[Emergency Declaration - Camp Mather Tree Removals - Estimated Cost of Repairs Exceeds \$250,000]

Resolution approving the Recreation and Park Department General Manager's declaration of an emergency based on catastrophic tree mortality at Camp Mather, estimated cost of more than \$250,000 to repair, pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 6.60(b).

WHEREAS, Camp Mather is a 350-acre family summer camp located in the pristine wilderness of the Sierra Nevada mountains and has been managed by the Recreation and Park Department since 1923; and

WHEREAS, Every year approximately 7,000 San Franciscans enjoy Camp Mather during the summer camp season, having successfully secured a one-week reservation through the annual Camp Mather lottery; and

WHEREAS, As a natural result of prolonged drought and devastating wildfires, various species of bark beetle have infested and killed over 66 million conifer trees throughout the Sierra Nevada over the last three; and

WHEREAS, On October 30, 2015, the Governor of California declared a State of Emergency throughout the State because of the epidemic proportions of this fast-moving tree mortality; and

WHEREAS, The Camp Mather landscape overwhelmingly comprises conifer trees (Ponderosa Pine, Jeffry Pine, Sugar Pine, Incense Cedar, and Fir) of enormous size (100 feet in height, 3 to 4 feet in diameter), and bark beetle infestation has killed widespread stands of these huge trees throughout the camp acreage; and

WHEREAS, Dead trees of this size pose an extreme public safety hazard as their root system no longer holds them in place and they shed huge, thick, and heavy sheaths of bark which fall as their trunks desiccate; and

WHEREAS, Once a conifer tree has been infested by bark beetles the only remedy is to completely remove the tree; and

WHEREAS, The Department's certified arborist and Chief Urban Forester has inspected the trees in the areas of Camp Mather that inhabited and used by the City's summer campers, and has inventoried approximately 1,500 dead trees that pose extreme public safety hazards and must be removed before the start of the 2017 camp season; and

WHEREAS, The winter climate conditions and soil saturation levels from winter rains and snow made tree removal impossible throughout the winter months; and

WHEREAS, Cancelling the 2017 Camp Mather season would very negatively impact thousands of San Franciscans who treasure their week at Camp Mather, including many San Francisco children who would otherwise have no respite from the urban density of the City; and

WHEREAS, The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department has determined that these circumstances must be addressed as a vital quality of life issue for families in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Under the authority granted by the Administrative Code, Section 6.60(b), the General Manager declared an emergency on February 27, 2017, and gave notice of the emergency to the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, Controller, and Recreation and Park Commission; and

WHEREAS, Recreation and Park Department staff analyzed the bark beetle infestation vector, inventory of dead trees, State of California regulatory requirements for timber removal, and disposal options for all removed tree wood, and determined that removal of the

inventoried 1,500 dead trees was necessary for public safety purposes vital to the 2017 Camp Season and that the tree removal, regulatory compliance, and disposal would cost approximately \$1,600,000; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 6.60(b), the General Manager has secured the written approval of the President of the Recreation and Park Commission prior to authorizing the commencement of emergency work, as the estimated cost of the work is in excess of \$250,000; and

WHEREAS, The Department anticipates executing an emergency contract with Crook Logging, Inc. for the tree removal and timber disposal; and

WHEREAS, The Controller has certified that funds are available for this emergency contract; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the emergency declaration for the removal and disposal of 1,500 dead trees at Camp Mather made by the General Manager on February 27, 2017; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of an emergency contract being fully executed by all parties, the Department shall provide a copy of the contract to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion into the official file.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Legislative Objectives

 In accordance with Administrative Code Section 6.60, the proposed resolution would approve the Recreation and Park Department General Manager's Declaration of an Emergency based on catastrophic tree mortality at Camp Mather due to a public safety hazard requiring the removal of approximately 1,500 trees due to bark beetle infestation at Camp Mather.

Key Points

- Camp Mather is a 350-acre family summer camp located in the Sierra Nevada Mountains and operated by the Recreation and Park Department.
- Between November 2016 and January 2017, the Recreation and Park Department's certified arborist and Chief Urban Forester inspected the trees at Camp Mather and inventoried approximately 1,500 dead trees that pose an extreme public safety hazard and must be removed by summer 2017 when Camp Mathers opens.
- In order to have the trees safely removed in time for the beginning of camp, the Recreation and Park Department reached out to contractors for informal bids, and received three bids in February 2017.
- The Recreation and Park Department selected Crook Logging, Inc. since Crook Logging, Inc. was the only contractor that had the capacity to perform the tree removal work by the stated deadline of May 1, 2017, in accordance with the mandated requirements of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.

