# **Drink Tap Program Overview**

## **Drink Tap Program Implementation in 2010**

- Installed bottle-fill stations in 5 SFUSD Schools
- Funded 10 pilot bottle-fill stations in public realm


#### 2010 - 2016

- 51 stations in SFUSD schools
- 31 stations in the public realm

## **Lead Testing**

- All bottle-fill stations must pass post-construction lead contaminant testing to be opened to the public and students
- Post-construction sampling conducted to determine lead content vs.
   EPA's permissible limit of 15 parts per billion (ppb) for safe drinking water
- Bottle-fill stations are not open for public use unless samples are under the EPA's drinking water standard of 15 ppb for safe drinking water

### **Site Selection**

- 31 Drink Tap Stations in public realm
- 19 contracted for installation by October 2016


#### Site Selection Criteria

- 1. Citywide sites with emphasis in environmental justice areas and neighborhoods with high sugar-sweetened beverage consumption
- 2. Selected with input from community stakeholders
- 3. Near transportation hubs or family gathering spaces
- 4. Well-lit (public safety)
- 5. Relatively easy and/or inexpensive to install
- 6. Relatively easy to maintain




Green: Existing Stations in Public Realm Red: Stations to be Installed in Public Realm in 2016 - 2017




# SFHIP Research Findings: More Water Access, Now!

SFHIP led and partnered on studies analyzing Sugar-Sweetened Beverage (SSB) consumption and access to clean drinking water

#### Recommendations

- Increase access to clean drinking water
- Education should happen near the station
- Safe, clean, accessible, and protected stations
- Place stations in low-income communities



# **Education and Ecoliteracy**

- SF Environment School Assemblies & Water Bottle Distribution
- 17,000 Students Served
- Age-appropriate "Drink Water Said the Otter" Books
- Model Program
  - Washington, DC
  - Santa Clara County
  - Alameda County





## **SFDPH Evaluation**

- Child Care Study: Classrooms that did not have a pitcher of drinking water visible had a 2 fold higher incidence of overweight or obesity
- Student Survey Given Before & After Installations at SFUSD Sites

#### **Initial Evaluation Results**

- Most students drink water at school (95%)
- Refillable water bottle use increased from 35% to 46%;
   Simultaneously bottled water usage decreased from 31% to 25%
- More students drank 4 or more glasses of water per day
- More students identified water from the "fountains and filling stations" as better tasting, more favorable temperature, cleaner, and more comfortable to use

## **Funding**

- Implements State and Federal law
- Provides access to Drink Tap stations at every SFUSD School
- Improves access to safe drinking water in impacted neighborhoods
- Continues SFDPH and SFE Outreach and Evaluation
- Continues engagement with CBO's promoting water



# San Francisco Drink Tap Program Bottle-Fill Station Site List

In order to promote healthy, more sustainable habits, promote a healthy alternative to single-use plastic water bottles, meet state and federal regulations, and provide access to clean, free drinking water in schools and publicly accessible areas, City Agencies, in consultation with Community Stakeholders and UCSF, have installed 31 bottle-fill stations in the public realm, 51 stations at SFUSD schools, and 6 stations at SFO. Additionally, SFPUC provided funding for the installation of 28 new bottle-fill stations in schools in FY 16-17 and is funding 19 additional stations in the public realm. To select public realm sites, staff uses a set of criteria listed below. Staff conducted site visits, consulted plumbing schematics, and estimated costs for both installation and ongoing maintenance for each selected site.

Criteria for Public realm Bottle-fill Stations: 1) Well-lit; 2) Near transportation hubs or family gathering spots; 3) Geographic spread throughout SF; 4) Emphasis in neighborhoods with high sugar-sweetened beverage consumption and/or environmental justice communities; 5) Cost to install; 6) Relatively easy to maintain
