Under the Board's Rules of Order, a Supervisor may request a hearing on an appointment by notifying the Clerk in writing.



Rafiki Coalition for Health and Wellness (Rafiki), San Francisco, CA

Between 2003 and 2017, served in various leadership capacities, including as a <u>Board Member</u> and twice as <u>Executive Director</u>, responsible for the organization's consistent achievement of its mission and financial objectives. From 2011 to 2017, as Executive Director, oversaw the physical renovation and establishment of the Rafiki Wellness Center, lead the formal rebranding and agency name change from Black Coalition on AIDS to Rafiki and guided the non-profit merger between Rafiki and the Bayview Hunters Point Health and Environmental Resource Center; from 2007 to 2010, as Director of Advocacy, expanded the agency's service base beyond HIV/AIDS to include wellness and advocacy; from 2003 to 2007, as Executive Director, solidified the agency's AIDS housing services and relocated the agency closer to its constituent base in San Francisco District 10.