Fiscal Impact

- Recreation and Park staff determined that removal, regulatory compliance, and disposal
 of the 1,500 trees would cost approximately \$1,600,000, based on the average per tree
 removal cost and the estimated costs to comply with State requirements.
- Of the \$1,600,000, \$666,744 is from the Urban Forestry Program 2012 General Obligation Bonds, and \$933,256 is from the Recreation and Park Department General Fund Capital Budget yearly allocation for tree contracts as appropriated by the Board of Supervisors.

Recommendation

Approve the proposed resolution.

MANDATE STATEMENT

Administrative Code Section 6.60(D) states that contracts entered into for emergency work that are more than \$250,000 are subject to Board of Supervisors approval. Prior to the commencement of emergency work above the \$250,000 threshold, the Department must also secure approval in writing from the Mayor, the President of the Board, or the Commission. The proposed resolution approving the emergency determination must be submitted to the Board of Supervisors 60 days after the Department Head's emergency declaration.

BACKGROUND

The four-year period between 2011 and 2015 was the driest weather in California since record keeping began in 1895. As a result of the drought and subsequent wildfires, various species of bark beetle infested and killed a significant amount of conifer trees through the Sierra Nevada region, leading the Governor of California to declare a State of Emergency in October 2015.

Camp Mather is a 350-acre family summer camp located in the Sierra Nevada Mountains close to the border of Yosemite National Park and operated by the Recreation and Park Department. Every year, approximately 7,000 San Franciscans secure a one-week reservation through the annual Camp Mather lottery to stay on site. Camp Mather is comprised primarily of large conifer trees that have been infected and killed by the bark beetles. According to Mr. Dennis Kern, Recreation and Park Department Director of Operations, the Department's Chief Urban Forester visited Camp Mather in April 2016 to track the presence of the bark beetle in the camp trees. The Department's tree crew and a contractor, Sierra Mountain Construction, removed over 350 trees in April and May of 2016 due to the infestation. Subsequently, between November 2016 and January 2017, the Recreation and Park Department's certified arborist and Chief Urban Forester inspected the trees at Camp Mather and inventoried approximately 1,500 dead trees that pose an extreme public safety hazard and must be removed by summer 2017 when Camp Mathers opens.

The Recreation and Park Department General Manager declared a state of emergency in a letter to the Board of Supervisors on February 27, 2017. The Department submitted the resolution, declaring a state of emergency, to the Board of Supervisors on April 18, 2017.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

In accordance with Administrative Code Section 6.60, the proposed resolution would approve the Recreation and Park Department General Manager's Declaration of an Emergency based on catastrophic tree mortality at Camp Mather due to a public safety hazard requiring the removal of approximately 1,500 trees due to bark beetle infestation at Camp Mathers.

Recreation and Park staff analyzed the bark beetle infestation, inventory of dead trees, State of California regulatory requirements for timber removal, and disposal options for all removed tree wood. The staff determined that removal, regulatory compliance, and disposal of the 1,500 trees would cost approximately \$1,600,000. The \$1,600,000 estimate was based on the average per tree removal cost, calculated from Sierra Mountain Construction's work in the summer of

2016, and the estimated costs to comply with the requirements of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Because removal of the trees was considered an extreme public safety hazard and after obtaining three bids, the Recreation and Park Department entered into a contract for tree removal with Crook Logging, Inc., on a sole source basis, as permitted under Administrative Code Section 6.60. The scope of the work includes tree felling, removal, and project closeout from the period of March 14, 2017 to May 1, 2017.

According to Mr. Kern, the normal open-bidding process usually takes approximately three to four months. The spring work crew for Camp Mather is scheduled to arrive on May 8, 2017, and the first day of camp season for the public is May 28, 2017. In order to have the trees safely removed in time for the beginning of camp, the Recreation and Park Department reached out to contractors for informal bids beginning in November 2016, before the full count of trees was known. The Department counted 1,500 trees by January, and received three bids in February 2017: Sierra Mountain Construction, Kevin Kalkowski, and Crook Logging, Inc. According to Mr. Kern, contractors delayed submitting bids as the tough winter conditions in the mountains made work extremely difficult. The Recreation and Park Department selected Crook Logging, Inc. since Crook Logging, Inc. was the only contractor that had the capacity to perform the tree removal work by the stated deadline of May 1, 2017, in accordance with the mandated requirements of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. According to Mr. Kern, the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection has approved the emergency tree removals. Crook Logging began work on the tree felling and removal in March 2017, which was completed on May 1, 2017. The project clean-up is expected to end on May 8, 2017.

FISCAL IMPACT

The budget for tree removal at Camp Mather is \$1,600,000, as shown in Table 1 below.

