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Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to allow tenants who have been displaced by fires to receive payments from the Fire Victims Assistance Fund for up to four years, instead of two years, if they earn 70% of Area Median Income or less, have not secured permanent replacement housing, and have applied for an affordable housing preference from the City as a tenant displaced by a fire.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 10.100-298, to read as follows:

SEC. 10.100-298. SAN FRANCISCO FIRE VICTIMS ASSISTANCE FUND.

- (a) **Establishment of Fund.** The San Francisco Fire Victims Assistance Fund (the "Fund") is established as a category six fund to receive any monies appropriated or donated for the purpose of assisting victims of housing fires as set forth in this Section 10.100-298. Donations to the Fund are deemed approved for acceptance and expenditure.
- (b) **Use of Fund.** Monies in the fund shall be used exclusively by the Executive Director of the Human Services Agency or his or her designee (the "Director") to provide rental assistance to persons who have been displaced from their homes by fire in the past

three months. The Director may make payments from the Fund to persons so qualified and earning up to 100% of the Area Median Income. Assistance from the Fund to any person in connection with a single incident shall not extend beyond 24 months from the date of the incident, except that persons earning 70% of Area Median Income or less may continue to receive assistance up to 48 months from the date of the incident if (1) they have not resided in the unit from which they were displaced since the incident, (2) they received services or financial support from the Human Services Agency within three months after the incident, (3) they have not secured permanent replacement housing after the incident, (4) the building in which the incident occurred remains uninhabitable, and (5) they have applied to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community

Development for a preference in a City Affordable Housing Program as a Category 3 Displaced Tenant under Administrative Code Chapter 47. Payments from the Fund are entirely in the Director's lawful discretion and there is in no circumstance a right to a payment.

(c) Administration of Fund. The Director shall submit an annual written report to the Board of Supervisors and the Controller within the first two weeks of July showing donations received, the nature and amount of such donations, and the disposition thereof, together with a description of the individual payments made from the Fund.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal

Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Fire Victims Assistance Fund]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to allow tenants who have been displaced by fires to receive payments from the Fire Victims Assistance Fund for up to four years, instead of two years, if they earn 70% of Area Median Income or less, have not secured permanent replacement housing, and have applied for an affordable housing preference from the City as a tenant displaced by a fire.

Existing Law

The San Francisco Fire Victims Assistance Fund (the "Fund") is a fund that can receive money appropriated or donated for the purpose of assisting victims of fires. Money in the Fund may be used by the Director of the Human Services Agency (the "Director"), or a designee, to provide rental assistance to people who have been displaced from their homes by fire in the past three months. The Director can make payments from the Fund to such displaced persons if they earned less than 100% of the Area Median Income. Assistance from the Fund to any person in connection with a single incident cannot extend beyond 24 months from the date of the incident. Payments from the Fund are entirely in the Director's discretion and there is in no circumstance a right to a payment.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would allow the Director to use the Fund to provide rental assistance up to 48 months after the incident instead of 24 months a subset of individuals who are eligible for assistance under existing law. To qualify for extended assistance, persons must (1) earn 70% of Area Median Income or less; (2) have not resided in the unit from which they were displaced since the incident, (3) received services or financial support from the Human Services Agency within three months after the incident; (4) have not secured permanent replacement housing; (5) be unable to return to the building where the fire occurred because it is still uninhabitable; and (6) have applied to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development for a preference in a City Affordable Housing Program as a tenant displaced by fire.
