I remain an active member of HVNA, and have been an active member of the Market Octavia CAC for the past 2 years.

Thave been involved in managing non-profit organizations for over 2 decades. I am currently Director of Development for Portola and Excelsior Family Connections, serving a largely low-income population of immigrants and their families. Prior to that I was Director of Experience Corps Bay Area, which supports adults 50+ to mentor and tutor San Francisco public school children. (John Muir Elementary is in the plan area, and Sanchez Elementary is just across 16th Street from the plan area.) Prior to my work at ECBA, I was Executive Director of Under One Roof on Castro Street for almost a decade, utilizing hundreds of volunteers to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars each year for dozens of AIDS Service Organizations throughout the Bay Area. These positions have required thoughtful, active engagement with multiple community, government and non-profit stakeholders.

The CAC will be advisory, as appropriate, to the Planning Director, the Interagency Plan Implementation Committee, the Planning Commission, and the Board of Supervisors. Planning Code Section 341.5 provides that the Planning Department or Interagency Plan Implementation Committee shall designate necessary staffing from relevant agencies to the CAC, as needed to complete the CAC's responsibilities described in this Code. To the extent permitted by law, staffing for the CAC shall be funded through the Market & Octavia Community Improvements Fund administration fees.

The CAC may perform the functions enumerated in Planning Code Section 341.5(a) as needed. The CAC shall consist of 9 members. Every member of the CAC must live or work within the Plan Area. The appointing authority shall use best efforts to appoint members from varying geographic, socio-economic, ethnic, racial, gender, and sexual orientations. The Mayor shall appoint one-third (3) of the members of the CAC. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint twothirds (6) of the members and at least one shall be a resident renter, one a resident homeowner, one a low-income resident, one a local merchant, one a representative of established neighborhood groups and one member at large.

The members of the CAC shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority for a term of two years from the date that all nine members have been appointed.
