemophilia is an inherited bleeding disorder that affects 1 in 10,000 male
7	individuals in each country around the world; and
8	WHEREAS, It has no ethnic predilection; all races, nationalities, and ethnic groups
9	around the world are equally affected; and
10	WHEREAS, Symptoms consist of painful, uncontrolled bleeding into joints, muscles,
11	abdomen, head, neck and various other organs; and
12	WHEREAS, Bleeding into certain locations such as the head can be fatal; and
13	WHEREAS, Symptoms may appear shortly after birth and continue throughout the
14	affected individual's life; and
15	WHEREAS, In addition to these affected males, there is an inherited bleeding disorder,
16	Von Willebrand Disease (VWD), which affects 1 in 1 million females; and
17	WHEREAS, The symptoms may involve easy bruising, heavy menstrual cycles,
18	bleeding during child birth or surgery, and the same symptoms as in males with hemophilia;

20	WHEREAS, Many of these women do not know that they have VWD because they
21	and/or their physicians are unaware of the disorder and how to test for it; and
22	WHEREAS, Over the past 25 years, treatment advances for these bleeding disorders
23	mean that now the frequent painful, debilitating, and potentially life-threatening bleeding
24	episodes can be stopped and even prevented, and these individuals can lead full, productive
25	lives, but in order to get treatment, they must first be diagnosed; and