NOW, THEREFORE, CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth in this AGREEMENT, promises and agrees to provide all services to construct the Project in accordance with the requirements of the Contract Documents, to perform the Work in good and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the GENERAL MANAGER, to prosecute the Work with diligence from day to day to Final Completion, to furnish all construction work, labor and materials to be used in the execution and completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents, and to otherwise fulfill all of CONTRACTOR's obligations under the Contract Documents, as and when required under the Contract Documents to the satisfaction of the GENERAL MANAGER.

CONTRACTOR's execution of this AGREEMENT signifies its acceptance of the Contract Time and Contract Sum as being sufficient for completion of the Work, as well as acceptance of the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 1 - CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: CONTRACTOR'S GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Contract Documents. CONTRACTOR shall Provide all Work according to the Contract Documents, which are incorporated into and made a part of this AGREEMENT by this reference, and all labor and materials used in providing the Work shall comply with the Contract Documents. The Contract Documents, which comprise the entire agreement between CONTRACTOR and the CITY concerning the Provision of the Work, are defined in the General Conditions (Section 00 72 00). Any undefined term used in this AGREEMENT shall be given the definition set forth in the General Conditions (Section 00 72 00).
- 1.02 Contractor's General Responsibilities. CONTRACTOR shall provide a fully functional, complete and operational Project constructed in accordance with the Contract Documents, including but not limited to, all investigations, analyses, surveys, engineering, procurement, materials, labor, workmanship, construction and erection, commissioning, equipment, shipping, subcontractors, material suppliers, permits, insurance, bonds, fees, taxes, duties, documentation, spare parts, materials for initial operation, security, disposal, startup, testing, training, warranties, guarantees, and all incidentals.

ARTICLE 3 - CONTRACT SUM

3.01 Contract Sum.

- A. CONTRACTOR and the CITY agree that, upon performance and fulfillment of the mutual covenants set forth herein, the CITY will, in the manner provided by law and as set forth in the Contract Documents, pay or cause to be paid to CONTRACTOR the following price(s), as indicated in the Schedule of Bid Prices on the Bid Form (Section 00 41 00):
 - 1. Lump sum amount bid.

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The price(s) and amount set forth above shall be adjusted during performance or upon final completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

- B. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that the CONTRACTOR shall be solely responsible for providing all resources that may be necessary to provide the Work, and that the CITY shall have no obligation whatsoever to finance any part of such costs except with respect to those amounts which become due under the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- 3.02 <u>Certification by Controller</u>. This AGREEMENT is subject to the budget and fiscal provisions of the CITY's Charter. Charges will accrue only after prior written authorization certified by the Controller, and the amount of the CITY's obligation hereunder shall not at any time exceed the amount certified for the purpose and period stated in such advance authorization.

ARTICLE 4 - LABOR REQUIREMENTS

- 4.01 <u>Applicable Laws and Agreements</u>. Compensation and working conditions for labor performed or services rendered under this AGREEMENT shall be in accordance with the Contract Documents, the San Francisco Charter, and applicable sections of the San Francisco Administrative Code, including section 6.22(E).
- Prevailing Wages. The latest Wage Rates for Private Employment on Public Contracts in the City 4.02 and County of San Francisco, as determined by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations, and, when federal funds are Involved, the current General Wage Determination Decisions, as determined by the U.S. Secretary of Labor, as same may be changed during the term of this AGREEMENT, shall be included in this AGREEMENT and are hereby incorporated by this reference. CONTRACTOR agrees that any person performing labor in the provision of the Work shall be paid not less than the highest general prevailing rate of wages as so determined. If federal funds are involved, where the minimum rate of pay for any classification differs among State, City and Federal wage rate determinations, the highest of the three rates of pay shall prevail. CONTRACTOR shall include, in any contract or subcontract relating to the Work, a requirement that all persons performing labor under such contract or subcontract shall be paid not less than the highest prevailing rate of wages for the labor so performed. CONTRACTOR shall require any contractor to provide, and shall deliver to CITY every month during any construction period, certifled payroll reports with respect to all persons performing labor in the Provision of the Work.

- 4.03 Penalties. CONTRACTOR shall forfelt to the CITY back wages due plus fifty dollars (\$50.00) for:
 - A. Each laborer, workman, or mechanic employed in the provision of the Work, for each calendar day or portion thereof during which such laborer, workman, or mechanic is not paid the highest general prevailing rate of wage for the work performed; or
 - B. Each laborer, mechanic or artisan employed in the provision of the Work, for each calendar day or portion thereof during which such laborer, mechanic or artisan is compelled or permitted to work for a longer period than five days (Monday-Friday) per calendar week of eight hours each, and not compensated in accordance with the prevailing overtime standard and rate.

ARTICLE 5 - NOTICES TO PARTIES




