[Urging the Creation of an Emergency Housing and Safety Working Group]

Resolution urging the creation of an Emergency Housing and Safety Working Group to provide advice regarding safety issues in unauthorized and uninhabitable units, minimize displacement, and help tenants.

WHEREAS, Media reports in February and March of 2017 highlighted the horrendous conditions that 27 people, primarily working poor, monolingual Latinos, were living in in subterranean, unauthorized and legally uninhabitable units on Persia Street; and

WHEREAS, Tenants have a right to inhabit a safe, habitable and legally authorized dwelling; and

WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors is committed to taking aggressive legal action on behalf of its residents to assure compliance with existing habitability laws; and

WHEREAS, Tenants are at times forced to move out of their unauthorized dwelling in San Francisco with short notice because the building or unauthorized units is declared uninhabitable and, thus, are subsequently rendered homeless and thrown into an already overcrowded shelter system; and

WHEREAS, The event of a tenant having to vacate an unauthorized *and* uninhabitable unit because of a slum landlord is currently not *explicitly* treated as an "emergency" by existing law – only fire, devastation, or earthquake trigger housing and emergency assistance – so San Franciscans are being precluded from receiving emergency and transitional housing assistance, food, clothing, and financial assistance following an order to vacate; and

WHEREAS, A coordinated and interdisciplinary approach by the City is needed to effectively and immediately respond to persons who must vacate their unauthorized and uninhabitable unit so that homelessness is not the unintended result; and

Supervisor Safai BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, Relocation fees are sometimes provided to some tenants who are forced to vacate their premises after it has been "red-tagged" or deemed uninhabitable, but this is a short-term response and reached on a case-by-case basis, thus, some tenants receive no relocation fees or other financial assistance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board calls for the creation of the Emergency Housing and Safety Working Group, consisting of members from the Department of Public Health, the Human Services Agency, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Mayor's Senior Housing Advisor, the Department of Building Inspection, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, the Planning Department, and the Fire Department, with legal support from the City's Attorney's Office (henceforth, "participating departments"); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Emergency Housing and Safety Working Group to develop and draft a plan (1) indicating how prevalent are unauthorized and uninhabitable units across the City (i.e., how many units cannot be legalized or brought in compliance with the City's Housing Code); (2) implementing a Citywide response for participating departments on how to effectively address safety issues in unauthorized and uninhabitable units, minimize displacement, and help tenants receive emergency food and shelter as well as transitional housing; (3) advise the Board on the possible expansion of the San Francisco Fire Victims Assistance Fund, codified at Administrative Code, Sections 10.100-298, and the Good Samaritan rule, codified at Administrative Code, Section 37.2(a)(1)(D), for the latter, to come to a consensus on whether or not to explicitly cover this type of emergency displacement in lieu of the existing "catch-all" phrase ("or similar emergency situation" which is immediately preceded by natural disasters, e.g., fire, earthquake, and landslide); and (4) submit this plan to the Board of Supervisors within 3 months of the enactment of this resolution.

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
