Subject: Report of Assessment Costs for Blighted Properties

Dear Members of the Board:

Chapter 80 of the San Francisco Administrative Code requires property owners to maintain their property free of graffiti and blight. We regularly inspect and notify property owners when graffiti is found and needs to be abated. Property owners are billed a \$300.00 inspection fee pursuant to Chapter 80 of the Administrative Code. Property owners can also elect to have the City perform the necessary abatement and have the cost placed on their next property tax bill.

If the property owner fails to pay the inspection fee and/or correct the graffiti, the work is done by the City, and the property is billed. When the property owner fails to pay the bill, an assessment in the overdue amount is submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval to include in the next tax bill.

Enclosed for your review and approval are:

1. A list of properties that have either chosen to have the work performed by the City and elected to place the cost on their property tax bill and/or property owners who have failed to reimburse the City for inspection and abatement fees.

2. A resolution confirming the Order.

Public Works conducted five public hearings throughout the year prior to commencing any work on behalf of a property owner. During these hearings property owners were able to dispute the area required for repair and associated costs. After review and approval by the Board of Supervisors, the assessment is added to the property owner's tax bill.
