16	portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2018.
17	Mario Paz (residency requirement waived), seat 6, succeeding themself, term expired,
18	must be an immigrant to the United States, appointed in accordance with Charter, Section
19	4.101, and have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service,
20	educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall
21	reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco, for the
22	unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2019.
23	Celine Kennelly, seat 7, succeeding themself, term expired, must be an immigrant to

the United States, appointed in accordance with Charter, Section 4.101, and have a

demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or

employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2019.

Nima Rahimi, seat 8, succeeding Felix Fuentes, term expired, must have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2019.

Michelle Wong, seat 11, succeeding themself, term expired, must be an immigrant to the United States, appointed in accordance with Charter, Section 4.101, and have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2019.

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Immigrant Rights Commission has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicants Amro Radwan and Mario Paz, who are not residents of San Francisco, are persons with experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission.
- 3. The Immigrant Rights Commission has attempted to fill the positions, for which Amro Radwan and Mario Paz were nominated, with individuals who are City residents and who have the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Amro Radwan and Mario Paz are qualified to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission.

1	4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no
2	other possible representative, who are residents of San Francisco, and who have
3	the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by these applicants, and
4	who are willing to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission at this time; and, be it
5	FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement
6	for Amro Radwan and Mario Paz, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing
7	to serve, can be found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101, that requires person(s) appointed
8	to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of
9	Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
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
