Perry Lang to the Aging and Adult Services Commission, assuming the seat formerly held by Edna James, for a term ending January 15, 2019


Gustavo Serin a to the Aging and Adult Services Commission for a term ending July 21, 2020

Employment History

Rafiki Coalition for Health and Wellness (Rafiki), San Francisco, CA

Between 2003 and 2017, served in various leadership capacities, including as a Board Member and twice as Executive Director, responsible for the organization's consistent achievement of its mission and financial objectives. From 2011 to 2017, as Executive Director, oversaw the physical renovation and establishment of the Rafiki Wellness Center, lead the formal rebranding and agency name change from Black Coalition on AIDS to Rafiki and guided the non-profit merger between Rafiki and the Bayview Hunters Point Health and Environmental Resource Center; from 2007 to 2010, as Director of Advocacy, expanded the agency's service base beyond HIV/AIDS to include wellness and advocacy; from 2003 to 2007, as Executive Director, solidified the agency's AIDS housing services and relocated the agency closer to its constituent base in San Francisco District 10. Upon retirement, Rafiki had been retooled and repositioned as a \$2.5 million Afro-centric health-focused agency with an 11-bed housing facility, 30-person staff, five-person management team which served more than 5,000 people annually.

YouthBuild USA, Oakland, CA

March 1999 to April 2003, worked as the Western Regional Director, responsibilities included fund-raising, grant management, fiscal management, political advocacy and compliance support for a network of 40 regional organizations. Highlights included a political advocacy campaign that resulted in \$1.5 million in state allocation and the awarding of a \$450,000 California AmeriCorps grant.

Robert C. Maynard Institute for Journalism Education, Oakland, CA

January 1993 to November 1998, served in several capacities, the final position as Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, responsibilities included the management of a 12-person staff and a 1.5 million budget. During my tenure, also served as the Institute's Director of the Management Training Center based at Northwestern University and as Director of Communications. Highlights included the redesign of the infrastructure, creation of employee evaluation instruments, upgrading of computer technology and development of multi-media marketing materials and web site design.

From 1981 to 1992, worked as a staff writer for the San Francisco Chronicle on various beats, including coverage of the San Francisco Police Department, the California State Supreme Court and a popular ethnic trends beat.
