To Whom It May Concern,

Today I'd like to offer my support for Stephen Lynch to be appointed to the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee Seat #5 - Bicycle and Non-Motorized Transportation. I was the last person to hold this seat from October 2013 until my resignation in December 2015.

When I announced I was leaving PSAC (as I was moving away from San Francisco) my fellow committee members asked me to conduct a search to find somebody who would be a worthy replacement. I put it out to my network and got a number of responses from many fine citizens. However, it was not a difficult decision to pick Stephen Lynch as my preferred successor.

I could not imagine a more intelligent, detail-oriented candidate than Stephen. He brings the same thoughtful, reasoned approach that has made him so successful in his professional career to everything he does. Stephen is also passionate about safe streets for all - I met Stephen in the context of the Amelie Le Moullac tragedy. He was friends with Amelie when she was so tragically killed on her bicycle in 2013. He helped me write my op-ed about the incident. He knows personally what kind of pain is wrought by the violence on our streets every day and he is sincere in his desire to bring about Vision Zero so no one has to feel that pain in San Francisco again.

I hope that you see the wisdom in appointing Stephen to the Committee. I also hope that you are proactive in filling any remaining empty seats on the Committee - the City Attorney has ruled that PSAC must have a majority of ALL seats (not just filled seats) present to obtain a quorum. Leaving seats empty on this Committee essentially neuters the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee and should be out right embarrassing for the Board of Supervisors.

Stephen will be a tremendous addition to the Committee and you should see him and the rest of the Committee as an asset in your quest to achieve Vision Zero - a mission that most be sincerely and actively pursued if you are to achieve any headway at all.

### **Authority:**

Administrative Code, Chapter 5, Article IV, Sections 5.4-1 through 5.4-3 (Ordinance Nos. 85-02, 127-07, 287-08, and 220-16).

### **Board Qualifications:**

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee, composed of concerned and informed residents, will provide a source of expertise on issues concerning pedestrian safety, convenience, ambiance, and planning. The Advisory Committee shall consist of seventeen (17) voting members.

- Seat 1 shall be held by a representative from a pedestrian safety organization, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seats 2 and 3 shall be held by representatives from senior or disability organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 4 shall be held by a representative from a bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 5 shall be held by a representative from a transit or environmental organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seats 6 through 16 shall be appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors, with each member of the Board appointing one member of the Advisory Committee.

# San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- Seat 17 shall be held by a parent of a student in the San Francisco Unified School District, appointed by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District. If at any time the Superintendent declines to appoint an individual to Seat 17 for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a new member with the same or different qualifications to fill the seat for the remainder of the term.

The terms for odd-numbered seats shall expire on March 31, 2018, and every two years thereafter. The terms for even-numbered seats shall expire on March 31, 2019, and every two years thereafter.

The Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint a member of the San Francisco Unified School District's Student Advisory Council to serve as a non-voting member of the Advisory Committee. The individual appointed to this seat may participate in Advisory Committee discussions to the same extent as other members of the Advisory Committee but may not vote on any matter and shall not be counted toward a quorum.

The following City departments shall select and send designate a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings at the request of the Advisory Committee: the Department of Public Health, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Department of Public Works, the Planning Department, the Police Department, the Recreation and Parks Department, District Attorney's Office, and the Mayor's Office on Disability, and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians shall also designate a non-voting representative to Advisory Committee meetings upon request of the Advisory Committee. Every year by July 1, each department required to designate a non-voting representative shall inform the Advisory Committee in writing of the name, work phone number, and work email address of its representative.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.

Sunset Date: October 1, 2019.
